

FROM THE EDITOR:



Welcome to Glevum Park this evening everyone and welcome to all our visitors, notably the players, management team, committee and supporters of Cribbs FC. Welcome, also, to this evening's match officials.

Here we go - competitive football is back!!

Our pre-season campaign ended at Clanfield 85 FC on Saturday afternoon and it has been pleasing to have a reasonable set of 'friendlies' that saw us tested in most games but also playing some excellent football at times. I know Muzzy is using the continuity in personnel this year to try and develop the playing style.

The highlight of our pre-season for me was the visit of Gloucester City, with a crowd of 402 at Glevum Park to see the first game under the new City manager, Daf Williams. We lost 2-0 but it was a great day for our club and we hope that this sort of fixture can become a regular feature in our pre-season calendar.

Tonight we welcome Cribbs FC to our home and this will be their first visit here since 21 February 2023, when we won on penalties in a GFA Challenge Trophy tie after a 0-0 draw, and their first league visit since 8 October 2022 when Richard Luffman's team secured a 2-1 victory despite a valiant effort from Neil Mustoe's side. In-between those dates Cribbs have been playing Southern League football for two seasons until they were relegated at the end of the 2024/25 season.

We have a start to the season which is both tough and offers an opportunity to accumulate points, as we travel to Lydney Town next Tuesday, before hosting Fairford Town on 9 August and Mangotsfield United on 12 August, then again act as host when Hereford Pegasus visit on 16 August. After that we play Longlevens twice in 3 days (in the FA Vase and then Premier Division), before a trip to Thornbury Town.

If we are realistic in our aspirations to climb the league table, we need to make sure that we end August in a good position. It is an over-used cliché but there are no easy games in this league and the first month of 2025/26 will set the tone for what is to follow, I suspect.

Before those games are completed we have an FA Cup tie at Hartpury University to play this Saturday (2 August), which promises to be a very tricky game. It would be great to have plenty of support behind us for that one.

The support of our home crowd – and everyone backing us on the road – will be vital this season. Thank you to everyone who is behind us and supporting the club.

I hope everyone enjoys the game. Safe travels home.

Good evening and a warm welcome to Glevum Park for what is our opening game of the 2025-26 season.

We entertain Cribbs here this evening, who have returned to the Hellenic League and we welcome their management, committee, players and supporters to our home. I'd also like to extend that warm welcome to this evening's match officials.

As always seems to be the case, it has been another busy off-season period for our committee at Tuffley Rovers and pre-season seems to start earlier every year! Like every club across the country at grassroots level, we have battled with the lack of rain for the last few months and it has taken a monumental effort to try and keep on top of ensuring the pitch here didn't turn into an arid landscape.

We have made some changes to the structure of our teams this year, reintroducing a Reserves team after making the decision to fold our Development Squad last season, whilst we have appointed new coaches across our Reserves, Thirds and Ladies' teams, whilst also retaining our coaching teams for our 1sts, U18s and Fourths.

It has been really pleasing to to see virtually all of the first team squad retained from last season, with only Dean Turner leaving during the summer. This, I hope, will give some continuity following a successful campaign last year. We also have some new faces coming in to add some further competition and depth to the squad.

The target this season is to build on last season and potential target a play-off push in the league competition and also a good cup run or two. One thing we want to see across the club, is more silverware that we can celebrate with our supporters. I like to think this season, across all of our teams, we are looking at a couple of promotions and a cup win.

I hope everyone enjoys this evening's hospitality and is looking forward to the season ahead.

TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and



Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Mustoe achieved an 18th place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14th place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad. The 2024/25 season ended with further improvement, as Mustoe's squad finished in 11th place.

FROM THE MANAGER:



Good evening and welcome to Glevum Park. Welcome to all players, management, officials and supporters from Cribbs FC for our first league game of this season. It seems ages since my last programme notes, as the 2024/25 season finished for us on the first day of April.

I don't enjoy the close season as a rule, as it normally means (at least during my time so far) a rebuild as we have lost players for various reasons. This year has been different, unlike the last few years, where we have struggled for continuity, and this close season easier as we have a group of players who want to be here and enjoy each other's company.

We have looked at lots of options to strengthen the squad, to try and push on and progress year on year but possibly retaining every player from last season is a sign of progress.

We have looked at reducing the average age of the squad over the last two years wanting hunger and desire from players to improve at the same time of being competitive. It seems there is lots of money being thrown around this year which means that on paper we are nowhere near competing with some of the clubs!

The beauty is you don't play on paper and I look at Nottingham Forest, Crystal Palace and Brentford last season and think "why not?" about our chances this year. If we are all singing from the same hymn sheet anything is possible.

One thing for sure is whatever happens in the next nine months my management team and I, as well as the players will give everything we have to be as successful as we can and make our club proud.

Enjoy the game and season ahead. Thank you for your support.

THAT WAS THE SEASON THAT WAS...

a look back at the 2024/25 season

It has become customary for our first programme of the new season to devote a couple of pages to reviewing the previous year at The Rovers. Today we look back at 2024/25 – Neil Mustoe's third full campaign at the helm.

