EDITOR'S COMMENT



Welcome to everyone visiting Glevum Park this evening for the visit of our friends from Fairford Town. I would like to welcome all their players, supporters and officials to our home.

The last few games have been slightly disappointing, in part because at least two were games I'd hoped we would win; the other because the scoreline didn't entirely reflect the game (even if we didn't necessarily deserve anything from the game). Muzzy has reflected on that, so I'll end my thoughts there.

Disappointment is a word I'd use to sum up our last game against tonight's visitors. We were very much in the game and when Fairford found themselves down to ten-men (and temporarily down to nine, after former Rover Aaron Basford was sin-binned) we should have pushed on to earn at least a point. Instead, we lost our discipline and our hosts exploited that fully, so that we were on the wrong end of a 4-1 score. They have some potent strikers – not least another two former Rovers, in Ross Langworthy and Jamal Lawrence – and we cannot afford to give them chances, like we did on that evening.

Looking at the provisional squad list sent through to me for the programme, we will face a number of our former players this evening, including the opposition manager Jamie Reid, and I think they have nine players currently registered who were once with Tuffley Rovers. In addition, Rich Cox – our former manager – will be in the dugout this evening, as part of the Fairford coaching staff, so there are plenty of familiar faces here tonight.

I think this is Coxy's first trip to Glevum Park since his departure from the role of first team manager and I'd like to offer him a warm welcome. We had some good times during his spell with the club, but unfortunately when he stepped up into the managerial role things didn't quite work out. There were some really good results but we eventually found ourselves on a dreadful run of form and Coxy did the honourable thing of stepping aside to see if someone else could turn things around.

Muzzy has done a really positive rebuilding job since coming into the role and can hopefully continue that trend, even if some recent results haven't been what we (or he) would look for. We have a run of games at Glevum Park coming up, so we should have plenty of opportunities to use home advantage to spur us on.

Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to read this. I hope everyone enjoys the game. Safe travels home.



Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).







UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION
HARTPURY UNIVERSITY 1-0 TUFFLEY ROVERS
SATURDAY, 22 OCTOBER 2022
(ATT: 67)

The opportunity to equal their best ever run in the FA Vase was not enticing enough for Tuffley Rovers' squad, as they succumbed to a disappointing 1-0 defeat away at Hellenic League Division One side Hartpury University.

A midweek defeat at Worcester Raiders was not the ideal preparation for any game, but Rovers had shown enough fight and spirit, despite the scoreline, for manager Neil Mustoe to believe his side were capable of seeing off the students of Hartpury, and he would no doubt have been even more confident when he was able to welcome back the experienced Ashley Davies to the starting line-up and to have Warren Mann back, albeit only fit enough for a place amongst the substitutes'. Mason Lewis was selected to start after two impressive appearances from the bench, joining Jack Beardsell in starting, with Kieran Alder cup-tied and Joey Haswell back with parent club Cinderford Town.

Unfortunately for the Rovers boss, his side produced a limp first-half display that was ultimately their downfall against a highly energetic side, who used an excellent playing surface to exhibit a technically proficient performance, allied to a determination and resilience that belied their years.

From the outset, the student side showed composure on the ball and a calmness in possession that a far more experienced Rovers side failed to match. Not for the first time this season, Ryan Dobbins found himself isolated in Rovers attacks, making Alder's absence all the more noticeable, and when his side did hold onto the ball, which was all too rare for the Rovers support, they failed to turn that possession into a clear attacking threat.

By contrast, the hosts were attacking with pace and in numbers, making good use of a healthy share of possession to stretch Mustoe's side, and although they created few clear chances they looked the most likely team to score.

Twice in the opening minutes, Hartpury had sight on goal and although Morgan Mahoney and then Josh Radford both put their efforts high and wide, respectively, it was a warning to Mustoe's side. In the 8th minute, Elliot Jones was into action for the first time, as he had to get down low to turn Luca Robinson's free-kick away from goal.



