Tonight's game will be our biggest test so far, but we will attack the game with lots of energy and play expansive football.

As individuals we have targets and we also have team targets. As a collective if we all do our part and contribute we should be in for an exciting game.

#### Louis Evans: Goalkeeper

A commanding first year keeper who is new to the squad. He brings some great qualities to this position while he looks to gain some valuable experience.

#### Alex Fulford: Goalkeeper

One of the second year U18s, Alex has joined the squad this season. Upon his arrival he has exhibited nothing but the highest standards of himself and his team mates. A top communicator who brings great experience.

#### Jack Copland: Goalkeeper

A first year U18, Jack has arrived at Tuffley Rovers this season after returning to the UK from Spain. A young and hungry keeper who has shown good qualities since his arrival at the club.

#### **Finlay Kent: Defence**

Second year U18. Fin brings a lot of hard work and pace to the left hand side. Works for the team, stopping goals and scoring them too. One of the seniors in the team he leads by example. Another player who has featured in the first team squad.

#### Laurie McNally: Defence (pictured)

First year U18, Laurie is a high quality and very consistent full-back. Adds great balance to the team and works hard both in and out of possession. Intelligent defender and potent in attacks. Deserved his recent call-up to the first team squad.

#### **Previously in the FA Youth Cup**

Our history in the FA Youth Cup is relatively short and sweet and with relatively limited success, when compared to the fortunes of our opposition tonight, Bath City.

Our visitors have a much more illustrious history and they went as far as the second round proper just last season. They also have a much longer history in the competition, with and some glorious victories, to boot, including a 9-0 win against Bishop Sutton, in 2016, probably a particular highlight!

So, how have we fared in previous years?






In 2015, we made our FA Youth Cup debut, with current first team squad member Henry Birkett featuring for Rovers in a defeat against Cirencester Town.

In that tie, Dan Lander's 67<sup>th</sup> minute goal proved to be a rare moment of hope in a 3-1 defeat at Glevum Park.





Then, in 2016, we hosted Yate Town and were thumped by our visitors, as we capitulated to a 9-1 defeat. Kameron Dix's 5<sup>th</sup> minute goal had made it 1-1, but that provided only a temporary moment of joy in a game that was very much a difficult evening for the Rovers squad.





Twelve months later, we hosted Yate Town again, and another defeat followed, albeit in the most agonising circumstances, as the visitors scored twice in the closing moments to seize a 3-2 victory that took them through to the next stage of the competition. Luke Troke and Jack Ellis had put Rovers in a good position before the final comeback by Yate.

In 2018 we recorded a first ever victory, as we saw off the challenge of Bitton AFC, in a 6-1 scoreline, with goals from Jack Ellis, Niall Priday (2), Ryley Mace and Kyle Rogers, as well as an own goal, powering Jamie Hyett's side to a historic win. That set-up a visit to Slimbridge in the next round and although Nathan Clift scored a second minute goal to give Rovers the advantage, the visitors eventually recorded a 4-1 win that ended our FA Youth Cup aspirations for another season.



Then, last season, we made a trip to Cinderford Town, in what was to prove a disappointing evening, with Niall Priday's third FA Youth Cup goal appearing to give Rovers a chance in the dying minutes, only for the hosts to score a late, late goal and record a 3-1 win in the process.

This season's competition has started with a 6-3 victory, at Bitton, so here is hoping for another success tonight. We seem to have better results against teams who start with 'B'...
