EDITOR'S COMMENT

Welcome to this afternoon's game against Hereford Lads Club. To the best of my knowledge this is their first visit to Glevum Park in a competitive fixture and I would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone in attendance who has travelled from Herefordshire.

We've had some tough times this season and there were no more depressing days for me than our visit to Lads Club in early-October. That isn't a reflection of the welcome we received from their club, but it was a dark day on the field as we capitulated to a 9-1 defeat that I hope will never be repeated.

The strange thing is that the defeat on that occasion was followed by us picking up 8 points from the next four games, including a 0-0 draw at Bishops Cleeve and a win at Lads Club's neighbours, Westfields, when we became the first team ever to win a Hellenic League Premier Division game at their ground. The run that followed that win ultimately brought Rich Cox's tenure to an end, as we went nine league games without a point and only scored two league goals in 810 minutes!

We have now started afresh, and Neil Mustoe is already making a real difference. Signings such as Ashley Davies, Harvey Greenslade and Sammie Hicks, supplemented by the return to fitness of Joel White, the resurgence of Ashley Bird and an all-round improvement for several other players, have started to take us in a more positive direction, with four points from five games a small but significant step in the right direction.

Adding some of the more experienced players alongside young talents like Jacob Geddes and Jack Copland has been the catalyst for restoring confidence and that is very often the key to improved fortunes. At a guess, no more than six of the players who started the horrendous defeat at The County Ground, Hereford will feature today. That is probably important, in the context of any hangover that could have existed if we were fielding an almost identical team. Add into the mix a tremendous result last weekend and I hope we have a recipe (or at least the basic ingredients) for a better day.

We were deservedly beaten last time these two teams met and will have to play well if our fortunes are to improve today. Whatever the outcome, this is the first of nine opportunities to create further distance from the sides below us and retain our place in the Hellenic League's Premier Division. I wish Muzzy and all the lads the best of luck; they have my full confidence that they can do what is needed.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the fixture this afternoon. I wish you a safe journey home.

Vaughan Howell's ladies team just couldn't get any luck on Sunday afternoon against Ellwood, also exiting the cup to a 1-0 defeat. It is reported to me that the ladies hit the woodwork five times during the game itself; and I think we have all been involved or witnessed these types of matches and the frustration that accompanies defeat in those circumstances!

I hope everyone gets to enjoy the hospitality available today and we have a great game football on show this afternoon.

Tuffley Rovers • Club History



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. The next season, a much younger side finished a slightly disappointing 11th but with a year's experience gained the Rovers challenged again at the top of the table for most of the next season before finishing 3rd.

The 2010/11 season saw some variable performances in the league, with a final finishing position of 6th, followed by a third place finish in 2011/12. The 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results.

This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

TUFFLEY ROVERS 2-2 BISHOPS CLEEVE
SATURDAY, 22 JANUARY 2022**

“What a difference a day makes”, they say. Or maybe the more salient observation is “everything can change in a minute”. Whichever way Neil Mustoe surveyed the outcome of his struggling side’s meeting with the current league leaders could apply in equal measure to the other.

This was a first Premier Division meeting between the two Gloucestershire clubs since Kevin Slack’s late equaliser past then Rovers keeper Luke Merchant had salvaged a point for Cleeve in March 2019. On this occasion, Merchant found himself suffering the double-whammy of conceding two late goals, but wearing the colours of Cleeve, who had held a 2-0 lead with less than four minutes remaining and would leave Glevum Park with only a single point.

Following the calamitous defeat against another high-flying opponent, Bradford Town, the previous week, Mustoe made four changes to his starting line-up, with Will Ramsey absent with injury, Joe Shutt and Josh Aldridge relegated to the bench, and Tom Spencer omitted from the squad completely. Ashley Davies, Joel White and Liam Wright all returned, to add much need experience to the line-up and they were joined by Rovers’ latest signing, as Sammie Hicks made his debut after signing from Cinderford Town on a dual registration.

