CHAIRMAN'S COMMENT



Good afternoon all and a very warm welcome to Glevum Park.

Firstly I hope that the players, management, committee members and supporters of Cribbs had a safe journey up the M5 this afternoon and hope you enjoy the hospitality here today.

We continue to have work carried out on the pitch to remedy the topping up of the drainage lines that will be visible today, and we are hoping over the next few weeks, all apart from a few areas will be completely covered with grass. The drought over the summer months caused our drain lines to drop and although we took a few weeks off, to undertake repair work, sadly we have had a period where the pitch isn't looking as good as it was. We ended up with what amounted to turf hanging over huge deep voids, which were becoming dangerous to play on and the pitch eventually became unsafe. Thank you to AgriPower who, at very short notice, were able to come in and top the drains up with around 50 tonnes of rootzone and sand. The most important part, is that the surface is safe (despite its appearance!) and football can continue, bringing much needed revenue to cover the ever increasing costs that everyone is feeling. Football clubs are businesses effectively and we are not excluded from the added costs and extra bills we are all facing.

Last week we had a disappointing result, although I thought the first thirty minutes or so against Hereford Lads Club was some of the best football we have played this season and we would walk off at half time in the lead, then push on in the second half. However, a late first half goal gave them the impetus and we never really got going in the second half which was frustrating to see.

The league looks tight at both ends, with us only four points off bottom, but only six points from 10th with games in hand on nearly all teams above us. This season will go down to the wire at the top end of the table in my opinion, but we are certainly not looking to be in a scrap for survival like we have been for the last four seasons.

Last Sunday, our Ladies' team played their first ever Women's FA Cup game here, against Paulton Rovers, and put in a spirited performance against a higher league opposition. Sadly, they were the wrong end of a 2-0 result, but they worked hard and did themselves and the club proud in their attempt to cause an upset against the odds. A few injuries during the first half meant that they just couldn't get back into the game after going in at half time 2-0 down. I'm confident that after being promoted into Division One this season, they will have enough to finish higher than their current league position suggests.

Our Development Squad, under the leadership of Dave Cornock and Michael Oakes, have had a great start to the season in Hellenic League, Division Two (West), having won four out of four, and with two games in hand on the teams above them they are well positioned. What was started as a solely development team, designed to help move players from our U18's into Saturday Hellenic League football, has now turned into a very competitive squad that we hope will gain promotion, whilst also nurturing players that will go on to play for our first team. Good luck to the squad at Shortwood United today.

Let's hope for a good crowd here today, with some good football on display and I wish you all a safe journey home.

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Thunderous tackling, powerful in the air and has a terrific long-throw that could add a dimension to our play.

George Driver-Dickerson Defence

A new signing, but a familiar surname for those who remember his father's spell as a player at the club. Signed from Slimbridge, where he had played his U18s football and looking to make the progression to first team football. Naturally a full-back, who looks confident on the ball and tenacious off it. Also a very talented cricketer.

Paul Azubilla Defence

Joined from local side Gloucester Athletic this season, after requesting a trial in the summer. Impressed in the early pre-season sessions and could be a great acquisition. Raw but has pace, power, strength and desire to improve. Very calm on the ball and capable of hitting a pass, meaning he could be a good prospect as the season develops.

Dan Lander Defence

Returned in pre-season, having spent a short spell with the club a few seasons ago, without making a competitive appearance. Has returned with more experience and is a tall centre-half, who is strong, fierce in the tackle and decent in the air. He's also sensible in possession and knows his role in the side.

Ashley Davies Defence

In his third spell with the club. Has had spells away at Hardwicke, Shortwood United and Cinderford Town but returned last season for a short period and is now raring to go in 2022/23! Was Neil Mustoe's first signing last season and an incredible coup. Brings class on the ball, a physical presence, leadership and a wonderful work ethic to the squad and his influence will be of huge value to the club. Can also play in midfield.

Had spells at Tiverton Town and Weston-Super-Mare but injuries restricted his progress. Has signed in an effort to regain fitness, so may not be with us for long, but a hugely impressive signing! Can play on the left-side of the defence or in a holding midfield role.

