EDITOR'S COMMENT



Welcome to everyone visiting Glevum Park this afternoon for the visit of Bradford Town. I would like to welcome all their players, supporters and officials to our home.

We have an unusually early kick-off today and a few people have asked me why this is. There is, for once, a fairly easy explanation! The Hellenic League sent out advice that they would look to reschedule games to 12noon in the event of either England or Wales finishing second in their World Cup group, meaning they would have been playing at 3pm today. In an effort to be proactive – and not leave the arrangements until Wednesday morning – we made contact with Bradford Town and it was agreed that we would move the game to 12noon, in a pre-emptive strike! As it was, England won the group and Wales failed to make second place but we have maintained the earlier kick-off because that is what has been planned and arrangements were already in place.

Both sides come into today's game with their last official game a thrashing at the hands of Malvern Town – both losing by 8 goals! We had hoped to put that behind us, by picking up points in the midweek game at Royal Wootton Bassett Town, but the fog put paid to a promising start and the game ended prematurely after 34 minutes with visibility limited to a few yards.

Bradford Town arrive here with a new manager and, having seen their Twitter feed in perpetual motion, an almost entirely new squad! Who knows what that will mean but I'm hoping we won't be victims of the "new manager bounce" as we were at Mangotsfield United earlier in the season!

Today's visitors came to us twice last season, with very mixed results, and we were comprehensively beaten at their place. So, some inconsistent performances were the hallmark of those initial meetings in the Hellenic League. What wasn't inconsistent was a good rapport between both clubs and we very much look forward to welcoming their travelling support to Glevum Park this afternoon. Bradford's following was arguably the best we saw last season and it created a terrific atmosphere – Joe Cole vs The Bobcats! Here is hoping for a repeat.

The games will come thick and fast at Glevum Park, although the programme we face is a little less challenging for our ground staff than it was at one point. We were due to be at home on Tuesday but that league game has now been replaced by a GFA Challenge Trophy at Almondsbury on Tuesday evening. Fingers crossed some of you will be able to travel to support the team for that 7:30pm kick-off.

For now, I'd settle for a decent result today.

Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to read this. I hope everyone enjoys the game. Safe travels home.


It feels quite some time since we played our last home game against Meadow Park, so it is great to have football back here at Glevum Park today.

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

BRADFORD TOWN CLUB HISTORY

The Early Years

Bradford Town F.C. was founded in 1992 by Les and Pat Stevens, joining Division Two of the Wiltshire League. Home matches were initially played at St Laurence School in Bradford where the pitch was roped off before each game, dugouts were carried to the pitch and the half time tea was made in the boot of a car.

Following a short spell at Trowbridge Town's old Frome Road ground the club came home to Bradford on Avon in 1996 moving into Trowbridge Road. The ground was established in 1912 as the home of rubber works team Spencer Moulton FC and latterly Avon Bradford FC before they folded in the early 1990s, enabling Town to become custodians.

Western League status achieved

Bradford achieved promotion to the Western League in the 2005-06 season under the leadership of Mark Hodkinson after finishing runners up in the Wiltshire League Premier Division. Former founding players Paul Shanley and his assistant Mark Edwards took over at the helm in 2008-09 season which saw a third place league finish and floodlights installed at the ground. The following season saw the installation of a 100-seat main stand, a 4th place league finish and a creditable 2nd Round appearance in the FA Vase. Town then posted successive 6th, 5th and 4th place league finishes before embarking on a year to remember in 2013-14 when they won the Division One title by 13 points.

Progress in the Premier

The team's first season in the Premier Division concluded with a respectable 8th place finish but it was their exploits in the FA Vase which proved to be the highlight of the campaign. A gate of 621 at Trowbridge Road witnessed a 3-1 victory over Melksham Town in the 4th Round, their sixth scalp of the campaign, before bowing out in the next round. Another 8th place finish was recorded the following year whilst after three victories in the FA Cup the team were edged out 3-2 by Chippenham Town in the 2nd Qualifying Round.



After eight years in charge, the 2016-17 season began with Paul Shanley stepping down, being replaced by ex-Forest Green stalwart Danny Greaves, assisted by former fans favourite Aaron Wilson. After 25 tireless years as Chairman Les Stevens handed over the reins to Mark Hodkinson with Jon Phillips as deputy, both of whom have long standing connections with the club.

An impressive 5th place finish, was bettered in 2017-18 by 4th place after the side just came up short of promotion. This thrilling campaign also saw the club reach the FA Vase 5th Round again. The long trip to Redcar in the next round however proved a bridge too far as Town went down 2-0 to eventual Northern League champions Marske United on a weekend that will live long in the memory of the 100-plus travelling supporters.

Changes at the top

After two excellent seasons Danny Greaves left Bradford for Frome Town. Following Rob Mallet's short reign in the hot-seat in October 2018, former Larkhall Athletic boss Wayne Thorne was appointed manager along with his assistant Pete Maddison. The pair guided Town to a solid 7th place finish. 2019-20 saw a third FA Vase 5th Round appearance but were again eliminated in front of nearly 500 at Trowbridge Road.

The season also saw Mark Hodkinson step down as Chairman with deputy Jon Phillips taking over at the helm. In the league, the team were lying 3rd in March with the best points per game ratio before the coronavirus struck resulting in the abandonment of the league. The management pair subsequently decided to move on with former team captain Lee Davidson appointed as manger and Jamie Lyons as his assistant.

