

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northerm Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. The next season, a much younger side finished a slightly disappointing 11th but with a year's experience gained the Rovers challenged again at the top of the table for most of the next season before finishing 3rd.

The 2010/11 season saw some variable performances in the league, with a final finishing position of 6th, followed by a third place finish in 2011/12. The 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results.

This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 3-1 HEREFORD LADS CLUB SATURDAY, 29 JANUARY 2022



The Gloucester club's hopes of moving away from serious trouble at the wrong end of the table had been boosted by taking four points out of six from Shrivenham and Bishops Cleeve in their previous two home league fixtures, but the Lads Club arrived in Tuffley with fourteen more points than their hosts from the same number of matches. Added to this, the Hereford club had the memory of inflicting Rovers' worst defeat of the season by winning 9-1 at their own ground back in October.

The visitors had adapted well to life in the Hellenic League's top division but, interestingly, had yet to draw an away game having five wins and eight defeats from their thirteen matches on the road so far. Rovers had lost nine out of fourteen at their Glevum Park home and could not really afford to let the number of home defeats reach double figures because they knew that they could still be caught by the division's bottom two clubs, Calne Town and Hallen.

Rovers avenged the calamitous afternoon they had endured at Hereford in October but on a cold and blustery afternoon in Gloucester there was never any chance of a repeat of the goal-fest of the Autumn. Tuffley won only their 4th home league match of the season but it was enough to lift them into 16th place above the Towns of both Lydney and Chipping Sodbury. By contrast, the Hereford Lads continued their odd statistic of not having drawn an away match in the League this season, this being their ninth away defeat to go with their five victories.

The hosts kicked off playing towards the open end and that seemed to be a good tactic because home goalkeeper Jack Copland was able to get enormous distance on his goal-kicks and clearances. So, most of the early action was in the Hereford half and this included a yellow card for a Hereford defender for a horrible lunge on Harvey Greenslade as Rovers' number nine made progress down the left channel. When Sammie Hicks drove the resulting free-kick into a dangerous area visiting 'keeper Steve Bell had to be alert to palm the ball out of danger.

Near the quarter-hour mark referee Simeon Stoodley fell over near the centre-circle with no player near him and really ought to have had a word with himself about 'simulation'! Ten minutes later James Cuthbertson and Henry Dyde exchanged passes as they attacked Rovers' right-hand side and this resulted in a close-range header by Tom Dawson which Copland grabbed confidently.

With 25 minutes gone Luke Wright cut in from the right and tried a left-footed shot which saw Bell scramble across his goal-line to clutch the ball by a post. Despite these moments, chances at both ends were few and far between in an opening half which

could be described as uncompromising. With half-time approaching the Lads won a free-kick on the left and when Adam Newbury swung the ball across to the far post Copland tipped it away for Hereford's first corner of the match. Dyde's corner was blocked only for Levi Ellis to blast the loose ball high over the crossbar.

Whatever was said by both coaches during the interval made an immediate difference. Joshua Aldridge replaced Sammie Hicks at the start of the second half and, just as in the first half, Rovers had the better of the early exchanges. There was certainly more bite in the tackling and Ashley Davies was carded for fouling Ellis.

Finally, the breakthrough came in the 56th minute. Rovers won a corner on the left which Aldridge swung over to the far post and when the ball was headed back across goal by Joel White, Tuffley skipper Jacob Geddes had a simple downward header from close in to give his team the lead.



This was quickly followed by a Davies shot which went wide before Hereford brought on Glenn Segust for Will Loughman.

It is said that a team is never more vulnerable than when it has just scored. To confirm that, the Lads drew level with a sensational goal as Olly Price cut in from the left and hit a screamer into the far corner.



A few weeks ago some Rovers' heads might have dropped at conceding a goal like that but not now. As the second half reached its midway point, a clear foul in the box by the visiting goalkeeper on Ashley Bird saw a penalty awarded, for which Warren Mann took responsibility and he blasted

the spot-kick fiercely to Bell's right with the goalkeeper diving the other way.

Hereford brought on Florian Stanescu for Ellis and Rovers responded by replacing Bird with Basford and, in the closing minutes, Kent with Smith.

A home win was sealed when a low shot from Greenslade was parried away by a falling Bell and Shutt, following up, had an easy tap-in to give Rovers a two-goal cushion which they held on to fairly comfortably as the clock ticked down the final minutes.


Rovers thought they had made it 4-1 but Dominik Kent's tap-in was disallowed for a foul on Bell by Ashley Davies as Joe Shutt's crisp cross came in from the left touchline.

As the final whistle blew you could hear the screams of delight from the home players. They knew how important these points were. The Lads from Hereford were a big and strong team all over the pitch and although the first half was not pretty, and even they lost a lot of battles in the second half, Rovers' neat passing and good positional play was a far cry from that shown during the dreadful eight-match losing run at home between the end of October and the middle of January.

5 February 2011

A 78th minute goal from Adam Bates was enough to ear AXA all three Gloucestershire County League points against Tuffley Rovers. When Liam Harding slipped whilst in possession Bates raced clear and although Rovers' keeper Adam Bennett made a good stop, the AXA man followed up to fire the ball home.

