TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good afternoon and welcome to Glevum Park to all players management, officials from Aylesbury Vale Dynamos and to supporters from both sides.

After a great away point at Worcester City on Tuesday evening, where we opened our league campaign, we go into today's game off the back of a positive midweek result.

I am clear that there is still plenty to improve on, but after a mixed bag of pre-season results it was good to go into competitive action and to get a clean sheet against one of the title favourites was particularly pleasing.

I have no doubt that today's game will be a tough one. I don't know much about Aylesbury Vale Dynamos but I am sure it is going to be a hard encounter and we will need to be at our best to get a result. After last year's injury time defeat, at this stage, hopefully we get the rub of the green and experience a bit of the magic of the FA Cup and progress.

It has been a very long time since the club have had any sort of run in this competition. I hope we can change that today.

Dynamos HISTOR

At the start of the 2000/2001 season, the senior Belgrave FC team was renamed Haywood United following an amalgamation with Stocklake FC with Danny Martone voted in as chairman of the new club. Haywood United joined the Spartan South Midlands League and won promotion into Division One after two seasons. Season 2002/2003 saw a difficult start in Division One, but with the arrival of manager Jon Franklin and his assistant Keith Walker just after Christmas, the club eventually consolidated finishing in 9th place. Promotion was gained to the South Midlands Premier Division the following year after a campaign that saw 23 wins, 7 draws and only 4 losses. Haywood United proved themselves capable of staying in the Premier Division after finishing 3rd in the 2004/2005 season in a campaign that only include one loss in the twenty matches after Christmas. The club also entered the FA Cup and Vase for the first time and won the Buckingham Charity Cup in 2006.

Season 2006/2007 began with Haywood United becoming Aylesbury Vale FC and saw Keith Walker and Steve Glenister take over as joint managers and steadily build a squad. This was recognised in the 2008/2009 season, under the management of Mark Eaton, with a good cup run in the FA Cup and FA Vase, winning three rounds in the FA Cup losing to Level 4 side Gosport after a replay, and losing out in the 4th round of the FA Vase to Leiston Town, May 2009 saw a major new development in a new semi professional side vote for a name change. Aylesbury Football Club was formed under the leadership of Chairman Roger Dance and assisted by Vice Chairman Danny Martone.

Former Chairman Bill Harrison was made President of the club. Great success on the field of play was to follow, with the team having a fantastic run in the F.A. Cup. We were the last 'level five' team in the country to remain in the competition and were rewarded with a visit to Haywood Way for the F.A. Cup trophy. We were finally knocked out of the competition by Wealdstone in a close game. A brave and superb display was witnessed by a bumper crowd of 800 plus.

Steve Bateman took over in 2013/14, steered the club to safety in his first 6 months in charge. Then in 2014/15 with Bateman at the helm FC has their most successful season to date. Playing at the highest level in the club's history, the team finished third in the League, having been pushing for promotion all season and narrowly lost out in the semi final to Bedworth United having already beaten them twice in the league. The 2015/16 finished with a flourish as the club finished just outside the play off positions, but had the consolation of our first major Cup Final, beating Chesham United in the Berks & Bucks Cup at Windsor. Danny Gordon & Gareth Risbridger took the helm after Bateman resigned, supported by Paul Bonham.

Davis Haule took over from Gordon & Risbridger in December 2016, appointed brother Brian as his assistant and recruited former coaches Fraser McLachlan, Aaron Wiffin and added Ryan Collings to his back room staff for the 2017/18 season.

In 2018/19 Scott Reynolds was appointed manager and when he resigned midway through the season it was left to Paul Bonham to take control but because of ground grading issues the Southern League made the decision to relegate the club and after ten seasons in the Southern League. Phil Granville and Ben Gill were appointed midway through the 2019/20 season and kicked off the 2020/21 season again in the Spartan Premier Division. Steve Bateman was re appointed as manager in September 2021.

In November 2022 Jordan King and James Green came in to steady the ship and moved the team from 18th and struggling to a respectable 13th position. They stepped down at the end of the season.

We now start the 2023/24 season with Paul Batchelor at the helm, bringing Ryan Davis and Tom Bamford into the coaching team.













