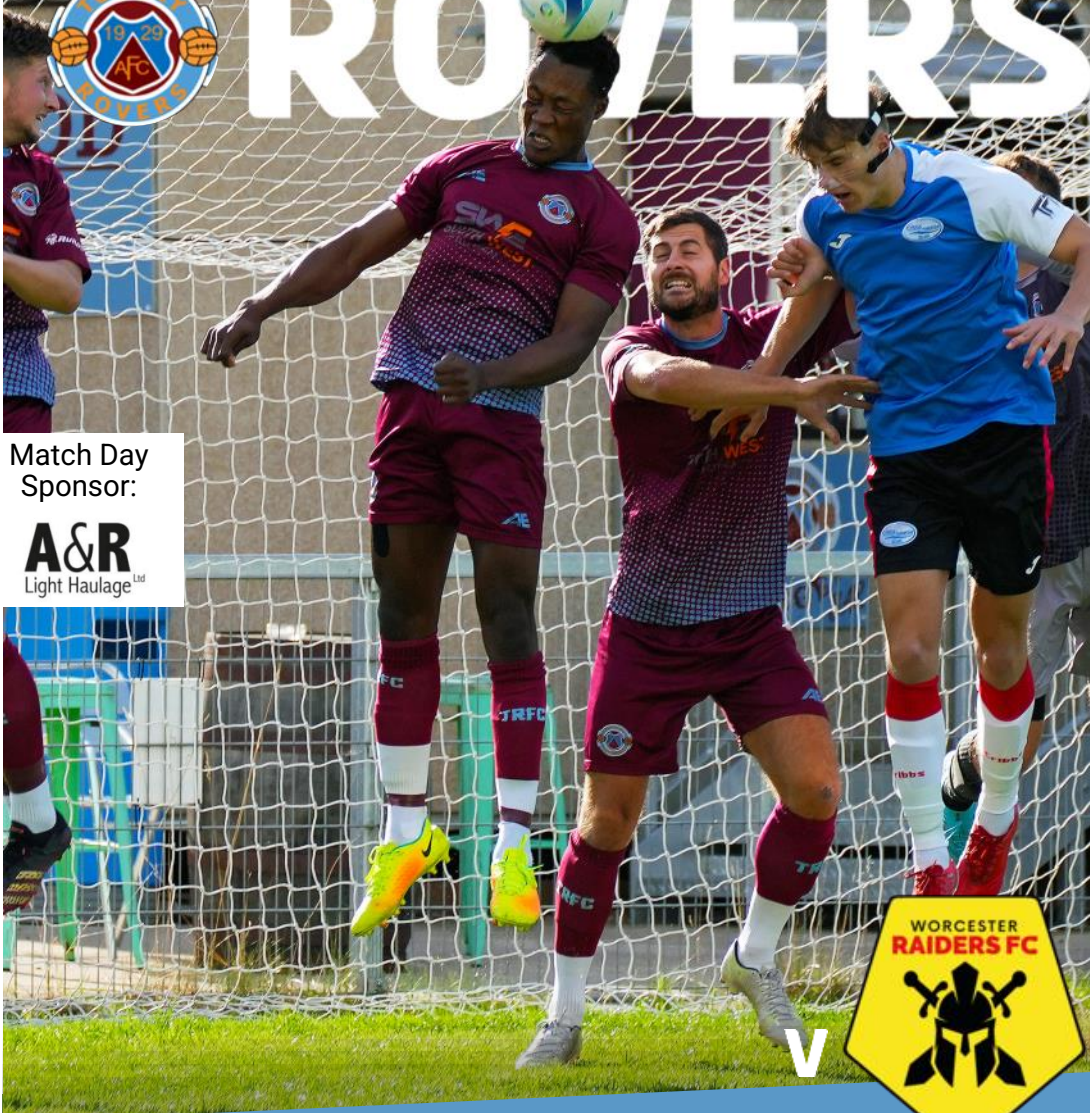
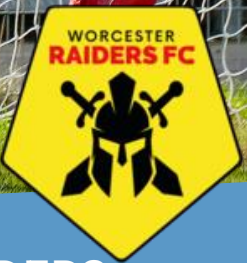

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Tuffley Rovers' home form was almost as worrying as it had been in the previous season, with Fairford Town travelling across the county to meet a home team which had only taken four points from the twelve that had been available from their opening four league fixtures at Glevum Park.



Even allowing for the fact that their two home defeats had come against the clubs sitting first and second in the table, the trend of not winning home matches badly needed fixing. Fairford had been beaten in four of their six away fixtures so far and only Hereford Pegasus, Lydney Town, Wantage Town and Chipping Sodbury Town had conceded more goals on their travels, so those statistics might give Rovers some hope that this would be the evening on which their fortunes would change when it came to picking up home points.