Cleeve arrived at Glevum Park amidst a spate of injuries, illness and non-availability issues, meaning they started with Archie Haskayne, Jake Parrott, Sam Blackie and a plethora of other regulars, including former Rovers players Mark Pritchett, Kieran Alder and Jake Rhodes. Of interest, when looking at the visiting bench was the inclusion of Brennan Denness-Barrett, who had been Rovers’ top goalscorer – and remained as such – since he last scored in mid-October, but who had seen his Work Experience arrangement terminated in the week leading up to the game and promptly signed for Paul Collicutt’s side.

So, two very much changed line-ups stepped out onto the pitch at 3pm and although this was a meeting between two sides with very much contrasting fortunes since their 0-0 draw on 16 October 2021 at Evesham, Rovers started brightly, matching their visitors in the early stages.

Dominik Kent had an early effort on goal for Mustoe’s side but didn’t trouble Merchant, before Jordan Annear had the first chance for Cleeve without creating issue for Rovers keeper Jack Copland.

Despite the hosts contributing to a competitive game of football, their all too familiar defensive vulnerability was exposed again, on 28 minutes, when they fell behind. Iuean Crowe held off White’s challenge and made enough space to cross the ball to the back post, where Blaine Waugh rose highest to head goalwards, forcing a block save from Copland but the young keeper’s effort was in vain as the loose ball rolled towards the goal and over the line, only just before Jacob Geddes hooked it away. The Assistant Referee didn’t flag for a goal but the match official, Mr Hunt, made the award and was quite correct in doing so.

With the goal came increased confidence and Cleeve were by far the more threatening side

as the half progressed. Crowe should have scored, but he couldn't get over a ball that fell into his path in the six-yard box. Steve Davies was a busy presence for the visitors but although he had a couple of speculative efforts on goal, Copland wasn't forced into many saves and the first half ultimately closed without any addition to the score.

The opening moments of the second period very much resembled the closing moments of the first, with chances sparse but both sides competing to get a grip on the game, making for an absorbing contest. Fin Gwillim, who had scored four against Rovers U18s for Cleeve's U18s in a recent youth fixture was introduced, for Crowe, on 58 minutes as Collicutt looked to press home his side's advantage.

Copland might have been at risk of being the busier keeper but, for once, his defence served him proudly, making a succession of blocks and tackles that held Cleeve at bay. However, they looked to have been on the path to another defeat when Waugh netted his second on 68 minutes, rising highest to head home Davies' corner kick, with the goal awarded despite claims that Warren Mann had cleared the ball from the line after it had initially bounced down off the opposite post.

Shutt was then introduced from the bench, with Aldridge added three minutes later, for Hicks and Jack Beardsell, then Aaron Basford was added, for Kent, as Mustoe made all his changes in the space of six minutes. The visitors then made two changes themselves, with Denness-Barrett and Elliot Kennedy on for Annear and Davies, the second coming with just seven minutes remaining.

When Harvey Greenslade, who had made such an emphatic impression on his debut two weeks previous, cut in from the left before spearing a wonderful shot beyond Merchant and into the bottom corner from 20 yards, after 87 minutes, it seemed like Rovers had a consolation goal but driven on by Ashley Davies, who had been magnificent in the centre of midfield, Rovers launched an attacking effort that had been the only thing missing from an otherwise positive performance.

Sixty seconds later, Shutt whipped a ball into the six-yard box and as Davies looked to hook the ball home Will Turner made a good block but the ball fell into the path of Basford, who showed wonderful composure to smash the ball beyond Merchant from five yards out.

The equaliser was nothing more than Mustoe's side deserved on an afternoon when they had showed a mettle that had been largely non-existent in recent months. When the referee's whistle sounded a couple of minutes later it called time on a fantastic spectacle that could have gone either way but ultimately concluded with the points split, one apiece.

