# EDITOR'S COMMENT



Welcome to everyone visiting Glevum Park this afternoon for the visit of Roman Glass St George. I would like to welcome all their players, supporters and officials to our home.

Defeats are possibly like buses. You hope not to have to experience them, but at some stage they inevitably become a part of life!

We've had a few games without a win and it is now only one point in the last five league games, but it also feels like our performances have deserved much better than that. The thumping defeat at Worcester Raiders aside, we could arguably have taken points from all the other games (including Cribbs) but we have mustered a single point against Shirvenham as our only reward. The important thing now, in my opinion, is that the lads remain positive and I am sure points will quickly follow. However, as Muzzy says in his note, this is a league where it appears any team can win against any other, on their day, so we have to make sure we steal points when not playing well and accumulate them when on form.

The pitch is also recovering well, despite the lack of grass in a few places. The last two years have been a real challenge for us, starting with a pitch that resembled a bog, then the installation of a new drainage system...and then a drought that put us ten steps back in the development of the playing surface. There is a little way to go but things are improving day by day after the works undertaken at the start of this season. If the pitch and the results both improve in tandem the future could be very bright!

#### Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17<sup>th</sup>. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10<sup>th</sup> placed finishes, before a 15<sup>th</sup> place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).





#### UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 2-4 FAIRFORD TOWN TUESDAY, 25 OCTOBER 2022 (ATT: 127)

Tuffley Rovers' home form was almost as worrying as it had been in the previous season, with Fairford Town travelling across the county to meet a home team which had only taken four points from the twelve that had been available from their opening four league fixtures at Glevum Park.



Even allowing for the fact that their two home defeats had come against the clubs sitting first and second in the table, the trend of not winning home matches badly needed fixing. Fairford had been beaten in four of their six away fixtures so far and only Hereford Pegasus, Lydney Town, Wantage Town and Chipping Sodbury Town had conceded more goals on their travels, so those statistics might give Rovers some hope that this would be the evening on which their fortunes would change when it came to picking up home points.

Rovers' home woes continued, but Fairford's away figures look a lot better after a stunning second-half comeback in which they turned an interval deficit into a comfortable two-goal victory which moved them into the top half of the table level on 17 points with two other clubs but ahead of them both on goal-difference.

Archie Brennan got the game in motion for Fairford at the kick-off and the visitors were the first to show any attacking intent when full-back Callum Preece's cross from the right flashed across the goalmouth with Ross Langworthy just failing to reach it as he dived forward to try to meet the ball and deflect it into goal. Three minutes later and following a corner on the left the other full-back, Kyle Parker, had a shot which home goalkeeper Elliot Jones saved.

Langworthy had a shot blocked and from a right-wing corner taken by Rowan Doyle a header came in which was blocked and scrambled clear by the Rovers defence.



On twenty minutes Warren Mann was fouled on the left, which caused a yellow card to be shown to the offender (Brennan). Henry Birkett's resulting free-kick was sent towards the far post, where Ryan Dobbins had escaped his marker to deflect the ball into the bottom corner of the net being guarded by Joe Wright.

Although Fairford were seeing more of the ball, Rovers were looking to add to their lead and it nearly happened when Dobbins sent Daniel Beasley away down the right but the shot, although well-hit, was gobbled up by Wright.

Town's Josh Bryan was treated on the pitch after being injured and in the closing minutes of the first half the visitors were given a free-kick on the left mid-way inside their own half after Langworthy had been fouled. It was launched deep into the

Rovers half and resulted in another free-kick being awarded about 35 yards out. As the ball reached the Rovers' six-yard box Jones made a decision to come out and punch the ball to safety, a tactic he employed quite a few times on this cold evening on a pitch which was still showing the after-effects of the heavy rain at the weekend.

Whatever was said at half-time certainly galvanized the visitors because within ten minutes of the re-start they had not only wiped out Tuffley's fragile lead but gone ahead themselves. Brad Bevan and George Peare were the beneficiaries of some lacklustre defending by the hosts. Peare then watched a shot fly over the bar as Fairford started to take control of the game.