Rovers' home woes continued, but Fairford's away figures look a lot better after a stunning second-half comeback in which they turned an interval deficit into a comfortable two-goal victory which moved them into the top half of the table level on 17 points with two other clubs but ahead of them both on goal-difference.

Archie Brennan got the game in motion for Fairford at the kick-off and the visitors were the first to show any attacking intent when full-back Callum Preece's cross from the right flashed across the goalmouth with Ross Langworthy just failing to reach it as he dived forward to try to meet the ball and deflect it into goal. Three minutes later and following a corner on the left the other full-back, Kyle Parker, had a shot which home goalkeeper Elliot Jones saved.

Langworthy had a shot blocked and from a right-wing corner taken by Rowan Doyle a header came in which was blocked and scrambled clear by the Rovers defence.



On twenty minutes Warren Mann was fouled on the left, which caused a yellow card to be shown to the offender (Brennan). Henry Birkett's resulting free-kick was sent towards the far post, where Ryan Dobbins had escaped his marker to deflect the ball into the bottom corner of the net being guarded by Joe Wright.

Although Fairford were seeing more of the ball, Rovers were looking to add to their lead and it nearly happened when Dobbins sent Daniel Beasley away down the right but the shot, although well-hit, was gobbled up by Wright.

Town's Josh Bryan was treated on the pitch after being injured and in the closing minutes of the first half the visitors were given a free-kick on the left mid-way inside their own half after Langworthy had been fouled. It was launched deep into the

Rovers half and resulted in another free-kick being awarded about 35 yards out. As the ball reached the Rovers' six-yard box Jones made a decision to come out and punch the ball to safety, a tactic he employed quite a few times on this cold evening on a pitch which was still showing the after-effects of the heavy rain at the weekend.

Whatever was said at half-time certainly galvanized the visitors because within ten minutes of the re-start they had not only wiped out Tuffley's fragile lead but gone ahead themselves. Brad Bevan and George Peare were the beneficiaries of some lacklustre defending by the hosts. Peare then watched a shot fly over the bar as Fairford started to take control of the game.

Numerous changes were made during the third quarter of the match. For Rovers, Paul Azubilla's evening ended when he was escorted off after being injured and Dominik Kent came on to replace him. Shayne Bradley came on for Luke Hawkins not long after. The changes made by Fairford were more productive with Jay Simpson and Danny Gudger coming on for Doyle and Peare. Shortly before those changes were made, Beasley missed a great chance to equalise when he headed Warren Mann's cross narrowly wide.

Home pressure was mounting, however. Beasley escaped his marker and made a strong run down the Fairford right-hand side. His fierce cross was slashed into his own net by the unfortunate Parker. There were fifteen minutes left and there was hope that the hosts could amass some points.



Mason Lewis came on for Dobbins and was almost immediately through on goal, only to be scythed down by goalkeeper Wright, who was relieved to see that a flag had been raised by the assistant referee for offside.

A few minutes later and Fairford were ahead again. Gudger raced away down the right and caused chaos by sending a firm cross into the middle, which forced Jones to make a good stop but the ball ran kindly for ex-Rover Langworthy and he prodded the ball into an unguarded part of the net.

Rovers nearly hit back quickly but Wright denied Beasley at the expense of a corner.

In added-time Town's victory was sealed when Gudger was again the creator down the right and this time his cross was steered home by his fellow-substitute Simpson.

Fairford deserved to win this match because they were unlucky to be behind at the interval but really upped their game after it. Substitutions can be crucial and Town's were more successful in that both Gudger and Simpson were key to their team's turnaround in the closing stages of the match.

Rovers have two more home matches in the coming days. With this latest defeat they badly need to start picking up points again very quickly.

