## Tuffley Rovers • Club History



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. The next season, a much younger side finished a slightly disappointing 11th but with a year's experience gained the Rovers challenged again at the top of the table for most of the next season before finishing 3rd.

The 2010/11 season saw some variable performances in the league, with a final finishing position of 6th, followed by a third place finish in 2011/12. The 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results.

This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

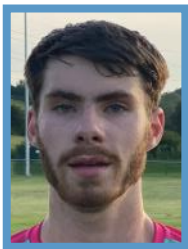

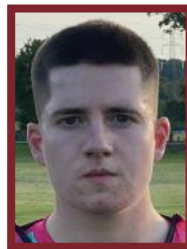

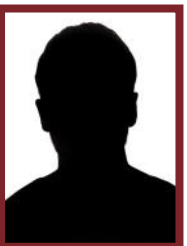

## **UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 1-2 HALLEN SATURDAY, 5 FEBRUARY 2022**



After a recent upturn in their form, Tuffley Rovers welcomed Hallen to Glevum Park on Saturday; a game that the neutral might have anticipated would go in the home side's favour after they had picked up four points from their previous two games, whilst the visitors had won just twice all season, avoiding defeat just six times in twenty-nine league games.

When ninety minutes of football had concluded, Hallen travelled home with three points and Rovers will be left looking nervously over their shoulder, not so much at the victors from this fixture – who still have a 13 thirteen point deficit on Neil Mustoe's side – but at the sides below them, notably Calne Town who gained a point and now trail by eight points with a game in hand.

Mustoe's side still have enough of a gap between them and the relegation places to mean they don't yet need to panic but tough fixtures lie ahead, with games against high-flyers Westfields, and Westbury United to come before they face Stuart Jones' side for a second time on 22 February, with that midweek trip to Hallen coming before the final four games against Cribbs, Royal Wootton Bassett Town, another of the strugglers Lydney Town and then a final game against Fairford Town on 19 March.

In all likelihood, if Mustoe can lead his troops to four or five additional points that will potentially be enough to guarantee safety, but this was a game he might have hoped for a result from and will be disappointed not to have taken at least a share of the spoils, not least because his side were rarely tested and wasted several good chances on goal.

Having secured points against Bishops Cleeve and Hereford Lads Club, the Rovers boss was forced into only one change, as Sammie Hicks was ruled out with injury, meaning Aaron Basford was recalled to the starting line-up.

The visitors had a very early sight on goal, as Jordan Ricketts unleashed a shot from distance but it was too high and Jack Copland was able to watch it sail over the Rovers bar.

That chance aside, Rovers held the territorial advantage in the early stages but the game was punctuated by a series of stoppages for fouls, including two that called the match officials into punitive action, with one caution apiece for Hallen's Jordan Greenwood and Rovers' Liam Wright.



Basford and Harvey Greenslade both had half chances but each skewed their opportunity well wide and the game remained goalless.

Neither side was creating many opportunities but Rovers might have had a penalty shortly before Wright received his caution, as Greenslade went down under Leo Eglin's

challenge just inside the penalty area, but the referee waved away the appeals from the Rovers players.

Wright's challenge to stop a break by Hallen immediately after, resulted in a free-kick that was lofted high into the Rovers box and after Martin Stowell had won a header the ball found its way across the Rovers box and into the path of the unmarked Saul Jarrett, who needed no second opportunity to hammer the ball home past Copland from 7 yards.

Josh Jenkins might have made it 2-0 shortly after, as he latched onto another loose ball from another set-piece but his effort went across the Rovers goal and out of play.

With neither side particularly threatening the opposition goal the score remained 1-0 when the interval arrived.



A little under 15 minutes after the interval the scores were levelled. Warren Mann played a lovely pass to out the ball into Greenslade and the forward got to the ball just before the Hallen keeper, Harry Thomas-Barker, drawing a foul that the referee would have been hard pressed to miss. Mann stepped up to take the penalty and calmly dispatched it high into the net.