Numerous changes were made during the third quarter of the match. For Rovers, Paul Azubilla's evening ended when he was escorted off after being injured and Dominik Kent came on to replace him. Shayne Bradley came on for Luke Hawkins not long after. The changes made by Fairford were more productive with Jay Simpson and Danny Gudger coming on for Doyle and Peare. Shortly before those changes were made, Beasley missed a great chance to equalise when he headed Warren Mann's cross narrowly wide.

Home pressure was mounting, however. Beasley escaped his marker and made a strong run down the Fairford right-hand side. His fierce cross was slashed into his own net by the unfortunate Parker. There were fifteen minutes left and there was hope that the hosts could amass some points.

Mason Lewis came on for Dobbins and was almost immediately through on goal, only to be scythed

down by goalkeeper Wright, who was relieved to see that a flag had been raised by the assistant referee for offside.

A few minutes later and Fairford were ahead again. Gudger raced away down the right and caused chaos by sending a firm cross into the middle, which forced Jones to make a good stop but the ball ran kindly for ex-Rover Langworthy and he prodded the ball into an unguarded part of the net.

Rovers nearly hit back quickly but Wright denied Beasley at the expense of a corner.

In added-time Town's victory was sealed when Gudger was again the creator down the right and this time his cross was steered home by his fellow-substitute Simpson.

Fairford deserved to win this match because they were unlucky to be behind at the interval but really upped their game after it. Substitutions can be crucial and Town's were more successful in that both Gudger and Simpson were key to their team's turnaround in the closing stages of the match.

Rovers have two more home matches in the coming days. With this latest defeat they badly need to start picking up points again <u>very</u> quickly.

# On (or around) this day in history...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had a few games on 27 October (and a couple on the dates either side) that we have selected to reflect on our fortunes on this this particular date...

#### 27 October 2007

A Rob Cook goal wasn't enough to save Tuffley Rovers from a third defeat consecutive defeat in the Gloucestershire County League, as they came away from Highridge United on the wrong end of a 3-1 defeat. The hosts took the lead on twelve minutes, with a Mitch Kavanagh strike, but Cook levelled two minutes after the break for Rovers.

Despite parity at half-time, Mickey Adams restored United's lead on sixty-three minutes and Dean Maggs rounded the scoring off six minutes later.

#### 27 October 2012



On a bitterly cold day at Hanham Athletic, with a very strong wind inhibiting both teams, Tuffley Rovers and their hosts played out a dour affair where the conditions were almost the winner. The home side defended well but lacked any penetration up front, which was borne out by the fact that they only managed two attempts on goal in the ninety minutes.

League leaders Tuffley Rovers did have the better of the possession but also failed to break through a very stubborn home defence until the thirty-seventh minute when Warren Mann got in behind the defensive line and was free down the right, before pulling the ball back to the edge of the box where Mark Ford struck a first time effort that took a slight deflection off a Hanham defender and into the net.

Hanham had a great chance to level on fifty-nine minutes, when a corner from the right was well met by Jack Tottle but his header went over the bar. Further chances were to come Rovers' way, but Mark Wallington and James Cox spurned their opportunities to extend the winning margin.

#### 28 October 2017

Tuffley Rovers finally recorded a long overdue victory, after five games without a win and only one three-point haul in their last nine Uhlsport Hellenic League, Premier Division games, as a Shayne Bradley goal proved enough to enable them to move above their opposition, into twelfth place in the division.

Rovers were grateful to keeper Eric Edge early on, as he did well to hold onto a Jake Nicholls free kick, with the Woodley skipper tried to bend his effort into the bottom corner of the net.

Despite the scare, Rovers deservedly took the lead three minutes later, as Bradley produced a guided header beyond Reed and in beyond the far post, on 17 minutes, from another excellent cross from Mann. That ultimately proved to be the decisive moment and Woodley's frustrations eventually spilled over, after Mann was penalised for a foul on Barley that saw both players fall to the floor, before the visiting defender leapt to his feet to viciously kick the prostrate Rovers player and was instantly dismissed from the field of play!