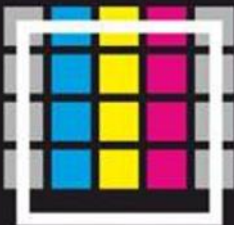

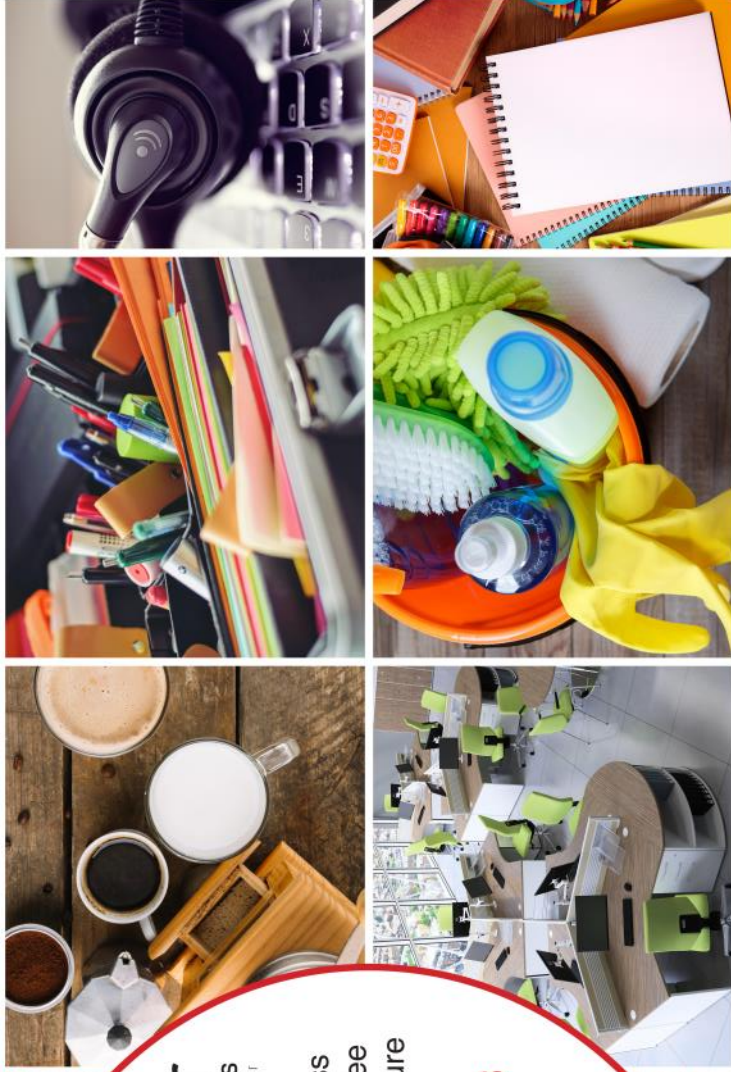

On (or around) this day in history...

The victory came despite Rovers being reduced to ten men, following the dismissal of Johnny Meadows after he collected two cautions, and took Doug Foxwell's side to their seventh win in eight league fixtures.

1 November 2014



A long trip to Plymouth Parkway in the first round of the FA Vase ended in disappointment, as Warren Evans' side left Bolito Park on the wrong end of a 4-1 scoreline that ended their participation in the 2014/15 competition.

Evans had reason to be grateful to keeper Aaron Taylor, who produced a fantastic performance to keep his side in the game, and they looked to be in with a shout when Shayne Bradley pulled

A severely depleted Tuffley Rovers side secured what could prove to be an invaluable point against high-flying Ascot United; a result they probably could not have imagined after they started the game with only two recognised defenders, thanks to injuries and unavailability, with Stu Griffith and Walt Greenwood forced into defensive roles, as Warren Evans fielded an unfamiliar starting line-up. Heroic defending from Griffith, skipper Callum Preece, Greenwood and Tristan Haswell, backed up by Aaron Taylor's efforts in goal and a highly industrious effort

with a point that was hard earned but incredibly well deserved.

Warren Mann saw a 67th minute penalty kick saved, as Rovers hunted, largely in vain, for a second goal, but James added his second scoring four minutes later, to take the game away from a spirited Clanfield side.

31 October 2020

In what proved to be their final game before the Covid pandemic once again interrupted a playing season, Tuffley Rovers produced a late comeback that first appeared to have secured them a point against fellow strugglers Ardley United, but ultimately led to a wonderful 2-1 victory as Warren Mann – who was subsequently sent-off after receiving a second caution for his celebration – netted an injury time winner.

After the hosts had taken a first-half lead through Caelan Isaac, the game appeared to be going their way until Ollie Hunt headed home Mann's free-kick with only three minutes remaining.

If Rich Cox thought Hunt's goal had secured a valuable point on the road, he was delighted to take away all three just a few minutes later, as Mann swung the ball into the goal from a wide

position in the dying moments of the game, sparking celebrations that ultimately saw him dismissed but so late in the game as to leave little time for the Oxfordshire side to take advantage of any numerical advantage.

WORCESTER RAIDERS CLUB HISTORY

Worcester Raiders were formed in 2001 as a youth club, joining the Worcester & District Football League in 2009 upon the formation of a senior side. In 2013, Worcester Raiders joined the West Midlands (Regional) League Division Two, gaining promotion in their first season in the league system.

In 2019, Worcester Raiders won Division One, gaining promotion to the Premier Division. Worcester Raiders entered the FA Vase for the first time in 2020–21. At the end of the 2020–21 season the club were transferred to Division One of the Hellenic League.

In July 2020, English Premiership Rugby Union club Worcester Warriors confirmed the club would move into Sixways Stadium. Worcester Warriors' co-owners Colin Goldring and Jason Whittingham became joint majority owners of Worcester Raiders in the process.