August 2024

Rovers started their Uhlsport Hellenic League campaign away at newly promoted Sporting Club Inkberrow with a chastening 2-0 defeat on 31 July, before the first Saturday of the season saw them bow out of the Emirates FA Cup with a defeat (3-0) against Kidlington FC. Neil Mustoe's side then clicked into gear at home against Slimbridge, winning 3-0 as a Karnell Chambers brace and a Brad Bevan goal secured a first three points of the season.



A disappointing 2-2 draw away at Lydney Town followed, before a 2-0 defeat away at Worcester Raiders, in what would prove to be a final visit to play The Raiders at Sixways Stadium. A win against Hereford Pegasus the following week eased the pain of that defeat, but two defeats followed, against Hartpury University and Longlevens as the month ended in disappointing fashion.

September 2024

The run of defeats extended into September, as Rovers returned from Westfields on the wrong end of a 2-1 scoreline, but that was the last in a run of disappointing results with victories against Thornbury Town, Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Hereford Pegasus following.

That winning run came to an abrupt halt with a 2-1 defeat away at Bitton in the FA Vase but things got better a few days later as Mustoe's side won at home against Pershore Town. Unfortunately, the month ended with a 3-0 defeat at Fairford Town.

October 2024

October didn't offer any positive change and a defeat away at Slimbridge was followed by a very disappointing home draw against Malmesbury Victoria, who had been on a string of defeats prior to arriving at Glevum Park. Rovers had Harley Mustoe to thank for salvaging a point, as he netted his first goal for the club.

A stunning 3-3 draw at Highworth Town followed, with Brad Bevan getting the equaliser in the final attack of the game, but further disappointment came in the next game, as struggling Cirencester Town secured a 1-0 victory.

There was a positive end to the month as Karnell Chambers' 10th goal of the season helped Rovers to a first win against Corsham Town, as Mustoe's side won 1-0.

November 2024

The opening days of November offered back-to-back games against Brimscombe & Thrupp, with a 2-0 win in the league being followed by a 5-1 victory in the GFA Challenge Trophy. By now, Connor Walters was on an excellent run of form and his third goal in successive games helped secure a 1-0 win over Mangotsfield United at Glevum Park.

A narrow 2-1 defeat against high flying Roman Glass St George followed but the positive trend in November quickly returned as a 2-2 draw against Thornbury Town was followed by a 7-3 win over Lydney Town, with Chambers scoring four times and taking his goal tally to 19 for the season by the end of November.

Unfortunately, a 4-0 defeat at Royal Wootton Bassett Town on 30 November, with Tawana Changa sent-off in the first half, offered a disappointing end to a largely positive month.

December 2024

December started with a 2-0 win over Cheltenham Saracens in the GFA Challenge Trophy, with first goals for the club from both Gino Valenit and Hubert Zatorski, then a creditable 1-1 draw against a strong Fairford Town side, with Chambers' 20th of the season rescuing a point.



The Christmas week brought no cheer, however, as a defeat against Highworth Town as followed by an incredibly disappointing defeat against Longlevens on Boxing Day.

A 28 December victory away at Cirencester Town (3-0) didn't repair the damage completely but did mean Mustoe's side ended 2024 on a high thanks to goals from Mark Pritchett, Kieran Alder and Brad Bevan.

January 2025

January ended well, as Rovers came from 2-0 down to secure a point away at Champions Elect Hartpury University, courtesy of goals from Bevan and Chambers, but a weather affected programme saw only two other games played – a 1-0 defeat at Glevum Park against Worcester Raiders and a 2-1 reverse away at Hellenic League Division One side Stonehouse Town in the Floodlit Cup.

February 2025

February was another mixed month, starting with a creditable win at home against Westfields, before a hugely disappointing exit from the Marsh Sports Challenge Cup against Shortwood United. A hard fought draw at home against Sporting Club Inkberrow was a positive turn and was followed by a midweek draw (2-2) away at Mangotsfield United, with Jamie Creed scoring his first goal for the club.

Bottom club Malmesbury Victoria then took a deserved three points as they won 3-1 against Mustoe's charges, before an excellent win away at Pershore Town secured another three points as Mustoe's side found themselves in mid-table and in unfamiliar territory!

The month ended disappointingly as a woeful performance saw Hallen win a GFA Challenge Trophy quarter-final 3-0.

March 2025



The month of March saw just two games played, including a 3-0 win against Brimscombe & Thrupp, but that result was sandwiched between defeat against Roman Glass St George and a final day defeat against Corsham Town on 1 April, as the visitors scored three times in very quick succession, denying Rovers 10th place in the table, meaning Mustoe's finished in a creditable 11th place in the league.

PLAYER PROFILES 2025/26

Luke Merchant Goalkeeper

Club captain who returned to the club in the 2022/23 season, after a Hellenic League Premier Division title winning season at Bishops Cleeve. A great shot stopper, commanding presence and accomplished keeper. Holds the club record for Hellenic League appearances as a keeper.

Robin Hoffland Goalkeeper

A long-serving player, despite his age, who acts as a capable back-up to Luke Merchant in goal, whenever needed. Has played for the club's 1sts, 2nds, 3rds, 4ths and 5ths, as well as the U18s and always gives his all. Reliable, in a word.

