MANAGER'S COMMENT



Good afternoon and welcome to all players officials and supporters of Corsham Town visiting Glevum Park this afternoon.

After Tuesday night's disappointing result, we need to bounce back with a performance fuelled by a belief that we will get out of the relegation zone. There are 51 points to play for and as disappointed as we are as a consequence of Tuesday's result, we must take the positives and regroup coming in today's game.

You can moan and groan about decisions in a game but Tuesday night we didn't get the big ones; ones which are game changers. I really believe if we had scored one goal we would have got another and I felt we were the better team in both halves, having the better opportunities and largely in control of the game. What we did lack is that bit of quality and composure in the final third during the first half, when getting into good areas.

In the second half of Tuesday evening's game we were again in the ascendancy, with our goal having little action to comment on, but our run of games without scoring a goal continued, which is a concern for all involved.

One huge positive was Kieran Alder's return from injury and he came through 25-30 minutes of action, and it was great to see Harrison Iddles getting another game under his belt and showing his work rate and commitment to the cause, although he picked up an injury late on that might set him back a little.

In addition, Sammie Hicks getting more minutes hopefully bodes well for the rest of the season.

Today will be another hard afternoon, with Corsham still fighting on a few fronts with their FA Vase run and games in hand on the teams at the top, but like us I think they would prefer the points on the board over games in hand.

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

CLUB HISTORY

The earliest record found of Corsham Football Club is 1878 with the club becoming affiliated to the Football Association in 1893. Over the years, the team has often been referred to as the Quarrymen due to the high level of quarrying in and around Corsham.

In March 1894, the first Wiltshire Football League was formed with the original member clubs being Bradford, Calne, Chippenham, Corsham, Southbroom (Devizes), Melksham, Trowbridge Town, and Warminster. At the end of the 1894/95 season Corsham would be the inaugural champions, winning the league on goal average over Southbroom, helped by an emphatic 17 - 1 win over Calne in their final game. Promotion was achieved to the Western League at the end of the 1997/98 season after winning the county league by goal difference from Devizes Town Reserves.

Ground improvements continued under the chairmanship of Colin Hudd, floodlights were installed in 2001, a 112 spectator stand erected and hard standing laid around the pitch perimeter. 2006/07 season saw Corsham Town winning the Western League Premier Division, which was hotly contested by many teams, including Bridgwater Town and Frome Town. The club also added a third successive Wiltshire Senior Cup victory, again over local rivals Melksham Town.

Due to the Covid pandemic the 2019/20 season was declared null and void by the Football Association on 26th March 2020. Justin Flowers and his backroom staff parted with the club at the end of the null and void 2019/20 season and moved across to Malmesbury Victoria.

The 2020/21 season saw Keiran Baggs becoming the new manager with Gary Higdon as his assistant. Unfortunately, after 10 league games the 2020/21 was curtailed by the FA due to the Covid pandemic. Despite the last two seasons being affected by Covid, the FA went ahead with planned restructuring of the Non-League Pyramid. The results from 2019/20 & 2021/21 were combined and this meant that Corsham Town finished in a position for upward movement.

The club took this upward movement to Step 5 with a lateral movement in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Since we last played at Glevum Park we have seen debuts for former Gloucester City player Lyndon Tomkins (pictured) and Slimbridge player Ben Hands. Those appearances made them our fourteenth and fifteenth first team debutants of the 2022/23 playing season, following on from the most recent before them, Harrison Iddles, who made his debut early in the New Year.



In total, Neil Mustoe has used 41 different players this season, across 33 competitive fixtures, which contrasts with 53 players being used in our 2021/22 competitive season, when we played 48 games. A stable squad is often seen as a pathway to success, so please forgive us if we don't wish for too many more debutants this season!