7 February 2015

Bradley, who was returning to the side after a knee injury, appeared from the bench with 20 minutes remaining and his sensational 89th minute effort, after Warren Mann had headed Kieran Squires' long throw into his path, was enough to snatch the points!

He will be the fifth member of our current squad (those involved, rather than simply registered to play) to do so, after Warren Mann, Macaulay Herbert, Ashley Davies, Dominik Kent and Liam Wright.

Digger first appeared back on 29 March 2017 when he was selected in midfield against Brackley Town Saints, in a 4-1 away defeat after a long midweek journey. He picked up a caution on what was to be his only appearance that season, but he then made 86 appearances across the next two seasons, before a move to Southern League side Slimbridge, although he returned briefly in 2019 to make a single appearance against Flackwell Heath. Eleven appearances already this season have brought us to this landmark occasion....

MATCH REPORT – 17 OCTOBER 2017 GFA CHALLENGE TROPHY, ROUND TWO TUFFLEY ROVERS 0-4 HALLEN



After a performance which Rovers' manager, Mark Pritchett, described as the worst during his time in charge of the Glevum Park club, Tuffley Rovers were ceremoniously dumped out of this year's GFA Challenge Trophy, as Western League Premier Division side Hallen returned to Bristol with a 4-0 victory.

With nine defeats in their last twelve fixtures, and only one victory during that time, Rovers had looked short of confidence coming into the cup tie and although they had secured a very welomce league point at Abingdon United on Saturday, a worrying trend is emerging, with few chances created, despite a decent share of possession.

Pritchett was without a number of players for the visit of Hallen, including keeper Dave Evans who is a long-term absentee, and with usual deputy Kane Winman unable to play due to work commitments, in addition to Buster Davies' registration not being completed on time, the Rovers boss handed a competitive first team debut to third team keeper Robin Stamps.

After exiting the competition at this stage 12 months earlier, Pritchett had indicated his desire to make progress and enjoy a cup run in 2017/18, but he still made several changes to his line-up, as Sam Hill, Shayne Bradley, Chris Manners and fit again Tristan Haswell all returned to the starting line-up to face Hallen. Warren Mann, Danny Wallington and another regular starter, Marcus Foxwell, were all on the bench.

Despite the numerous changes to their line-up, Rovers started the tie on the front-foot and looked anything but a side whose confidence has ebbed after a run of poor results. Although they didn't seriously test Hallen's keeper, Jake Hanham, in the opening quarter of an hour, they looked in control and unlikely to be greatly troubled by the visiting team.

Kieran Alder, recently signed from Bishops Cleeve, went close to opening his scoring account for the club, on sixteen minutes, when he latched onto a pass from Bradley and found himself beyond the Hallen defensive line, but his delicate chip over the onrushing Hanham drifted narrowly wide of the far post. Seconds later, Manners managed to turn goalwards, but his shot from 12 yards lacked power and was comfortably saved.

Despite having their tails up, Rovers inability to convert territorial advantage seemed to affect their defensive stability and they were fortunate not to fall behind, on 30 minutes, when Aaron Anglin completely missed his kick, with the goal at his mercy and Luke Mills then blasted the loose ball over the bar, from just seven yards out.

Pritchett might have hoped that near escape would spur his side on, but the fragility it appeared to expose took root and when the ball fell to Jack Mills, he fired the ball viciously back across the goal and into the net, before Stamps had a chance to react, to give Hallen a one-goal lead, on 36 minutes.

An almost immediate opportunity to level the scores was spurned, less than two minutes later, as Joel White's cross was met by Brett James, but the Rovers wide-man could only head the ball wide, as he looked set to score.



The half-time interval didn't appear to interrupt Rovers' flow and Shayne Anson had an effort cleared off the line, from an Alder cross, almost straight after the restart, before Scott Cousins went down the other end and rattled the frame of Stamps' goal with a strike from 25 yards.

That close call didn't act as a sufficient warning for Pritchett's men and they fell further behind on 51 minutes, as Cousins rose to head home Jack Mills' cross.

Wallington and then Mann were then introduced to the action, replacing James and Manners, respectively, but the addition of two regular starters wasn't enough to save Rovers, as Hallen took a huge step toward securing a place in the 3rd round of the competition, when Santiago Escliano struck a shot that took a huge deflection off Shayne Anson, leaving Stamps helpless as the ball spun into the opposite side of his goal, to make it 3-0.

Stamps had been given little opportunity to keep Hallen at bay, but when he was called upon, after 71 minutes, he produced a good diving save to beat away Liam Henderson's shot.

When Anson saw a straight red card for the hosts, for a crude, mistimed challenge on Jack Mills, the game looked over, although both Mann and White managed to get shots on goal, before Wright's effort cannoned back off the Hallen bar, only for substitute Kye Mountford to net a late effort and make it 4-0 to Hallen, securing a place in the next round of the competition and leaving Pritchett with plenty to reflect upon, after his side's ninth defeat in their last thirteen games.