Scott Nicholls Defence

A member of our hugely successful 2020/21 FA Youth Cup squad, Scott then secured a scholarship to attend college in the US but returned to the club in December 2021 and made a solid contribution in five appearances, punctuated by a return to the USA, before the end of the season. Tall, athletic and comfortable on the ball will be looking to collect more first team appearances this season.

Mason Lewis Defence

Recently signed after impressing in pre-season. Capable of playing at centre-back or left-back and can also play further forward in a wide role. Tall, commanding, strong and comfortable on the ball. Will be looking to secure a regular starting berth after spells at Cirencester Town, Lydney Town and Longlevens, amongst others.

Luke Hawkins Midfield

CRIBBS HISTORY

Cribbs Football Club (Cribbs FC) are currently in their 65th season since they were founded back in London in 1958 as 'Sun Life Assurance'. The Bristol team was established in 1976 when Sun Life first relocated to Bristol. Initially they ran two teams in the Bristol and Avon League, playing at Dundridge Farm. However, when the Cribbs Causeway (now The Lawns) ground was opened in 1978, the 1st team were promoted straight to the Avon Premier Combination League where they stayed for 20 years until they eventually won promotion to the Gloucestershire County League by winning the re-named Bristol Premier Combination in the 1999/2000 season.

In the 1998/1999 season the 1st team finished runners up to Roman Glass St George in both the Combination & Premier Combination League Cup. In 1997/1998 the 1st team also finished runners up, after a replay, to Ridings High in the GFA Senior Amateur Cup.

The club adopted the name of AXA Sun Life FC at the end of the nineties following the merger of the AXA Equity & Law and Sun Life Assurance Society, and became AXA FC in 2002. At the end of the 2010-2011 season, following the acquisition and merger of AXA Sun Life & Friends Provident, we became the Cribbs Friends Life Football Club. At the end of June 2013, with the closure of the companies Cribbs Friends Life Sports & Social Club and with the creation of the new volunteer run, Cribbs Sports & Social Club at "The Lawns", we renamed ourselves as Cribbs Football Club.

Today the Club runs three Saturday sides, spread across the Hellenic League, Gloucestershire County League and Bristol Premier Combination.

On a Sunday we ran a successful side in the Regional League for many years (who won the Gilbert Pullin Sunday Cup in 2003/2004 & 2013/2014 season and were runners up in 2006/2007 season) and continue to run a Vets side in the Casuals League. In addition, we have an Under 18's team in the Bristol Premier Combination U18's league.

The club's 3rd team managed at the time by current Cribbs media man, Nick Veale, won the GFA Minor Cup in the 2004/2005 season when beating Winterbourne United's 3rd team in a tight and tense final where the "evergreen" goalkeeper John Hembrow was man of the match.

The 1st team reached the semi final stage of the Les James League Cup on three occasions since joining the county league in the 2000/2001 season. They unfortunately lost on all three occasions, against Ellwood on penalty kicks in March 2005, 2-1 against Highridge United in March 2006 and against Hardwicke, 1-0 in 2008.

At the start of 2007/2008 season the football club embarked on an ambitious change of direction that they hope would lead to their 1st team being a regular top 3 side in the Gloucestershire County League, and possibly higher.

At the end of the 2010/2011 season, under the tutelage of Gavin Tufton (in his second spell in charge) and assisted by Matt Shaughnessy, the 1st team finished runners up in the Gloucestershire County League. Unfortunately, promotion to the Toolstation Western league wasn't possible as the league champions, Brimscombe & Thrupp, had applied and been granted promotion to the Hellenic League.

With planning permission having been granted for floodlights to be installed and stands to be built, the 1st team went one better in the 2011/2012 season and completed the league championship & league cup double (the first time it had been happened.

This was obviously a fantastic achievement and meant the highly anticipated promotion to the next level of the pyramid system and entry into the Toolstation Western League for the start of the 2012/2013 season.

The floodlights & stand were installed in August 2012 and the lights were first used for the 1st team's home league game against Hengrove Athletic on 16th October 2012.