Dynamos HISTOR

Aylesbury Vale Dynamos is an amalgamation of Aylesbury FC and Bedgrove Dynamos, two local clubs with a rich history in local football. Aylesbury FC enjoyed a long history in senior and junior football dating back to the 1930's under the previous names of Aylesbury Vale, Haywood United, Belgrave, Stocklake and Negretti and Zambra FC, which was founded in the 1930's by workers at the Negretti and Zambra company then based in London's King Cross district. The company moved to the Stocklake Industrial Estate, Aylesbury.

BEDGROVE DYNAMOS

Alf Buckland, a resident of Finmere Crescent, formed Bedgrove Dynamos in 1968. It was created to fill a void in activities for boys within the Bedgrove area on the south side of Aylesbury. In 1980, Dave Bayliss became involved when he brought his Cub side to the Bedgrove Park. The teams amalgamated and Dave went on to be the chairman for 21 years, stepping down in the year 2000. Within two years and barely a full strip between them, they managed not only to win the Under 12's Aylesbury & District League (ADL), but went on to win the 13's & 14's league in consecutive years and, by which time, they now had four teams at various age groups.

Over the years the club has grown and has won many tournaments and trophies, especially at county level. Many teams have toured abroad and the club has also entertained boys from Europe and America. We can boost that we are the only boys club to have a club pennant on display in Barcelona's trophy room.

At the start of the season 2001/02 the club was the largest junior club in the Aylesbury area, running teams from under 8's through to under 18's. At the end of the season 2001/02 the club managed to win the coveted Berks and Bucks Cup at under 14's, the Mayor's Cup at under 12's, represented in two other cup finals, won 3 league titles, gained 6 promotions in total and all teams finished in the top 6 to the fairplay awards for their respective leagues. In the last 20 seasons across the age groups the club has won 25 divisional titles, and runners up 20 times.

In 2019 two became one when the sides amalgamated with the intention of allowing the youth of the town to progress through junior football to youth and then adult football and play at the highest possible level.

AYLESVURY FC / AYLESBURY VALE DYNAMOS FC

The club moved to Haywood Way, their current stadium, in 1987.

After gaining senior status and promotion to the Chiltern League in 1988, Stocklake enjoyed many further successes including Division One runners up in 1991, Premier Division and League Cup runners up the following season and Wycombe Senior Cup success in 1995. Cup success was also followed on in the following season, this time the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup being added to the trophy cabinet.

By 1990, under the guidance of Danny Martone, Belgrave had grown to five youth teams providing football for over ninety boys from the Quarrendon and Haydon Hill areas of Aylesbury. 1996 saw the forming of two senior teams under the Belgrave FC name and by the turn of the millennium teams were represented at all levels from Under 8's through to seniors.

THAT WAS THE SEASON THAT WAS...a look back at the 2022/23 season

It has become customary for our first programme of the new season to devote a couple of pages to reviewing the previous year at The Rovers. Today we look back at 2022/23 – Neil Mustoe's first full campaign at the helm.

August 2022



After his appointment as manager of Tuffley Rovers in January 2022, Neil Mustoe started his first full campaign at the helm and after a difficult pre-season period, which had seen him largely rebuilding the squad, he handed debuts to Elliot Jones, Noah Smerdon and Dan Lander in a hard-fought 0-0 draw away at Brimscombe & Thrupp.

Just a few days later Rovers took a lead in the Emirates FA Cup tie with Southern League side Slimbridge, as Ryley Mace netted, but late goals from former Rover Jacob Geddes and a stunning winner from Marley Thomas condemned Mustoe's team to a 2-1 defeat.

The following Tuesday Ryan Dobbins got his first of the season, inside a minute, to give Rovers a lead against title hopefuls Malvern Town, but the visitors eventually ran out 3-1 victors but a better result was to follow as the final home game of August saw Jack Beardsell and Mason Lewis both score doubles in a 4-0 win over Lydney Town. That win was followed by a 4-1 defeat at Fairford Town, before a 0-0 draw at Longlevens...albeit



one where Rovers had a legitimate goal ruled out after Lewis' shot hit the bar and was deemed (incorrectly) not to have crossed the line.