Hallen Club History

The club was formed by members of a new community living at Lawrence Weston on the outskirts of Bristol, which had been developed shortly after World War Two. The club was named Lawrence Weston Athletic and played in the Bristol & District League, and it has moved forward steadily since moving to the



village of Hallen in 1979, to conform with League Ground grading. Much of the credit for the progress of this club can be accredited to the late Frank Fairman and his family. His son Francis, and grandson Lee continue the link with the club. In fact Lee played a major part in our fight for survival during the summer of 2015, when the club was in danger of losing its home. So it was no surprise when long serving Chairman Barrie Phillips nominated Lee to take over the chair from himself, at the next AGM. The club became known as Lawrence Weston Hallen when it moved to Moorhouse Lane, joining the Gloucestershire County League in 1982, and under that title were runners up 1987-88, and Champions 1988- 89, after which the club dropped Lawrence Weston from its title to become known as simply Hallen. The club completed the double in 1992-93, when winning the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy and the League title. Promotion was achieved, joining the Hellenic League Division One, and after further improvements to the facilities (particularly the erection of floodlights and a 200-seater stand), a runnerup position in 1996–97 led to another step up, to the Hellenic League Premier Division. The club had always considered the Western League as its goal, as this League was more familiar with Bristolians than the Hellenic League. Their wish to transfer over was granted at the second time of asking but it was insisted that the club join the First Division for season 2000-01. The club finished fourth in its first season in the Western League and reached the last sixteen of the F.A.Vase losing to Brigg Town 6-5 in extra time. Further progress was made when new manager Gary Damone led the team to the Division One title in Season 2003-4, and fourth place in the Premier Division at the first attempt. The club also reached the final of the GFA Trophy and were denied a place in the first round of the F.A. Cup when losing to Nationwide Conference side Canvey Island in the fourth and final qualifying round. This success saw Southern League side Taunton Town tempt Gary Damone to try his hand at a higher level, which in turn saw Hallen have a dip in form, as players were also tempted away. It is however well known that a high percentage of players are happy to return to Hallen, and for season 2009-10 the club welcomed back Gary Damone as manager and many former players too. The club finished in a disappointing twelth position in 2009-10, but a crop of long term injuries did not help. The club however were to lift the Western League (Les Phillips) Cup for the first time. The club had experienced a bad start to the 2010-11 season, which saw the departure of manager Gary Damone who chose to take charge of his own town club Wellington. Club stalwart Paul Owen was given the task of steering the team to safety. With just one win prior to taking over in November, he and his assistant John Tierney changed fortunes around and we were safe from relegation with six games left. Paul Owen's first full season as manager saw the club challenging for the title, but a dip in form saw the club slip to fourth. Off the field, the club had ensured promotion would not be denied, had the club won the title by obtaining the ground grading for Southern League football.

Season 2012-13 saw no repeat of a challenge for promotion, but the season was kept alive by reaching the final of the Les Phillips League Cup for a second time. In the final Willand Rovers won 1-0 before a crowd of 400 at Cribbs Friends Life FC. As Paul Owen had already decided to step down at the end of the campaign, it was unfortunate that he could not see his side lift the cup. By mid May the club announced that Hengrove Athletic manager Jamie Hillman was to take over as manager, He had been at the helm for eight years at Hengrove, and had just guided them to the Premier Division as runners up in April. The 2013-14 season under Jamie and his assistant Grantley Dicks, was a mixture of highs and lows. The highs being success in lifting the GFA Trophy for a third time and reaching the fifth round of the FA Vase losing away to West Auckland Town. In contrast we finished the League campaign without a win in fifteen games.

Manager Jamie Hillman announced that he would be leaving, and previous manager Paul Owen agreed to return for the 2014-15 season. By November the League form was yet again cause for concern and Paul decided it would be best to bring in a new face, rather than wait to the end of the season. Steve Winter a former Walsall and Torquay player was appointed with a view, of him settling in, prior to the coming season. He was to resign in December 2015, and long serving player Tom Collett took on the role as player manager assisted by Rayan Wilson for the 2016-17 season. Following another poor run of results,Tom Collett made way for former player Ben Willshire to return as the new manager. Ben guided the club away from relegation, but when fortunes did not change in the next campaign, it was decided his assistant Rob Sage should take over the helm prior to Christmas 2017, with Ben remaining as a player. The resignation of Rob Sage forced the club to seek another manager in February.

Former manager Gary Damone returned as interim manager, whilst the club decided on a replacement from a record number of applicants. The successful candidate being former player Ray Johnstone, who had guided Odd Down to the title in 2016. Ray recruited another former Hallen player Tony Davis as his assistant for the 2018-19 season, unfortunately Tony had to step down during the course of the season. It was a season which saw a more settled side, finishing in twelfth place the best for several years. Further progress was made during the 2019-20 season, with Ray being assisted by Dean Horseman, before it was brought to an abrupt end due to the coronavirus pandemic. Ray's departure early in the season 2020-21, saw Dean takeover as Manager in what turned out to be another pandemic disrupted season. A poor run of results at the start of this season resulted in Dean and his new Assistant Tony Beecham departing the club. We are hopeful that performances and results will improve under the new leadership of former Sheffield Wednesday player Stuart Jones and his trusty Director of Football Andy Hawkins.