Cup winners and a new league

The 2020-21 league campaign was cut short again due to Covid-19 but saw Town claim their first trophy since 2014. The previous year's Les Phillips League Cup was concluded and culminated with Bradford defeating a much fancied Bridgwater Town side 1-0 at Street FC. It was announced that as part of the FA's league restructuring, Town would play the 2021-22 season in the Hellenic League Premier Division for the first time, posting a creditable 6th place finish.

Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a Premier Division fixture at Glevum Park in October 2021, we recorded a first home win of the season, as Joe Shutt's header sealed a memorable 1-0 win...

UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 1-0 BRADFORD TOWN SATURDAY, 2 OCTOBER 2021

After fifteen games, spread over almost 20 months, since 25 January 2020, Tuffley Rovers kept a clean sheet in an Uhlsport Hellenic League fixture, in what will undoubtedly be remembered as a performance of two halves, both equally impressive. The first saw a performance full of attacking intent and intensity; the second a fine defensive effort, with a counter-attacking threat.

This game, a first home league fixture since 29 September 2020, saw the visit of Bradford Town, who are new to the Hellenic League this season and came into the fixture with five wins in their opening eight league games, including a crushing 5-1 win over Calne Town in midweek. Rovers were in decent form themselves, having lost just once in six games, although that had been in their last league outing at Brimscombe & Thrupp which ended in a 5-1 reverse.

There were two changes to the starting line-up for Rich Cox's side, with Josh Aldridge (ineligible for the FA Vase game a week earlier) recalled and a returning Rover, Tristan Haswell, included after signing on a dual registration basis from Cinderford Town as he recovers from injury.

Both sides started the game on the front-foot, looking to attack at every opportunity, but early chances were at a premium. Joe Shutt hit a 10th minute shot that took a deflection before going narrowly over Chris Humphries' bar but there was little other notable incident in the early moments, despite the offensive intentions.

In the 16th minute Humphries was forced into making the first save of the game, as Lewis Bainbridge showed excellent footwork to dance past several challenges before driving a low shot that the tall Town keeper managed to push away from his goal with an outstretched palm.

Four minutes later, Town had a chance of their own, as a long ball upfield found Harvey Baker, who put a clever backheel into the path of Charlie Walton, who in turn played a square ball to George Box but the normally prolific striker blasted high over under pressure from the recovering Jacob Geddes.

The game continued at a pace, with Rovers showing an intensity that had been missing from some of their early season performances, with the pacy trio of Lucas Price, Shutt and Bainbridge testing the Bradford Town defence at every opportunity. The visitors looked solid in defence and ready to exploit any opportunity to launch an attack on the Rovers goal.

Rovers' keeper Adam Clark had been largely untroubled in the opening half an hour but he was called into action for the first in the 30th minute, as he got down quickly to keep out Baker's effort, after Box had fizzed a low cross into the six-yard box.

With half-time fast approaching, Aldridge started the move with a superb ball inside the Town full-back, Luke Burman, and when Bainbridge struck the ball beyond Humphries, but cannoned away off the upright. The ball then found its way to Aaron Basford, who struck a superb low

shot, which Humphries did well to keep out but the ball spun into the path of Bainbridge again and he put it into the unguarded net. Unfortunately, although Rovers thought they had the lead, Bainbridge had been in a position narrowly behind the Town keeper and with only the covering full-back Dawley on the line, was correctly adjudged to be in an offside position and the goal was disallowed.

The was the last clear chance of the half and the interval arrived without score but in a game that provided plenty of entertainment for the neutral.

Rovers started the second period with the same intent as had been demonstrated in the first period and took the lead ten minutes into the half. Liam Wright and Dom Kent combined to win back possession, before Shutt played an excellent pass out to Price, who opened up his body, swung the ball back into the box and into the path of the diminutive Shutt, who arrived unmarked to head the ball beyond Humphries and into the net from 10 yards out.



The hosts' performance wasn't all about attacking endeavour and the back three of Wright, Geddes and Haswell were in commanding form, snuffing out attacks and bravely winning a succession of headers and tackles to keep the increasing threat from Town away from Clark's goal.

Humphries, who had been a solid presence in the visiting goal, then picked up a back injury in a clash with Bainbridge and it looked like he may have to withdrawn from the game but with no replacement keeper on the bench, he was able to continue after several minutes of treatment.

Town did then make a change, as Tyson Pollard came on for Dawley, and he was to prove a significant influence in the way the game developed, instrumental in much of the visiting side's play after entering the fray, almost scoring within two minutes of his introduction, only to see his volleyed effort go narrowly wide.

The intensity had shifted for Rovers and they were now producing some excellent defending, supported by Clark, who came to the fore making a good save from Box, who fired a low shot that the Tuffley keeper forced over the bar with an outstretched foot.

Bainbridge then had to be withdrawn from action, after picking up an injury, and he was replaced by Brennan Denness-Barrett. Shortly after Liam Smith and Yeshaya Lomotey were introduced for Basford and Price.

As time began to ran out, the visitors continued to attack and Clark had to make a smart stop from Walton, before the same player headed against Warren Mann and onto the Rovers bar from the resultant corner. Seconds later, following the subsequent corner, Clark made another good stop to deny Town again.



Geddes was showing how crucial he was to the hosts, after returning from injury seven days previously, and made a series of well-timed defensive blocks as the game drew nearer to a close and Clark, who had won back his place following a recent injury to Jack Copland, made another great stop in the closing moments to deny them an equaliser.


