

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northerm Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northerr Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

LONGLEVENS CLUB HISTORY

The Club, in its current format, was founded in 1954. We initially played in the North Gloucestershire League, but currently we operate in the UHL Sport Hellenic League, the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and the Stroud and District League.



In 2011/12, Gloucester City Council created a new football facility and we were fortunate enough to be offered the tenancy, which

enabled us to make the step-up to the Gloucestershire County League – our facilities at our Club HQ could not be converted to 'make the grade'. At this point, we must give great credit to E. G. Carter and Company Limited, our major sponsors, because, without them, we could not have got Saw Mills up to the required standard and I am happy to say that they are still the major force for the improvements that we have subsequently made – so "Thank You" Carters, as they are locally referred to!

We now run six male adult sides, a Ladies side and a Veterans team and we recently expanded to include a Junior Section to cover sides from U8's to U11's, which will complement our Youth Section, which bridges all age groups between the Junior and Senior Sections. Last season also saw us introduce a girls' team and such was the uptake that we now have three and given the England's Ladies achievements, I imagine we could see another surge in interest.

This will bring us to a total of 31 sides in all and we are recognised as a Two Star FA Accredited Club, the system that has replaced the previously used Charter Standard 'banner'. Special mention here to Dennis Barnsley who has done so much work in respect of the Youth Section and the Charter Standard and to our Chairman, Mark Cornell and Treasurer Chris Trout for putting in so much work to make the expansion of the Youth Section happen.

We had spent more than forty years trying to reach the Gloucestershire County League, but amazingly, within three years we had passed through it and gained promotion to the UHLSPORT Hellenic League, having won the League in 2013-14 and once again we were indebted to Carters for helping us to upgrade Saw Mills to the required standard.

So, in 2014/15 we started another new phase for the Club, in Division One West of the UHLSPORT Hellenic League and what a start! We won the Division at the first attempt, so after three consecutive titles and two consecutive promotions, we found ourselves in the Premier Division and have consolidated our position in that Division – in fact last season saw us achieve our highest finish to date, but we recognise the difficulties of facing sides

that have a history and an infrastructure that is vastly superior to ours.

One can't leave last season without a reference to a great FA Cup run that culminated in us playing Gloucester City – a dream day out for the Club, because despite being drawn at home, there was no choice but to switch it to their ground and although we eventually lost we gave them a run for their money, made a few 'Bob', but more importantly gave the Club a day that will be forever remembered by all of us who attended the game.

We also helped create a new crowd record of 2,320 at City's recently re-opened ground and that record still holds today. We are extremely lucky that two of our previous Managers - Mark Moore and James French do a lot of work behind the scenes at Saw Mills and Mark is currently looking at what we need to do to upgrade the facility – ideally to a Step 4 standard, or at least close to it. Mark has made a truly remarkable recovery healthwise and it is great to see him operating with his former verve and energy!

Club stalwart and Mark's assistant Craig 'Spider' Martin was the next to step up as Manager, after Mark was forced by ill health to step down and last season, we welcomed Mike Palmer to the Club and he has done some great work, not only with the First Team, but in creating a 'Club Ethos', a Presentation of which has been shared right the way through the Club.

Mike has had a varied experience before joining us – he has coached at Gloucester City, had two years with Green Bay in The States and has also coached at Cheltenham Town, Forest Green Rovers and Tuffley Rovers (U18's and Development) and he already holds the UEFA B certificate and is now working towards his UEFA A – so he brings a wealth of knowledge to the Club and we look forward to a positive mutual experience.

Tim Hall had decided to take a backward step at the end of 2017-18 but was persuaded to 're-join' and will continue this season. We also welcome Matt Sysum to our coaching staff and confident that he has picked up a wealth of experience in his many travels. I guess I should have started these notes by saying how good it was to compete a season, after two 'wash outs' and hopefully, even though the virus has not gone away, we are now capable of carrying on as normal. As ever, apologies to all those people at the Club who deserve a name-check but didn't get one, but given their work at Saw Mills, I must name check Ash Baker (hospitality), Neville Martin (Gate), Sharon and Tara Martin

(Refreshment Hut) and our Chairman Mark Cornell and ex-player Paul Walsh (behind the scenes work).



Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a Premier Division fixture at Glevum Park on this day in 2021, we suffered a narrow defeat, as Neil Mustoe joined caretaker manager, Ritchie Warden, in the dugout for the first time...

UHSLPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 0-1 LONGLEVENS MONDAY, 27 DECEMBER 2021

A solitary goal from visiting Longlevens captain Shaun O'Connor decided this local affair in front of a bumper Bank Holiday crowd of over three hundred. Rovers are still firing blanks in front of goal but this was a much more compact performance than the one against Corsham nine days earlier and should give the newly-appointed management team of Neil Mustoe and Ritchie Warden enough encouraging signs to work on in the New Year even though the team desperately needs to be picking up points again very quickly because if it does not it can expect to be caught and overtaken by the three clubs immediately below them in the table.

Matches between the two Gloucester clubs in this division tend to be quite tight affairs without many goals and this match continued that trend. There were several former Rovers players in the Longlevens squad and although that sort of familiarity can lead to rather feisty confrontations that wasn't really evident until the closing stages when Rovers had a player sent off for a pretty wild challenge.

Tuffley kicked off playing down the slope but both teams won early corners. The 'Levens corner was taken by Luke Troke and the ball certainly moved in the air and was drifting inside the far post when Jack Copland grabbed it to make a clean catch.

Eight minutes had passed before there was a sniff of a chance. Brad Martin got his head to a free-kick taken by Troke on the left but when the ball reached Will Emery he could only drive his shot wide of Copland's left-hand post.

Five minutes later Jamal Lawrence found himself in the clear when a long ball forward reached him but he was being put under pressure by a defender and maybe got his shot away a little earlier than he needed to, an effort which was comfortably saved by Ellis Parker.



Midway through the first half Warren Mann fouled Dave Merrick as Longlevens built up a move on the right. Troke's free-kick drifted over everyone in the penalty-area before smacking against the far post; this led to an almighty scramble as defenders tried to clear the ball but instead led to Merrick getting a shot away which was deflected for a corner.



Just after the half-hour mark the visitors took the lead. O'Connor moved menacingly forward into the final third of the pitch and exchanged passes with Martin before driving in a right-footed shot which was deflected off debutant Scott Nicholls and out of Copland's reach and ended up in the far corner.



There was a flurry of activity soon after the goal as Longlevens threatened to increase their lead. Ex-Rover Rudi McKinnon fired in a ferocious shot from the left which was screaming into the far corner until Copland flew through the air and somehow diverted the ball onto his crossbar and away from immediate danger. Two minutes later Martin passed to Emery on the right and the cross was met by Cameron Williams who could not get over the ball properly and headed it over the crossbar.

Just before the interval Rovers had two decent opportunities to equalise. Lewis Bainbridge ran from deep inside his own half down the left and hurdled a couple of attempted tackles while still retaining possession of the ball before getting in a tame shot which Parker dealt with comfortably. Then Nicholls moved up when Rovers were awarded a free-kick on the right but he could only head Josh Aldridge's cross wide of the goal. So 'Levens held on to take their narrow lead into the half-time break.

The visitors moved forward with purpose early in the second half and this led to two corners, the second of which was headed wide by Williams. Rovers won a corner themselves shortly afterwards and Aldridge's flag-kick led to a fierce drive from Nicholls which Parker acrobatically turned aside.



Rovers' shortcomings in front of goal were well documented and they again failed to create enough decent opportunities for themselves even though their big centre-forward Lawrence worked hard for little reward. Lucas Price had an effort that should have drawn the scores level, but Parker made another superb save to keep his side in front.

Both teams made substitutions as the match entered its final third. Warren Mann was brought down heavily and limped away but Rovers had made their three changes by then so the Tuffley veteran had to see out the match. The same fate befell Ethan Dunbar for the visitors.

Time was nearly up when Mann flew into a challenge on O'Connor for which referee Mitchell Terry pulled a red card out of his pocket. Rovers had to play with a man less for what little time remained but Longlevens remained composed and disciplined and continued to work hard to protect their narrow lead with the three points earned moving them level on points with Westbury United in eighth place although they have played three matches more than the Wiltshire club.