The 2011/2012 season was probably the most successful year in the club's history with not only the 1st team completing the double and gaining promotion as in addition the 2nd team gained promotion to the Premier Division of the Bristol Premier Combination.

The 2012/2013 season continued in the same vein with the 1st team finishing 8th in their first season in the Western League and the 3rd & 4th teams being promoted. In addition, the U18 side won their league and came runners up in the League Cup Final.

2013/2014 season was another good season for the club with the 1st team finishing 5th in Western League One and qualifying for the next season's FA Cup whilst being runners up in the Les Phillips Cup Final. The 3rd team won promotion again and the Sunday team won the Gilbert Pullin League Cup.

2014/2015 was yet another successful season for the club with the 1st team finishing in 3rd place in Division One after a very hard fought & close battle with Barnstaple Town & Welton Rovers for the major honours. This was enough to secure promotion to the next step of the pyramid, the Western League Premier Division.

The progress of the club continued on an upward trend during the 2015/2016 season with the First XI finishing a respectable 15th in their first Step Five season. The Reserve team were runners up to Mendip Broadwalk in a thrilling finale to the Premier Division of the Bristol Premier Combination. The 3rd team also finished runners up in Division One of the Bristol & District league which as a result meant promotion to the Senior Division for the 2016/2017 season. The Sunday team won the Regional League Cup. The Under 18's also won their league and were runners up in the league cup.

The outstanding progression of the club continued in the 2016/2017 season with the 1st team finishing 8th in only their 2nd season in the Premier Division of the Toolstation Western League and again finishing runners up in the Les Phillips Cup, whilst the Reserve team won both the Bristol Premier Combination League and the League Cup.

Our Sunday team finished runners up in both the Premier Division of the Bristol Regional League and the Gilbert Pullin Trophy. Finally, the U18's (*after a play off*) finished runners up in the Central Division of the Bristol Combination league and won the League Cup.

In the 2017/2018 season the 1st team finished 11th, 2nds were runners up, 3rds mid table and the 4th team finished 4th place. The under 18s finished 3rd and the Sunday team once again finished in runners up in the Bristol Regional League.

The last completed football season prior to the pandemic, saw the 1st XI finish eighth in the Toolstation and secured silverware by winning the GFA Challenge Trophy in 2018/2019. In the same season, our 2nd XI secured an unprecedented treble of the Bristol Premier Combination League, League Cup and GFA Senior Amateur Cup. The 3rd XI continued to make progress and started the curtailed the 2020/2021 in the Bristol Premier Combination Division One.

In 2021/2022, our current manager, Richard Luffman, led the 1st XI to their highest ever Step 5 finish as we secured 4th position in the Hellenic League Premier Division following a lateral move from the Western League. He also delivered silverware as we defeated Hereford Pegasus in the League Cup.

With our excellent junior section (Shire Colts/Shire-Cribbs) also continuing to thrive, we are hope the progression of the football club continues for many years to come.

The club is well known for the tremendous facilities. Bristol Rovers used the ground as their training base for many years prior to their recent move up the A38 to their new facility in Hortham. The England Under 21 side then managed by Peter Taylor trained at the ground in 1997 and played a warm-up match against a Cribbs FC (then AXA) side prior to their game with Italy. There have also been two games televised on Sky Sports Soccer AM programme between Cribbs FC (then AXA) teams & celebrity sides.

THE ISUZU FA VASE, SECOND QUALIFYING ROUND TUFFLEY ROVERS 1-1 FLEET SPURS Tuffley Rovers win 4-2 on penalties SATURDAY, 24 SEPTEMBER 2022

This was a repeat, at the same stage of the competition, of a fixture played one year less a day earlier, in which the Wessex League visitors had acquitted themselves well but were still on the wrong end of a 2-3 scoreline.

The Spurs had endured a torrid time in their initial season in the Wessex League (2021-22), finishing in 18th position in Division One but earning a reprieve from relegation. Things didn't improve at the start of 2022-23, so they arrived in Gloucester still seeking their first league point after seven successive defeats in which they had conceded twenty-four goals. Their hosts had made a decent start to a new campaign, picking up eight points from seven matches. Although Rovers play one level higher than Fleet, memories of last season's encounter suggested that this would be another tight cup-tie.