Based upon the pattern of play that should have been the catalyst for Rovers to go on and secure all three points and it looked like a matter of time as chances came their way in quick succession. Ashley Bird spurned the first of several clear opportunities, turning the ball over the Hallen bar from three yards out.



Moments later a corner was headed on by Ashley Davies and into the path of Joel White, but the experienced Rovers centre-half missed the ball, before it cannoned off the far post and back into the path of Thomas-Barker who gathered the ball at the second attempt.

Rovers continued to press but a staccato affair full of stoppages remained wide open and it was the visitors who struck the next meaningful blow. Another set-piece went deep into Rovers territory and the defensive fragility that has been the hallmark of their season was exposed once again, as Jarrett was afforded too much time and space, giving him an opportunity to hammer the ball low into the net to make it 2-1 with ten minutes remaining.

Like the wolf in the Three Little Pigs fairy tale, Rovers huffed and puffed in search of an equaliser but they eventually ran out of time and Hallen were left to celebrate a third victory of their season when time was called. Mustoe will be left to reflect on a missed opportunity to ease the pressure on his side but, in the context of the situation he faced when taking on the role, his side can still feel a measure of confidence that their destiny now remains in their own hands.

# **WESTFIELDS FC HISTORY**



Westfields Football Club commence the new 2021/2022 season again in the UHL Hellenic Football League having had the pleasure of playing in the previous two seasons although both seasons have been claimed null and void due to the coronavirus situation.

Westfields enjoyed their first season in the league and were 13 points clear when it was curtailed due to the coronavirus and then last season, we only played 5 games and again the season was curtailed.

Last season was a slight disappointment, not only in the fact that the league games were kept to a minimum of only 5 and we did not make the progress that we wanted in the FA Cup or the FA Vase.

Furthermore, we were beaten in the HFA County senior challenge cup final at Edgar Street by our near neighbors Hereford lads Club.

However, this season we are looking to have a full season with the programme set out by the Hellenic league and the management structure of Phil Glover along with assistant manager and coach Paul Willetts, assisted by our new club coach Tony James and Richard Thompson will I'm sure will be anxious with the players to gain a promotion place.

The management team are ambitious and enthusiastic as they wish to try and continue the historic rise of Westfields Football Club of 1966 when the club was formed to continue and progress hopefully into the Southern league South and West.

During the last 55 years Westfields have enjoyed a meteoric rise throughout the West Midland league to the Midland Football League and along the way have finished runners up twice in the Midland Football League and narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern league South and West having finished runners up to Gresley Rovers and Stratford Town in previous seasons.

Westfields celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary season in the 2016/17 with an amazing giant killing run in the FA Cup which saw them go through to the first-round proper before losing to Curzon Ashton following a Match Of The Day game at Allpay Park in the first round proper, which also featured Westfields appearance on Football Focus and prior to that Chief Executive Andy Morris had appeared live on the FA Cup first round draw as a studio panel guest in Manchester.

In fact 2016/17 also saw Westfields celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with a celebratory dinner at the Three Counties Hotel Hereford, and Andy Morris was also a guest at the Non-league paper luncheon at Chelsea Football Ground where he was given a lifetime achievement award for 50 years' service as secretary of Westfields Football club.

Other accolades were received during the season as presentations were made by the Herefordshire Football Association to the Midland Football League, Ladbrokes, and the Midlands FA Cup committee to celebrate the tremendous that Westfields had enjoyed in their FA Cup run which gave them wins over Stourport Swifts, Tividale, St Ives Town, Highgate United, Walton Casuals and Leiston before they drew Conference North side Curzon Ashton at home and then lost in the replay 3-1.

Westfields have enjoyed tremendous support financially by being sponsored firstly by their ground sponsor Allpay Ltd who for the first 15 years were the shirt sponsors at the club.

This has now been taken on by CJ insurance who have enjoyed fantastic support and coverage in the last 2 seasons during our period in the Hellenic Football League.

We are delighted that CJ Insurance have continued their support to Westfields Football Club again this season and along with Metclad of Nottingham and support from Life Member Ron Marshall who continues to support the club Westfields can go forward with a sound footing.