Macaulay Herbert Defence

Our second longest-serving member of the squad. 'Macca' came through our U18s and is solid and dependable; an excellent defender who has been getting better with every season that passed. Has made over 300 first team appearances, despite several injuries punctuating each season.

There are some gaps in the information relating to cup games prior to the start of the 2013/14 campaign. This period is currently subject to a thorough review and there may be some variation to statistics in due course.

CLUB HISTORY

Cribbs Football Club was founded in London in 1958 as Sun Life Assurance. The Bristol team was established in 1976 when Sun Life first relocated to Bristol. Initially, two teams were run, participating in the Bristol and Avon League, playing at Dundridge Farm. However, when the Cribbs Causeway ground was opened in 1978, the first team were promoted straight to the Avon Premier Combination League (later renamed Bristol Premier Combination) where they stayed for 20 years until they eventually won promotion to the County League in 1999–2000.

In the summer of 2011, the club changed its name from AXA to Cribbs Friends Life FC ready for the 2011–12 season. The season was Cribbs' most successful season to date as the club claimed its first Gloucestershire County League title on the way to an unprecedented League and Cup double. The team later adding the Les James League Cup to the League Championship and in the process becoming the first and only side to achieve this feat.

As a result of winning the league, the club earned promotion to the Western League Division One for the 2012–2013 subsequently changing their name to simply, Cribbs FC.

Cribbs were promoted into the Western League Premier Division for the commencement of the 2015-2016 season and obtained numerous top half finishes until at the end of the 2020–21 season the club were transferred to the Premier Division of the Hellenic League.

Under the stewardship of Richard Luffman, Cribbs in his first full season in charge, recorded a best ever Step Five position of fourth in the Hellenic League. They also were winners of the League Cup defeating Hereford Pegasus 1-0 through a George Kellow goal.

Cribbs gained Southern League status in 2023 after becoming champions of the Hellenic League, clinching promotion with a 1-0 win over Wantage Town with a match to spare.

2023/2024 was the first season in the Southern League and saw a third placed finish and a play-off for promotion to the Premier Division, where we lost 2-1 against local rivals Bristol Manor Farm.

Our second season at Step 4 proved a tougher proposition to the first, finishing in relegation places and as a result returning to the Hellenic League.

Since its inception the club has run multiple sides across the Bristol Premier Combination and Bristol & District League. The Reserve Team won the Premier Combination in 2021/2022 season and did so in numerous seasons prior. They were granted entry to the Gloucestershire County League for 2022/2023.

In their first season in the GCL they finished six points in front of Bromley Heath United to clinch the title and earn promotion to the Toolstation Western League Division One.

The Reserves finished sixth in the Western League Division One in 2023/2024 and twelfth in 2024/2025. For 2025/2026 season they return to the Gloucestershire County League, keeping the requisite number of divisions between themselves and the 1st XI.

CRIBBS FC – PLAYER PROFILES

Aaron Greatbanks - Goalkeeper – Age 29: originally joined us during the 2021/2022 season and has returned for this season. Calming presence and Hellenic League Cup winner.

Louie Farrow – Defence – Age 18: versatile young defender with experience beyond his years. Joins us from Hengrove Athletic where he made over 80 appearances in two seasons.

Archie Lock – Defence/Midfield – Age 26: player who came through the youth ranks at the club, returning to us in season 2023/2024 after a scholarship in the US. Archie can operate anywhere across the defence and midfield.

Joel Smith – Midfield – Age 21: talented midfielder who joins us this season from Brislington where he has been a regular for three seasons, making over 100 appearances in the process.

Danny Constable – Defence/Forward – Age 22: returned to the club last season as a coaching assistant whilst out injured. Danny brings plenty of Step 5 experience, featuring for ourselves, Shepton Mallet and Brislington during the last four years.

Ash Kendall – Defence – Age 29: a very experienced, no-nonsense centre-back. Has great knowledge of the level and has featured for other local clubs around our area including Oldland Abbotonians, Mangotsfield United and Cadbury Heath.

Joe Davis – Midfield – Age 19: joined our Southern League squad last season, making an immediate impact with goals and assists. Great delivery from set pieces and open play alike.

Oscar Sullivan – Defence/Midfield – Age 20: can operate in central defence or central midfield. Was a key player at Hengrove Athletic during the last two seasons.

Spike Weaver – Forward – Age 19: joined us from Stoke Gifford via a short spell at Portishead Town last season. Top scorer for Gifford in the Gloucestershire County League during season 2023/2024, Spike impressed when stepping up three levels and will be looking to build on his promising start at the club.

Harvey Jasper – Midfield – Age 20: talented young player who has worked his way from our A team to the 1st XI squad. Versatile player who can operate across the midfield or at fullback.



George Kellow – Forward: club legend and this season's captain. Scored the winning goal in the Hellenic League Cup win of 2021/2022 and has made over 150 appearances for the club.

Kosuke Ono – Midfield – Age 20: came to the club from university football at the beginning of 2024/2025, featuring regularly in the Southern League when available. Kos will be looking to impress at Step 5.