When the hosts did open the scoring, in the 19th minute, it was not against the run of play and also summed up Rovers' performance up to that point, as three claret and blue players might have done better to avoid the goal.

Davies got under Alfie Toland's long ball upfield, leaving Macaulay Herbert one-on-one but too far away from his Mahoney, who had been the target of the long pass. When Mahoney then unleashed a low, fizzing drive from 18 yards out Elliot Jones, who had been in sensational form during the heavy midweek defeat, will probably feel he might have done better, as the ball went through an area close to him and into the net.

If Mustoe had hoped going behind would spur his side into action, Rovers were sloppy in possession and they had to be grateful to right-back Paul Azubilla on 33 minutes, as he made a superb last-ditch tackle to deny Radford what seemed like a certain goal. From the resultant corner a training ground move created space for Josh Beadle, but his shot went over Jones' bar.

Lewis was Rovers' best outlet, giving Toland a torrid time in defence, and he almost conjured a chance on 34 minutes, after bursting onto Dom Kent's path inside the full-back, but Laiith Fairnie got in between the cross and Dobbins' run to deny an opportunity. Three minutes later, he beat his marker again and the ball fired across the goal was only inches away from Dobbins' attempt to divert it home.

When half-time arrived Mustoe's side were behind and without a shot on goal, despite an improvement late in the first period.

There were signs of a more attacking intent at the start of the second period and Lewis twice had efforts on goal in the opening nine minutes of the half, although neither troubled Hartpury's keeper Stephen Sarkodie, before Herbert headed wide from a corner when he'd found a little space. Jones then made a comfortable save from Ben Baxter's effort as Hartpury came forward again.

On 58 minutes Mustoe replaced Kent with the returning Mann, with Rovers' most experienced player pushed into an attacking role that he has featured in many times in recent years, although less so in the past two seasons.

Davies and Herbert were now commanding in the Rovers defence, repelling almost any Hartpury attack, with Azubilla and left-back Kieran Squires also playing their part in keeping the hosts at bay. Mustoe sacrificed some of the defensive reliability to push Davies into midfield, where his side had been second best, and the elder statesman of the side picked up a caution moments later when Radford on his knees with a robust challenge as Hartpury launched an attack. Davies' response was to berate his teammates who had failed to sufficiently press the ball in the build-up to the move and few could have argued that the ticking-off was anything other than justifiable.

That caution aside, the move appear to work to good effect, with Davies becoming the driving force in the centre of the pitch, and they almost found their way back into the game on 75 minutes, as Beardsell drilled a cross across the six-yard box but, once again, marginally out of the reach of Dobbins, whose stretch was not quite enough and the ball ran away and out of play.



Lewis then hammered another shot high and wide of the goal and the game became more open, albeit without any clear chances for either side.

Mustoe then introduced veteran striker Shayne Bradley, with 14 minutes remaining, and with Mann now becoming increasingly influential in his wide attacking role, hope remained that his side might find a way back into the tie. Bradley had one headed effort, from a corner, that went narrowly wide but for all their efforts in the second period, Rovers failed to find a way back into the game and exited the FA Vase against a Hartpury side who deservedly took their place in the next round.



A first visit to the magnificent Sixways Stadium will be a treat for most Hellenic League Premier Division sides this season, but that is where the joy ended for Tuffley Rovers in this midweek clash, as Neil Mustoe's side ended up on the wrong end of a five goal reverse, against a team who showed quality in the attacking third that surpassed anything the visiting side had faced during the season to date.

Already deprived of Warren Mann, who was recovering from a concussion, Mustoe was also without the experienced Ashley Davies and had to include Macaulay Herbert in a three-man defence, despite the player struggling to recover from a bout of food poisoning.

Mann and Davies' absence prompted recalls for Dan Lander, who was back after an injury lay-off, and Callum McGuirk; whilst Dan Beasley was only fit enough for a place on the bench and saw his place taken by Ryan Dobbins, who had been unavailable for the weekend draw with Shrivenham.