September 2022

September started badly, with a crushing 4-1 defeat away at newly promoted Hereford Pegasus, but that was followed by wins at Newent Town in the Wiseman Lighting Floodlit Cup and a 2-0 win at Thornbury Town in the league. In a month short on action due to renovation work on the Glevum Park pitch, Rovers played one further game, in the FA Vase against Fleet Spurs, and triumphed 4-2 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in normal time, with substitute Shayne Bradley grabbing a late equaliser.

October 2022

October started with two consecutive 2-1 league defeats, at Hereford Lads Club then home to Cribbs FC, before another 4-0 win over Lydney Town in the Floodlit Cup, with Joey Haswell scoring a brace on his debut. Kieran Squires header then secured a point in a 1-1 draw against Shrivenham at Glevum Park, before four consecutive defeats to conclude the month. Defeats in the Premier Division against Worcester Raiders, Fairford Town and Roman Glass St George, were either side of a disappointing exit from the FA Vase, as Mustoe's squad lost 1-0 away at Hellenic League Division One side Hartpury University.



November 2022

The opening days of November saw an incredibly unfortunate 2-1 defeat at home to Worcester Raiders followed by a very disappointing 4-2 loss away at Mangotsfield United. Things improved as the month progressed, though.

First, Shayne Bradley scored a first half hattrick away at Wantage Town (before being sent-off) in a 4-2 win and that was followed by two positive results in the GFA Challenge Trophy and Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup, courtesy of wins against Hartpury University and Meadow Park, respectively.

That was the end of the positivity was the month ended with a complete capitulation away at Malvern Town in the Floodlit Cup, as Rovers lost 9-1, and although there was an improved performance in the next game at Royal Wootton Bassett Town, the game was abandoned shortly before the interval, with the score at 1-1.

December 2022

December started with a real game for the neutral, as Rovers came from a 3-0 half-time deficit to level at 4-4 against Bradford Town, before the visitors scored a late winner, to take all three points. A cup win away at Almonsbury Town (in the GFA Challenge Trophy) followed, with three vital league points in the next game, as Kieran Alder scored a 90th minute winner to defeat Hereford Pegasus 1-0.

Rovers went into the 27 December game at home to Longlevens full of optimism but injuries to Ashley Davies and then Alder, when the score was 0-0, saw a much changed line-up crumble to a 4-0 defeat in the face of an excellent performance from the visitors and it may have been worse had keeper Brad Poole not been in fantastic form in goal for Rovers.



January 2022

A third meeting of the season against Malvern Town saw Rovers exit the Challenge Cup via a narrow 1-0 defeat, as a Mark Pritchett own goal proved the difference between the teams.

Two consecutive 5-0 victories, away at Roman Glass and Cribbs, followed and the full set of defeats was completed for January, as the final outing ended in a 1-0 defeat away at Shrivenham, albeit on an evening where Rovers could arguably claim to have been denied two clear penalties.

February 2022

Another two defeats opened the month of February, as Mustoe's squad lost at Corsham Town and Royal Wootton Bassett, and another humiliating and chastening loss followed as they conceded seven, without reply, at home to Westfields.

Things improved for the remainder of the month as a 4-0 win at Bradford Town was followed by another victory on penalties, in the GFA Challenge Trophy against Cribbs, then a 1-1 draw at home to Wantage Town.

March 2022

The first game of March ended in a 2-0 home defeat against Mangotsfield United, before Mustoe's relegation threatened side pulled off an incredible 1-0 win away at Westfields, with Dan Lander bundling a winner home from close range. Luke Merchant saved a penalty to preserve the clean sheet and secure a vital three points.

With his squad threadbare due to injuries and suspensions, Mustoe had to make his first Rovers appearance, as a substitute, in the 1-1 draw at Lydney Town, before their cup hopes ended at the same venue a week later, Warren Mann missing a late penalty opportunity in a 2-1 defeat.

A 4-0 win at home to Hereford Lads Club proved a huge boost in Rovers' hopes of survival and although two 3-1 defeats followed, at Wootton Bassett and Malvern Town, performances were much improved. The Bassett game was Warren Mann's 500th competitive first team appearance at Step 7 and above.