In the 2021–22 season, Worcester Raiders finished second behind Studley FC. Despite a 3-0 loss to Hereford Pegasus in the play-off final, but they were promoted to the Premier Division of the Hellenic League following the closure of Walton Casuals FC in the Southern League Premier (South), leading to a reprieve for Merthyr Town and Cinderford Town, and Raiders being promoted.

October 2022 is a month that Rovers' boss Neil Mustoe will largely want to forget. In the last game of a month that has seen his side secure just a single point from six Hellenic League Premier Division fixtures - as well as losing against lower division opposition in the FA Vase – his side produced a poor performance that saw them thumped 5-0 and end the afternoon in one of the two relegation places.

There is a long way to go in the season and performances in the previous two months will provide the Rovers faithful with plenty of hope, but this was a desperately poor performance against an in-form side more than capable of dismantling their opposition. An afternoon that started brightly, with Rovers equal in most areas for the first ten minutes, stuttered and then failed as some lamentable defending and a lack of cutting edge put paid to any hopes of taking at least a point.

Mustoe's plans weren't aided by the loss of Kieran Squires, who had been in terrific form prior to a concussion injury sustained in the midweek defeat against Fairford Town, and he was also without Henry Birkett, Callum McGuirk, Luke Hawkins and a host of other longer-term absentees, including Sammie Hicks and Liam Smith.

The visitors arrived at Glevum Park on a run of four consecutive wins and they comfortably made it five by the end of the afternoon. They fielded Josh Williams in their line-up, after he'd signed from Shepton Mallett earlier in the week, and he ended the day with a brace, although his first owed as much to some calamitous play from Rovers as it did to the striker's tenacity.

Roman Glass had the first chance of any note, in the 8th minute, but Owen Woodhouse's header went well wide as he met former Rover Miles Ferguson's floated cross.

Just three minutes later, Lewis Gilchrist opened the scoring. The Glass ball-player saw an initial effort from the edge of the box blocked by Macaulay Herbert, but the ball was recovered by Dominic Anderson-Gordon, whose cross was deflected into the path of Aiden Sanfelice, before being rolled into the path of Gilchrist. Herbert once again threw himself in front of the shot, from an almost identical position, but could only watch in despair as the ball took a huge deflection and went into the opposite corner of Elliot Jones' goal, to make it 1-0.



Falling behind to an unfortunate deflection is one thing. The second goal, coming less than four minutes later, perhaps summarised why Rovers find themselves in such a perilous position.

A long ball upfield was overhit and offered Williams no alternative other than to apply pressure as Ashley Davies rolled the ball back towards Jones. Davies' pass was dreadful and Jones' attempt to recover, rather than perhaps seeing the ball run out for a corner, only resulted in him gifting Williams with a goal that was a gift for any striker, let alone one making a first appearance in new colours. 2-0 after fifteen minutes wasn't necessarily an accurate representation of the game to that point, but it was a sign of Roman Glass' increasing control on the game.

Within five minutes of that goal, Rovers' skipper Warren Mann received a caution for something akin to a rugby tackle on Shaquille Smith who had, until that point, already given the left-back a fairly torrid afternoon.

As the half wore on, a couple of long distance efforts aside Rovers were defending resolutely enough to have hopes of going into the interval without any further score. As it was, almost on the stroke of half-time, Gilchrist swung a beautiful pass into the area and Williams rose highest to produce a looping header that went over Jones, who was almost on his line, and into the net, making it 3-0 and making Mustoe's half-time teamtalk a great deal harder.



As it was, the Rovers boss chose to make just one change at half-time, introducing Paul Azubilla for Mason Lewis, and re-jigging his formation in an effort to combat Glass' domination in midfield. Within 90 seconds of the re-start any plans were in tatters after Mann received his second caution for a trip on Smith, as the visitors broke but both players were well away from the ball.

Rovers had lost their captain and shortly after they lost their vice-captain, as Herbert was forced off with a hamstring injury. He was withdrawn and replaced by Dan Lander, whilst Davies was taken off, after picking up a dead leg, to be replaced by sixteen year old debutant Dayton Fallows.

On 70 minutes it became 4-0. Substitute Nathan Hughes turned Jack Beardsell inside out and was afforded what seemed like an unlimited amount of time to find his pass, rolling the ball into Anderson-Gordon, who finished from close range.

It was another substitute, Louis Ward, to finish the scoring for the afternoon, as his low shot went around the wall and into the corner of Jones' net.

Mustoe will not relish facing one of the division's form teams, Worcester Raiders, in his next fixture but will feel confident that his side will struggle to play as poorly as they did on this occasion.