This was an interesting game to witness. Despite Tuffley playing at a higher level than Fleet, there was no real sign of the porous defending which had seen the Hampshire club leak so many goals in their opening league matches this season. There were times when the hosts looked to be in the ascendancy, particularly in the closing stages of the first half, but Fleet's defending was disciplined and determined as Rovers tried to cancel out the lead which the visitors had taken just before the half-time interval

The match kicked off nearly an hour late because of a very delayed journey which the Spurs had undertaken. The opening exchanges suggested that the two teams were pretty evenly-matched, with both teams winning early corners and both goalkeepers called upon to make fairly routine saves. Jack Beardsell was an enthusiastic and willing runner down the right-hand channel and across the other side of the field Ryan Goddard was doing much the same thing for the visitors.

Nearing the mid-point of the first half, when a corner was blocked and fell loose in the box, Ashley Davies struck a ferocious shot against the Fleet crossbar and shortly afterwards Beardsell's shot was clutched gratefully by Fleet keeper Joe Hill. Down at the open end a free-kick by Larry Biggs was deflected and Eliot Jones had to twist and stretch his fingers to their utmost limit to flick the ball up and over the crossbar.

The hosts' pressure was slowly mounting. Henry Birkett's inviting cross from the right was headed goalwards by Beardsell but even this close-range effort did not go in thanks to heroic defending. Then a sumptuous pass by Ryan Dobbins sent Beardsell clear on goal but he could only drag his shot wide from a really favourable position. A minute or two later the same player clattered into the Fleet goalkeeper but the referee did not deem that it had been a malicious challenge and the game restarted almost immediately.

It only takes a second to score a goal and just before the interval Harry White proved that as Fleet broke quickly and he rounded the onrushing Jones, before tucking the ball home and wheeling away in celebration. It was hard on the hosts who had just had a good period themselves, but for all their attacking superiority Rovers went in one down at the break.

Soon after play resumed Davies was clattered by Nick Holmes and the two players squared up to each other but it was goalscorer White who received a caution for delaying the restart. Then home 'keeper Jones was injured in a bizarre incident after a speculative shot had been deflected up in the air and struck the woodwork as the 'keeper desperately tried to catch the ball but instead ended up in a heap on the ground, having collided with the frame of the goal.

White was somewhat subdued after receiving his caution so it wasn't a surprise when he was replaced by Gavin Francis. Fleet also brought on Jordan Wynter.

Rovers responded by sending on the hugely-experienced Shayne Bradley and shortly afterwards Fleet's Connor Knight was cautioned for wasting an inexcusable amount of time preparing to take a throw-in.

The hosts were still knocking on the door but it just wouldn't open. Dobbins turned his defender to get a shot in but his effort went over.

Then, suddenly, the game changed in an instant. Warren Mann found space on the left, slipped his marker and his inch-perfect chip found Bradley waiting at the far post to plant an unstoppable header into the net. Time was nearly up and this critical moment by two of the most experienced players on the pitch was greeted with enthusiasm on and off the playing surface.

The clock ran down without another serious chance being created at either end although there was enough time for Mann to incur the referee's wrath, for a foul deep in Spurs' territory, and receive a vellow card

So, to penalties. Tuffley's first spot-kick, from Bradley, was saved but Fleet's second and fourth soared high in the general direction of the city-centre. Mann, Beardsell and Dobbins held their nerve to tuck their kicks away before it was left to a Rovers' substitute, Kieran Squires, to drive a neat left-footed shot into the net and ensure Tuffley's progression into the next round of the Vase.

Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a competitive fixture at Glevum Park back in February saw us push one of the title challengers all the way, before they scored a late, late winner to deny Rovers a crucial point....

MATCH REPORT: UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 0-1 CRIBBS SATURDAY, 26 FEBRUARY 2022



Cribbs FC was one of five clubs transferred to the Hellenic League's Premier Division after playing in the truncated 2020-21 season in the Western League's top division. Their record when that season was cut short was seven wins and two draws from twelve matches, an identical record to the team Tuffley Rovers had played just seven days earlier, Westbury United. Only Bradford Town from this formerly Western League quintet had a better record than Cribbs when the latter arrived in Gloucestershire

for what would be Rovers' penultimate home league match of the season.