Westfields are a club geared up for success with a very strong committee which has been well established over many years and with a ground with an E certificate for higher-graded football and a recently re-furbished club room, bar, and dressing rooms.

Previous coaching experience with City before a spell away from the game until his appointment with The Rovers.



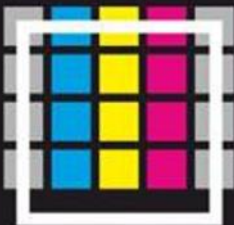

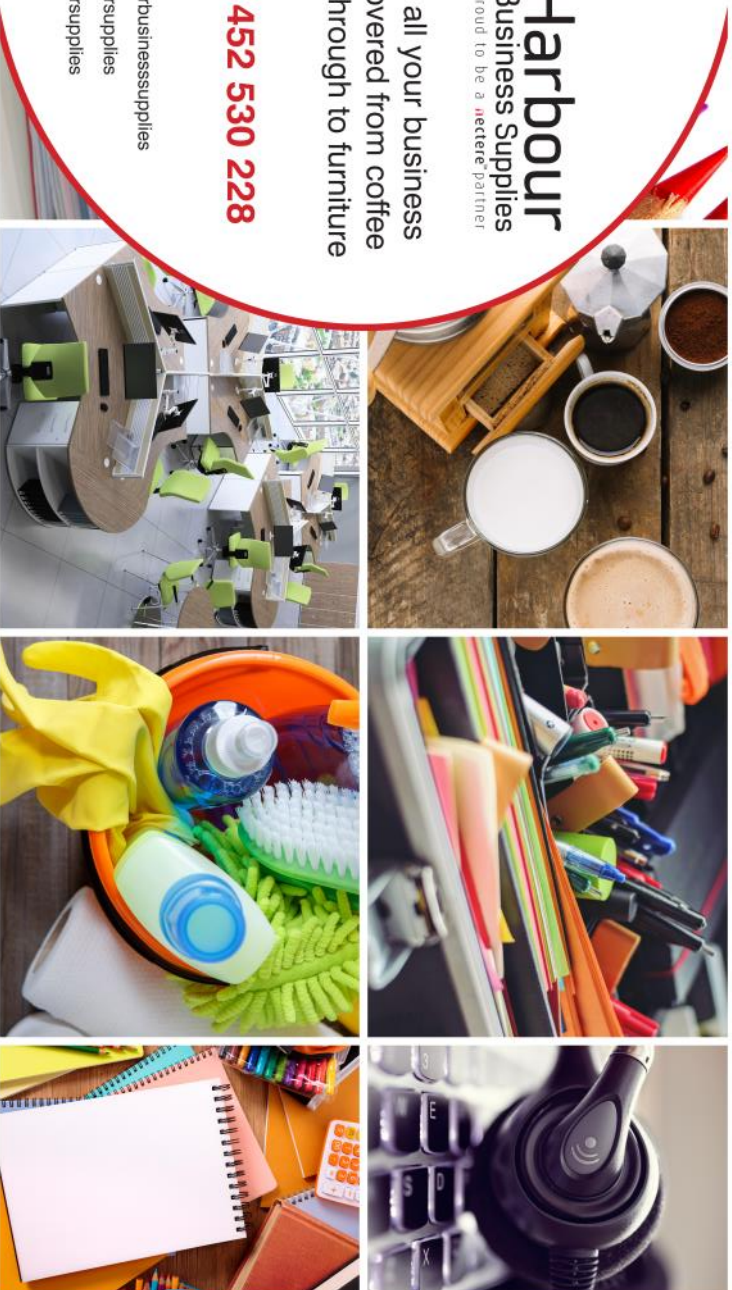

# On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've not had too any games on 12 February but there are a few notable games that have been played around this particular date...

## 9 February 2008

With just a quarter of an hour to go, however, Wallington's excellent cross found Ollie Everitt in space on the edge of the box and he produced a superb volleyed effort that secured all three points for the hosts.