With five minutes of the game starting, Rovers trailed. After a failure to clear the ball upfield, Raiders' Cooper latched onto the loose ball, rolling it into the feet of Jordan Murphy, who turned Kieran Squires with ease, before firing a low shot beyond Elliot Jones and into the corner of the net.

Jones was helpless to prevent Murphy's effort from finding the net, but he made a terrific save to deny Stratford, who curled a shot goalwards from 20 yards after 12 minutes.

Rovers were defending resolutely as the half continued but lost Herbert on 26 minutes, as he succumbed to the illness that had dogged him during the week. He was replaced by George Driver-Dickerson, who was making a first appearance in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Shortly after, as Raiders continued to press Rovers back, Timmins saw his header from a corner pushed away from goal by Jones, who was already proving to be a more than adequate last line of defence. He reinforced that status with another excellent save from Timmins, who once again found enough time and space to hammer a goal bound shot from 25 yards.

As the half drew to a close there was one final effort from Murphy, whose beautifully flighted free-kick from the edge of the Rovers penalty area cannoned back off the bar and away to safety.

Mustoe introduced Mason Lewis for Dominik Kent at the interval, but the game continued as it had before the interval, with Jones proving Rovers' saviour as he denied Murphy, before Raiders' substitute, Silva, screwed a good chance wide of the goal.

Rovers' substitute, Lewis, was already proving a handful for the Raiders defence and might have levelled the scores after bursting through the hosts' defensive line, but keeper Young was alert to the danger and dived in front of the wide-man and diverted the ball away from goal.

Murphy then drew a sensational save from Jones, who dived in the air and turned the ball over the bar whilst at full-stretch.



Chances came and went for the hosts but Rovers appeared to be remaining resolute, only for the game plan to be undone in the space of 180 seconds. First Silva found himself with a simple tap-in after Shay Willock's cross had created a chance for Murphy that was initially blocked, before falling into Silva's path; then Willock turned scorer, as he

powered his way through a series of challenges before poking a shot beyond Jones and into the net.

With 8 minutes remaining, Rovers' Paul Azubilla was adjudged to have fouled Silva, although the Rovers man was convinced he had not, and Murphy made it 4-0 as he poked home the loose ball from a yard out. Five minutes later, another call went Raiders' way and debutant Driver-Dickerson was sin-binned for his protests.

Moments later, Squires produced an excellent block to deny a Raiders attack, before the follow-up saw Cooper strike a shot that deflected off Henry Birkett, an looped past Jones, whose desperate attempt to recover and push the ball away ended too late, as the ball was adjudged to have already crossed the line.

A 5-0 reverse was hard on Rovers, in one sense, but had it not been for an inspired performance from Jones, the damage could have been much worse on a night to forget for Mustoe's men.

FAIRFORD TOWN HISTORY:

Fairford Town Football Club is a football club based in Fairford, Gloucestershire, England. Affiliated to the Gloucestershire County Football Association, they are currently members of the Hellenic League Premier Division and play at Cinder Lane.

The club was established in 1891 and prior to World War II they played in the Cirencester and District League. After the war they switched to the Swindon & District League, going on to win the Premier Division title and Advertiser Cup double in both 1964–65 and 1968–69. In 1970 the club moved up to Division One of the Hellenic League. In their first season in the league, the club finished third, missing out on promotion on goal average, also losing in the Division One Cup final. The following season they were placed in Division One A as league expansion led to there being two Division Ones. The club went on to win the title and the Division One Challenge Shield, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

At the end of the 1973–74 season Fairford were relegated to Division One. However, after finishing as Division One runners-up in 1975–76, they were promoted back to the Premier Division. They finished as runners-up in 1978–79, also winning the Premier Division Cup. They were runners-up again the following season, which also saw them win the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy. The club finished as Premier Division runners-up for a third time in 1990–91 and won the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy again in 1998–99. They remained in the Premier Division until finishing second-from-bottom of the division in 2011–12 season,

after which they were relegated to Division One West. In 2016–17 the club won Division One West, earning promotion back to the Premier Division.

Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a competitive fixture at Glevum Park back in January, we were on a poor run of form, and a side managed by Rich Cox succumbed to a narrow defeat courtesy of a goal that separated the two sides in a very tight game....

Fairford's wins over Lydney and Hallen, ten and six days earlier, had moved them first above then five points clear of the Gloucester club. The worry for Tuffley Rovers was that if their own miserable run of form continued other clubs might also leapfrog them in the table. Apart from winning at Lydney, this Town had also picked up three points at Thornbury and Chipping Sodbury, in addition to getting a valuable point at both Malvern and Westbury. So, Rovers' home record, with just two victories from seven matches, looked as if it would again come under considerable pressure.

This was not a match for the purist. Tuffley suffered an eighth consecutive defeat while Fairford continued their recent good form with a 1-0 victory thanks to a second-half strike from Connor Jakeways. This result leaves Rovers looking nervously over their shoulders at the three clubs immediately below them, one of whom they play in their next fixture. Town's three league victories in eleven days move them up into 12th place in what is quite a congested middle third of the Hellenic Premier Division table.

Rovers have only scored in three of their last seven league matches and one of those was an own goal. That they failed to give visiting goalkeeper Sam Ayres a busier evening is indicative of their recent difficulties. Although the team often looks solid defensively, they just aren't creating enough chances at the other end of the pitch.

Yet, despite the way the evening panned out, the early signs were promising for the hosts with an immediate attacking intent; Liam Wright went on a strong run down the left in the opening minute and a minute later the debutant full-back on the other flank, Will Ramsey, did much the same in exchanging passes with Brennan Denness-Barrett before firing in a cross which was cleared.

George Peare and Ross Langworthy were prominent for the visitors in the early stages with both having shots which cleared the crossbar, before another Langworthy shot was comfortably claimed by Jack Copland. Giving the ball away cheaply nearly proved to be Rovers' undoing but Langworthy could only drag his shot wide of Copland's left-hand post after running down the left channel towards goal.

Neither goalkeeper had been seriously tested in a somewhat tame first played in chilly and windy conditions, with persistent rather than heavy rain driving across the pitch from south to north.

With ten minutes of the second period gone Aaron Basford finally forced Ayres into some action with a low shot which the goalkeeper pushed away for a corner. Only a minute later Fairford took the lead when Jakeways steered a cross from the right away from Copland's right-hand side and into the bottom corner of the net.

Immediately after the goal Archie Brennan was cautioned for a foul on Dominik Kent, at which point Rovers brought on Scott Jordan for the industrious Demilade Yussuf, who again had a useful outing in the first team. Jordan had only been on the pitch for three minutes when he collided with the Fairford goalkeeper. It seemed accidental but the Tuffley man was given a yellow card anyway by referee Joe Kidd.

With former Fairford Town man Jack Beardsell coming on for Joe Shutt, to give Rovers another option in attack, his former club responded by bringing on Ian Herring for Jamie Reid and Dan Bailey for Tom Golledge. An injury to Town's right-back Callum Preece, who had had a good match, saw Biag Mazzotta come on for the closing minutes.

As the match entered added time Fairford substitute Herring became the third player to be cautioned by the referee and although it wasn't clear exactly what had happened Tuffley's Wright appeared to suffer the same fate.

Despite some late huffing and puffing from the hosts, Town held on to their lead fairly comfortably because Rovers continued to find it difficult to create any serious chances and this has now become a major cause for concern because although their midfield players worked hard they just weren't giving enough service to their forwards. Fairford, by contrast, have had three good wins in the closing days of November without conceding a single goal and they can now look forward to a December programme which gives them home fixtures on the first three Saturdays of that month and the opportunity to continue their climb up the table.

For Rovers there is the increasing concern of where their next point is coming from but, when that happens, there is no reason why they can't go on a decent run of their own because their squad certainly contains players with enough quality and ability to do just that.