#### 27 October 2018

Despite playing against ten men for twenty-five minutes, Tuffley Rovers contrived to lose against bottom of the table Shrivenham, on Saturday, extending their run of defeats to four games in the process. Rovers took a deserved lead on fifty minutes, as Lee Smith held off his marker, before spinning the ball into the path of Dom Kent, who bent a shot around Lawrence, who had got caught in no-man's land, after he started to rush out to meet Smith's pass. Danny Hale was then dismissed after picking up two yellow cards for fairly crude challenges and it appeared that the game was their for the taking.

Petrie equalised for the hosts with fourteen minutes to play and the same player found himself through on goal in the closing moments of the game, only to be felled by Luke Merchant and a penalty award followed. Merchant looked to have done what was needed, as he saved Josh Morse's spot-kick, but the ball fell loose to substitute Sean McKeown, who smashed the rebound home from close range and Rovers lost for a fourth game in a row.

#### 26 October 2021

Tuffley Rovers produced a display full of resilience, tenacity and opportunism to record a memorable win away at Westfields; a side who hadn't previously lost a home Hellenic League side since joining the competition at the start of the 2019/20 season.

Goalkeeper Jack Copland kept Rovers in the game with some excellent saves and handling during the first period and although Westfields dominated possession and held a territorial advantage throughout the second period, to the extent that the half was akin to a siege on their goal, the game was to take a decisive twist on 85 minutes, as Rich Cox's side produced the decisive moment in the game.

After successfully defending a succession of set-pieces, Rovers broke and Jamal Lawrence latched onto substitute Sam Mendes' through ball, used all his experience to hold off a challenge and then hammered a rising shot beyond Ian Havard and into the roof of the Westfields net to secure a memorable win for Rovers in the dying moments.

#### **ROMAN GLASS ST GEORGE CLUB HISTORY**

The club Roman Glass St George is the result of an amalgamation between Bristol St George and Roman Glass. Bristol St George was formed in 1882 and is the oldest club in Bristol. They were founder members of the GFA in 1886 and won the GFA Senior Challenge Cup on two occasions 1894 and 1895, beating Eastville Rovers 3-1 on the first occasion.

The club also entered the FA Cup in 1891 and the inaugural FA Amateur Cup in 1894. The current ground at Bell Hill was opened with a match between a Bristol & District XI and the English champions Aston Villa in 1894. In 1897 the club turned professional and spent two seasons in the Birmingham & District League. The club reverted to amateur status in 1901 and continued that way until joining the Western League in 1928. In 1935 after struggling financially they dropped out and joined the Bristol & District League once again. They won the first division only once in 1949/50 but were always a leading team until they became founder members of the Bristol Premier Combination in 1957. St George played in this league winning it five seasons in succession from 1963/64 season to 1967/68 until they joined the Gloucestershire County League on its formation in 1968.

The Sixties was the Golden era for the club as in addition to winning these league titles they also managed to win the Gloucestershire Senior Amateur Cup five times, which included four successive seasons. Success was also found in the FA Amateur Cup when they regularly took on the top amateur clubs in the Country such as Hendon, Dagenham, Hayes and Leytonstone in front of crowds numbering thousands. St George won the County league in 1969/70 and was runners-up twice before a gradual decline in fortunes until in 1987 the club were expelled from the league due to sub-standard facilities. A return to the Premier Combination saw a brief improvement resulting in winning the Premier Division in 1992/93. With no promotion gained the club nosedived and were in danger of folding when Roman Glass stepped in.

Roman Glass originated as a street team called Wyndham Wanderers in 1960 and played in the Bristol Church of England League and then joined the Bristol & District League in 1974. The club enjoyed moderate success gradually climbing the leagues and in 1980 changed its name to Roman Glass. The club began to decline until in 1990 Roger Hudd took over as manager and steered them to win the Division 4 title the club continued to improve gaining successive promotions until the amalgamation in 1995.