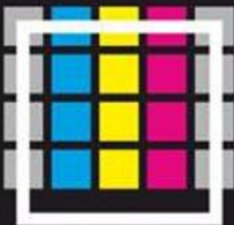

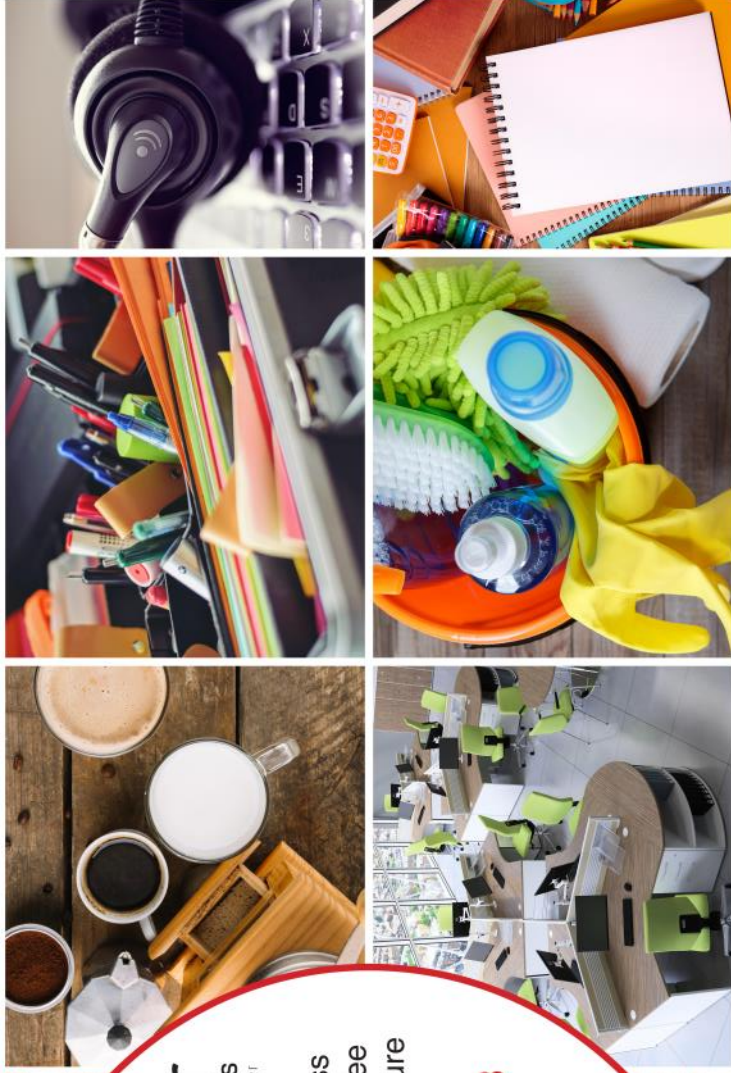

Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a Premier Division fixture at Glevum Park, Rovers slumped to a disappointing three goal defeat and it proved to be Manager Rich Cox's final game in charge of the first team at Glevum Park....

UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 0-3 CORSHAM TOWN SATURDAY, 18 DECEMBER 2021

As one of several clubs moved into the Hellenic League from other Leagues in the summer (Corsham finished top of the Western League's First Division in its truncated 2020-21 season), Town could be satisfied with their start to life in a different division having taken 42 points from 22 matches as the second half of the season moved forward into the busy Christmas & New Year programme. A last-minute defeat at League-leaders Bishop's Cleeve a week before returning to Gloucestershire to play Tuffley has been their only away defeat to date in the League, a run which has included commendable wins at Lydney and former-leaders Cribbs.

So the Quarrymen would arrive at Glevum Park in a confident mood, having already defeated Rovers 2-0 at their own Southbank ground in Wiltshire in the middle of August. But for the hosts it was a different situation altogether. Somehow a horrendous run of eight consecutive league defeats had to be ended or their season was in danger of collapsing into the most awful meltdown. Five of those defeats had come in home games in which their only goal had been put into his own net by an opponent. Only bottom-of-the-table Hallen had taken less home points than Rovers. Just six goals from eight home matches clearly told where Tuffley's main deficiency lay as they prepared for this crucial fixture on the final Saturday before Christmas.

As it was, Corsham completed a League double over Tuffley and in so doing extended the Gloucester club's alarming losing run into double figures. In truth Town's victory was as comfortable as those achieved by most recent visitors to Glevum Park in the Hellenic League's top division.

The Wiltshire club had conceded a very late goal to Bishops Cleeve seven days earlier. This time it was their turn to score a very early goal, as early as the second minute in fact. Rovers' Dominik Kent lost possession of the ball a few yards outside his own penalty-area and Baldwin Igbinobaro capitalised on the error to move into the box and place a neat left-footed shot out of Jack Copland's reach.

Losing the ball after gaining possession of it by Tuffley players was an unfortunate feature of the first half for the hosts. The normally reliable Jacob Geddes was the next to do this but without his error leading to a goal.