In the process of salvaging a point from the jaws of what seemed like another defeat, Rovers edged just a little further away from the relegation places at Step 5, increasing hopes that Mustoe can mastermind an end to the season that will ensure football at the same level in 2022/23. Four points from his first five games as manager doesn't sound like a reason for too much celebration, but when balanced against a return of zero points in ten league games prior to his managerial debut it makes for promising reading and gives Rovers' supporters genuine hope of survival.

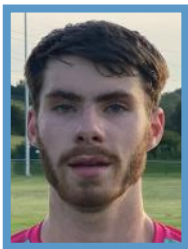

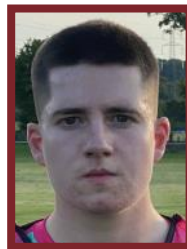

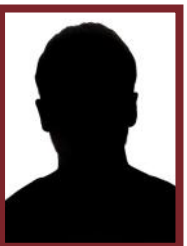

On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've not had too many games on 29 January (just one) but there are a few notable games that have been played around this particular date...

31 January 2009

It was raining goals at Glevum Park on 31 January 2009, as Tuffley Rovers and Patchway Town played out a thrilling 4-4 draw in the Gloucestershire County League, with six of the goals coming in the first half. The visitors had taken a 3-0 lead inside 24 minutes, before Rovers pulled three back in 20 minutes, through an own goal, a penalty from Ben Surman and an opportunist strike from Chris Lee. When Searle made it 4-3 after 85 minutes it looked like the points were heading back to Patchway but Rob Cook fired home a beauty in added time to salvage a point for Rovers.

30 January 2010

Tuffley Rovers suffered a disappointing defeat at Thornbury Town in the Gloucestershire County League. Steve Thompson netted in the opening five minutes to give the hosts the lead, before Victor Webb equalised from the penalty spot. Chris Parry extended Thornbury's lead, before Thompson got his second of the game. When Ashley Davies netted 20 minutes from time it gave Rovers hope but the hosts held on to record a 3-2 victory.

28 January 2012

Shayne Bradley netted twice – with an own goal added to Tuffley Rovers' score – as he and his team mates returned from Cribbs Friends Life with a 3-0 victory that

kept them at the top of the table and move four points away from their hosts who sit in third place. Warren Mann's low cross forced the early own goal from Cribbs' Nathan Lumber. That lead remained until the interval and Rovers were indebted to Mark Harris for a great save early in the second half, and just three minutes later Bradley scored his first to make it 2-0. Two further minutes passed before Mann gave his forward partner a golden chance to make it 3-0 and that was how it remained.

31 January 2015

Tuffley Rovers made it eight games unbeaten in the UHlsport Hellenic League, Division One (West), as a late Ashley Davies equaliser secured a 2-2 draw with Cirencester Town Development at Glevum Park. With keeper Aaron Taylor withdrawn from the line-up late, outfield player Marcus Foxwell ended up in goal and manager Warren Evans then lost centre-half Glenn Gittins in the pre-match warm-up to leave him without two key players. Warren Mann gave Rovers the lead in the first half, before Jacob Davidge scored twice in the second period. Town looked on course for all three points until Shayne Bradley sent Davies clear and he showed composure to round the keeper and make it 2-2.

“One swallow does not a summer make” is an old expression. In football parlance that could be translated as “one victory does not a recovery make”. Ultimately, despite a performance of spirit and enthusiasm, Rovers were unable to overcome a Roman Glass team that was far too streetwise to be picked off the way Shrivenham had been three days earlier.

Manager Neil Mustoe kept faith with the team which had started against Shrivy apart from bringing in Sam Mendes for the unavailable Ashley Davies. The visitors had already beaten Tuffley 4-1 at Almondsbury two months earlier and were looking to add to the five previous occasions this season in which they had picked up all three points in away league fixtures, one of which had been a commendable 3-1 win at Brimscombe & Thrupp in November.