The club based in the Bristol suburb of Henbury had made an impressive start to life in the Hellenic because only Westbury, Corsham, Malvern, Bradford and League-leaders Bishops Cleeve had gathered more away points than Cribbs, whose nine victories on the road included a 5-4 success at Malvern and a 5-0 win at Shrivenham as well as a 4-3 loss at Cleeve, against whom they had also scored three times in their home fixture.

So Cribbs, one-time league-leaders themselves early in the season, arrived at Glevum Park in good form having only failed to score in three of their thirty-three league matches so far and, ominously for Rovers, those blanks had all come in home fixtures. Only the division's Top Two had scored more times than Cribbs; only Calne had scored fewer goals than Tuffley.

As it was, a late, deflected goal cruelly deprived Rovers of a point which they would have richly deserved for a defiant and disciplined defensive display against in-form Cribbs, whose narrow victory kept them in touch with the clubs who will contest the end-of-season play-offs.

The sun was shining weakly on a chilly afternoon in Gloucester as visitors Cribbs got the match under way kicking up the slope towards the end of the ground where the dressing-rooms are situated.

It was the hosts who nearly took an early lead after Aaron Basford had been fouled on the left. Sammie Hicks took the resulting free-kick which was fumbled by Aaron Greatbanks in the visitors' goal and he was fortunate that no Tuffley forward was following up to pounce on the rebound.

When Cribbs had their first serious attack down the right Steve Murray passed to George Kellow whose shot was saved at the expense of a corner.

Tuffley's Dominik Kent was injured midway inside the Cribbs half but was able to continue after receiving treatment on the pitch.

The wind was making it difficult for both teams to pass the ball accurately but despite this disadvantage Harri John and Ashley Bird combined to set Joe Shutt free on the right. Shutt retained the ball for several seconds before dancing past a defender and getting a cross in but Hicks, finding space beyond the far post, was unable to get a clean shot away.



The play was becoming rather scrappy until the closing moments of the first period when Kellow found himself running clear on goal and rounded Jack Copland in the home goal only to then inexplicably miss the target completely with the goal gaping in front of him. Then when Tuffley won another free-kick on the left, again taken by Hicks, Greatbanks punched the ball away to safety.

In the second half referee Nat Wormleighton's yellow card seemed to spend more time being waved in the air than in his pocket. Josh Bennett was cautioned for bringing down Kent with an over-zealous challenge before Jack Beardsell received the same punishment for the latest of a number of fouls he had committed. Not long after this incident Ryan Cainey was also booked for a foul on Bird. The same fate befell Shutt for fouling Nick Jones and his team-mate Warren Mann would also be later cautioned for foul play.





Cribbs brought on Charlie Dashfield and Bevan Cross and would also bring on Javier Biazquez for Bennett. Rovers' response was to send on Tomos Shyamapant who had been scoring goals for fun in their Under-18 team but who was unable to make much of a contribution to this match because the visiting defenders were so hard to get the better of.

The pressure from Cribbs was growing with Rovers only making occasional forays into their half of the field. Copland made a stupendous save from an overhead kick by Steve Murray which looked as if it was going to break the

deadlock until the young goalkeeper flew to his right to turn the ball away for a corner.

The breakthrough came inside the final five minutes. Cribbs' captain Jake Hodgson tried a speculative shot from the left-hand side of Tuffley's penalty-area and the ball was deflected up and over a goalkeeper whose handling had been faultless all afternoon; he had no chance to reach the ball after it had ricocheted up and out of his reach.

Immediately after the goal Shutt dragged a left-footed shot wide and Rovers then won a series of corners without being able to make any of them count.

Despite a number of bookings this wasn't a match which got out of the referee's control. Both teams needed the points for quite different reasons. Cribbs have now scored in eighteen successive away league matches this season but Tuffley can feel aggrieved that the gutsy way they kept Cribbs out for so long was not rewarded with at least a point, the point which would have virtually guaranteed their safety.