With six minutes gone a foul by Will Ramsey saw a free-kick being chipped into a dangerous area and a header thumped against Copland's crossbar before being cleared. At this point Rovers had not made any incursions into the final third of the pitch. When Lewis Bainbridge was fouled on the left after ten minutes, the ensuing free-kick from Joe Shutt saw the first time that the ball had been inside Corsham's penalty-area; although Tom Spencer reached the cross, he could only head the ball a couple of feet wide of visiting goalkeeper Rob Brown's left-hand post.

A free-kick was awarded against Liam Wright for a push on Nathan Davis. Wright protested a bit too vociferously and received a stern talking-to from referee Craig Davenport, but Rovers' left-back wasn't so fortunate a few minutes later when he received a yellow card after fouling Brandon Mundy. Between those two incidents Town's Sean Keet was sent to the sin-bin for dissent and Corsham were denied a second goal when Chris Allen's free-kick from wide on the left went straight into the far corner but the assistant's flag was up to indicate offside against one of the visiting forwards.

As the half-hour mark approached Shutt was fouled in a central position, and this resulted in Tuffley's first serious shot at goal but Aaron Basford's effort was high, wide and not very handsome.

The scorer of the opening goal then went down near the right corner-flag with what seemed to be an early case of cramp on a cold and cloudy afternoon.

Demilade Yussuf was the next Tuffley player to inexplicably lose possession of the ball and his carelessness resulted in a corner on the left for the visitors which Copland palmed over his own crossbar for another corner on the other side.

As the interval neared Shutt tried a very ambitious shot from way out on the right and immediately turned screaming with pain and clutching his left shoulder. After being treated on the pitch, it was clear that he would be unable to continue and he was immediately replaced by Lucas Price who became the first substitute of the afternoon.

In the final minute of the first half Tuffley's afternoon went from bad to worse when Gary Higdon was bundled over by Geddes and Matt Morris blasted the spot-kick high past Copland's right-hand side.

Town replaced Matt Swann with Ryan Bath at the start of the second half. Shortly after the resumption Nathan Davis was fouled by Yussuf to give Town a free-kick in a promising position on the left. Up to this point all Corsham's free-kicks and corners had been taken by Chris Allen but Morris stepped up for this one and curled the ball narrowly over the crossbar with his right foot.



Mundy trotted off for the visitors and was replaced by Leigh Rogers. Jamie Cuning would later come on for early goalscorer Igbinobaro. Davis went down with what looked to be another case of cramp but was able to continue after receiving some treatment.

Tuffley were struggling to put attacking moves together but Lewis Bainbridge was a willing runner down the left until he was replaced by debutant Jurek Marszalek. Before he left the pitch Bainbridge had cut inside from the left-hand side and driven a shot wide. The same fate befell both Liam Wright and Tuffley's final substitute, Jack Beardsell, but none of these efforts troubled Brown, who had a very quiet afternoon and did not have a direct save to make.

Leon Greenland became the second Corsham player to be sent to the sin-bin after showing dissent to the referee. His afternoon was therefore over as there were only three minutes left to play.

In the final minute Town were awarded a free-kick on the left. The ball was swung in by Chris Allen and seemed to be touched into his own net by a back-pedaling Copland. Whoever got the final touch was irrelevant really because it just put a bit of gloss on Town's victory and condemned Tuffley to a sixth successive home defeat in the League with Corsham being the fourth side to score three goals at Glevum Park during that period.

Next up for Rovers are home local derbies against Longlevens and Brimscombe. Only an eternal optimist could see Rovers taking much from those matches based on this performance today. By contrast, Corsham are now in 6th place and just one point behind Malvern Town, Westfields and Brimscombe (2nd, 3rd and 4th, respectively).

Zero points from the last twenty-seven available is not a statistic to inspire much confidence in this Rovers team as Christmas beckons but how or when things are going to change for the better for them is impossible to predict with any confidence, a quality a lot of the Tuffley players seem to be lacking as a miserable November has evolved into an even more miserable December.

On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've haven't played many games on 4 February but we have selected a few from around the date to reflect on our fortunes during this time of the year...

5 February 2011

A 78th minute goal from Adam Bates was enough to earn Axa a hard fought victory, as they returned from their visit to Tuffley Rovers with three Gloucestershire County League points that took them into second place in the league table.

The visitors' goal came after Liam Harding slipped whilst in possession, allowing Bates to fashion a chance on goal. Although Rovers' Adam Bennett pulled off a good stop to keep out the striker's first effort, the ball fell nicely to the Axa player and he managed to lift the ball over the grounded keeper and into the back of the net.

That was enough to ensure Axa took the points, whilst Rovers were left to a performance that ensured they slipped to a third consecutive league defeat.