April 2022



Mustoe's side all but secured safety as they thumped bottom of the table Chipping Sodbury Town 4-0 at Glevum Park and although defeats at home to Brimscombe & Thrupp and away at Corsham Town followed, other results meant Rovers travelled to Chipping Sodbury on the last day of the season knowing they only had to avoid a double-figure defeat to be safe. Dom Kent's goal in the final ten minutes proved to be enough to secure a 1-0 win and Rovers had secured a ninth consecutive season of Step 5 football.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF OUR FA CUP



If I told you that we had a wonderful time at Glastonbury in 1995, you might assume that that summer's music festival (played out in baking heat, I might add – I was there!) was particularly good. It was, but Tuffley Rovers' trip to Glastonbury FC in August 1995 ended with a 5-1 victory in our first ever FA Cup tie (a Preliminary Round fixture). An opportunity to host Cinderford Town followed and our campaign ended swiftly, off the back of 4-0 reverse at Glevum Park.

There were plenty of goals when we met Taunton Town in August 1996, but our campaign ended immediately, courtesy of a 5-2 defeat and twelve months later we made progress, with a good win at home to Cirencester Town (we narrowly claimed a 4-3 victory in another home tie) but when Paulton Rovers came in the First Qualifying Round a 3-1 defeat spelt that end of that year's road to Wembley.

An immediate exit to Minehead Town in 1998 was another disappointment, but in 1999 the record book shows a victory over one of the now foremost non-league clubs, as we beat Eastleigh 2-1 in the First Qualifying Round. A record breaking appearance in the Second Qualifying Round almost saw us progress further, but a 1-1 draw took us to a replay at home against Lymington & New Milton, only to see us eliminated courtesy of a 5-0 thrashing!

Revenge came against Taunton Town in 2000, as we won 4-1 in the Preliminary Round, but we once again failed to progress further, as a single goal victory went in favour of our opponents Chippenham Town in the next round.

Four consecutive defeats saw our cup hopes perish at the first hurdle in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2004 but we had another opportunity to progress in 2005/06 as our Hellenic League side hosted Elmore. A 0-0 draw took us to only our second replay ever, but we succumbed to a late goal in a 1-0 defeat in the second meeting. That was to be our last FA Cup tie for 10 years, as the club's withdrawal from the Hellenic League just a few weeks later saw us drop to a lower level of football, rendering us unable to enter the world's most famous cup competition.

Our return, ten years later in 2015, saw a wonderful win at Ardley United (4-1), followed up with a terrific 1-0 win at home to Southern League neighbours Bishops Cleeve, before we put in a brave display against Taunton Town, before losing 3-0.



Ardley gained revenge 12 months later, but our return in 2017 saw a narrow win with ten-men away at Woodley United, then a momentous day at Leighton Town, when we made an astonishing comeback from 2-0 down, with just eight minutes remaining, to win 3-2 in the dying moments of the game. Swindon Supermarine demolished a Rovers team playing most of the game with

ten-men, in the next round, to end another attempt to march on the Wembley arch.

Five seasons ago, despite leading 1-0 at half-time thanks to Warren Mann's penalty, we were comprehensively beaten 4-1 by Colney Heath, and exited the competition at the first stage. Then three years ago, against North Greenford United, we produced two fairly lacklustre performances (in our 26th and 27th FA Cup matches) and went out of the competition with a whimper.

In the 2020/21 season we succumbed to another heavy defeat at this stage, as Harefield United left Glevum Park with a 5-2 victory and their star striker, Richard Pacquette (a former QPR player), with the match-ball.



In our 29th FA Cup tie, at this stage against Windsor two years ago, we produced another stunning comeback, winning 3-2 after being two goals behind and almost repeated the feat as we came back from two goals down again, in a home tie against Flackwell Heath that was played at Brimscombe & Thrupp, but this time it ended 2-2 and we went to a replay. The trip to Flackwell Heath was a disaster, as we lost our two centre-halves before we'd reach ten minutes of action and succumbed to a 6-0 thrashing.

Last season we took a lead against Southern League side Slimbridge but two late, late goals saw us beaten 2-1 in an enthralling game. Now, we face our 33rd FA Cup tie we go in pursuit of a tenth victory that would offer an opportunity of a tie against a trip to face Southern League side Evesham United.