Just as on Saturday, Rovers were awarded a free-kick on the right in the opening minute, but this time it did not lead to a dramatic start to the match. The opening minutes were rather frantic with the ball pinging around to all corners of the pitch. Roman Glass made some early inroads down the right, in which the speed and close ball control of Aaron Goulty was a feature and he would have plenty more to contribute as the opening half continued.

The Glass won a corner on the left but sixty seconds later Rovers had a corner on the right after a strong run down the left by Lewis Bainbridge. Another sixty seconds later and the visitors won another corner on the left and when Lewis Leigh-Gilchrist's flag-kick came across Ciaran Greening was unchallenged as he jumped to head the ball firmly into the net before home goalkeeper Jack Copland knew what was happening.



Goulty's trickery soon won his team a free-kick just outside the penalty-area on the left. The ball was whipped in and as Copland struggled to claim it Loui Ward pounced to drive the loose ball into the roof of the net.

It would soon get even worse for the hosts. Another trip on Goulty, by Mendes, saw a spot-kick awarded but Copland chose the right way and dived low to his right to make



a thrilling save from the penalty-kick. Joel White was quickest to the rebound and cleared the ball to safely as Roman Glass players closed in.

Shortly before the half-time break Rovers had a decent chance to pull a goal back but Jacob Geddes could only direct his header wide of the posts when Josh Aldridge's free-kick came in from the left.

The visitors brought on Shacquille Smith and Jake White at the start of the second half and it wasn't long before Rovers put Joe Shutt on in place of Liam Wright.

Lewis Bainbridge, who had been involved in much of Rovers' attacking play, found another opportunity to cut in from the left but fired over the crossbar and his evening was soon over when Jack Beardsell replaced him. Rovers' final throw of the substitution dice came when Jamal Lawrence came on for Joel White. There was a chance shortly after, when a delightful through-pass sent Shutt through on goal but Ross Grimshaw came off his line quickly to block the ball.



The Glass were nowhere near as threatening as they had been in the in the first half but could still move the ball around quickly with Goulty still seeing a lot of the action. He would be involved in the final decisive act of the evening when Shutt tripped him to concede another penalty. Goulty took this one himself and drove the ball confidently past Copland's right-hand side.



Rovers won a late corner but the ball was cleared and the game was over. Was this a surprise result? Not really. The defensive deficiencies Rovers had shown in the weeks leading up to this match were again apparent, but the players worked hard and there was no shame in losing to good opponents who were strong in defence and inventive in attack, with Goulty being their Man of the Match by a considerable margin. The Glass look very comfortable in mid-table but Tuffley

know that they still have plenty to do to ensure that they are still playing in the same division next season. On a cold evening, this was a pretty decent match to watch and an excellent crowd of over a hundred for a midweek game indicated that the locals thought so too.

Hereford Lads Club • History



The Hereford Lads Club was founded in 1925 for under privileged boys by Mr J Mackay with the aim of providing Young boys with the means to become men through sport emphasising gentlemanly conduct and good sportsmanship and originally catered for gymnastics and boxing before developing cricket & junior football teams.

In January 1940 Hereford Lads Club was destroyed by fire and sadly all early records were lost.

the land was generously donated by Mr W R Bufton together with donations from many local businessmen. In the 1960's & 1970's Hereford Lads Club blossomed and was attended by as many as 170 young people per night creating a great community spirit.

Today we have a thriving junior football section with boys & girls from u8 up to u17. Our football development centre has boys & girls up to the age of 8. We currently have 24 Boys & girls teams ranging from u9's to u17's in the Herefordshire Junior football League. We also have 3 senior men's teams, the first team Play in the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, the Reserves play in the Premier Division of the Herefordshire Football League & the Colts play in Division 2.

All our managers, coaches & officials are Volunteers who are fully trained & CRB checked.

We work hard to provide opportunities for young people to develop their skills in sport.

Our first team joined the West Midland Regional League Division 2 from the Herefordshire Premier League in 2011/12 season, when Manager Danny Moon & his assistant Rich Jones decided to try and push the club up through the football pyramid.