Roman Glass St George in the Premier Combination immediately gained success, winning promotion to the Premier Division that season and then winning that league in 1998/99 season to earn promotion to the County League. The club won the County league in 2001/02 and then season 2006/07 which resulted in

promotion to the Toolstation (Western) League, a league the club last played in, in 1935.

Following promotion to Step 5 of the pyramid Roman Glass St George FC had two seasons in the Toolstation Western League Premier Division and now, due to the restructure, compete in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

#### Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a competitive fixture at Glevum Park back in January, we went into the game off our first win in 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  months and the first in Neil Mustoe's reign as manager. Unfortunately, despite the backing from a healthy crowd in attendance the visitors proved too strong for us on that occasion ....

"One swallow does not a summer make" is an old expression. In football parlance that could be translated as "one victory does not a recovery make". Ultimately, despite a performance of spirit and enthusiasm, Rovers were unable to overcome a Roman Glass team that was far too streetwise to be picked off the way Shrivenham had been three days earlier.

Manager Neil Mustoe kept faith with the team which had started against Shrivy apart from bringing in Sam Mendes for the unavailable Ashley Davies. The visitors had already beaten Tuffley 4-1 at Almondsbury two months earlier and were looking to add to the five previous occasions this season in which they had picked up all three points in away league fixtures, one of which had been a commendable 3-1 win at Brimscombe & Thrupp in November.

Just as on Saturday, Rovers were awarded a free-kick on the right in the opening minute, but this time it did not lead to a dramatic start to the match. The opening minutes were rather frantic with the ball pinging around to all corners of the pitch. Roman Glass made some early inroads down the right, in which the speed and close ball control of Aaron Goulty was a feature and he would have plenty more to contribute as the opening half continued.

The Glass won a corner on the left but sixty seconds later Rovers had a corner on

the right after a strong run down the left by Lewis Bainbridge. Another sixty seconds later and the visitors won another corner on the left and when Lewis Leigh-Gilchrist's flag-kick came across Ciaran Greening was unchallenged as he jumped to head the ball firmly into the net before home goalkeeper Jack Copland knew what was happening.



Goulty's trickery soon won his team a free-kick just outside the penalty-area on the left. The ball was whipped in and as Copland struggled to claim it Loui Ward pounced to drive the loose ball into the roof of the net.



It would soon get even worse for the hosts. Another trip on Goulty, by Mendes, saw a spot-kick awarded but Copland chose the right way and dived low to his right to make a thrilling save from the penalty-kick. Joel White was quickest to the rebound and cleared the ball to safely as Roman Glass players closed in.

Shortly before the half-time break Rovers had a decent chance to pull a goal back but Jacob Geddes could only direct his header wide of the posts when Josh Aldridge's free-kick came in from the left.

The visitors brought on Shacquille Smith and Jake White at the start of the second half and it wasn't long before Rovers put Joe Shutt on in place of Liam Wright.

Lewis Bainbridge, who had been involved in much of Rovers' attacking play, found another opportunity to cut in from the left but fired over the crossbar and his evening was soon over when Jack Beardsell replaced him. Rovers' final throw of the substitution dice came when Jamal Lawrence came on for Joel White. There was a chance shortly after, when a delightful through-pass sent Shutt



through on goal but Ross Grimshaw came off his line quickly to block the ball.

The Glass were nowhere near as threatening as they had been in the in the first half but could still move the ball around quickly with Goulty still seeing a lot of the action. He would be involved in the final decisive act of the evening when Shutt tripped him to concede another penalty. Goulty took this one himself and drove the ball confidently past Copland's right-hand side.

Rovers won a late corner but the ball was cleared and the game was over. Was this a surprise result? Not really. The defensive deficiencies Rovers had shown in the weeks leading up to this match were again apparent, but the players worked hard and there was no shame in losing to good opponents who were strong in defence



and inventive in attack, with Goulty being their Man of the Match by a considerable margin. The Glass look very comfortable in mid-table but Tuffley know that they still have plenty to do to ensure that they are still playing in the same division next season. On a cold evening, this was a pretty decent match to watch and an excellent crowd of over a hundred for a midweek game indicated that the locals thought so too.


