We are in a relegation battle this season, which I feel may go down to the last couple of games and I personally believe it will be a three-way shootout between us, Chipping Sodbury and Bradford Town. Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Thornbury Town FC

Club History



It is understood that football has been played in Thornbury from around 1898 and formerly known as Thornbury Sports became Thornbury Town FC in the early 1970's.

1968-69 we became founder members of the Gloucestershire County League and spectator figures in excess of 500 were regularly recorded. In 1971 the club finished third in the Gloucestershire County League and was accepted into the Western League. However, due to difficulties in bringing the facilities up to the leagues required standards were unable to take the next step up. Relegation to the Bristol Premier Combination League unfortunately followed in 1976-77. The following 20+ years saw Thornbury Town strive to regain their former status, never really threatening to take the Premier Combination title. The only success during these lean years was reaching the final of the GFA Senior Amateur Cup in 1985-86 and 1989-90 unfortunately on both occasions loser's medals were received.

During the late 1990's, the Club maintained its strong focus on developing local talent and this eventually bore fruit in 1999 when the final of the Stroud Charity Cup was reached, losing narrowly to Dursley Town. 2001-02 season saw the management team of Dave Wiffill and Steve Burbage take the reins, which brought instant success winning the Bristol Premier Combination title by 13 points and a return to the Gloucestershire County League. This followed a run of thirteen consecutive league wins a club record, which still stands to this day. The league and cup double eluded the club when they were defeated by Sea Mills in the League Cup Final.

In preparation for the return to County League football the summer of 2002 saw a lot of hard work undertaken on the Mundy facilities with the building of dug-outs, improved drainage and revamping of the dressing rooms. All this work appeared to have been worth while with the club establishing itself back in the Gloucestershire County league with a creditable 7th league position for the next three seasons. Silverware did come our way in 2003-04 when we defeated Taverners on penalties, after a 2-2 draw, to lift the Stroud Charity Cup. The 2003-04 season, also saw the formation of an Under-18's side in order to maintain Youth development within the club and they gained entry to the Gloucester County Youth League.

Following a number of indifferent seasons when relegation back to the Bristol Premier Combination league was only just averted in 2006-07, a new management committee and first team management were appointed. Dave Lippiatt took over as first team manager, coming to the club from Sea Mills Park bringing with him Carl Derosa as his assistant. With an initial three / four year strategy, which came to fruition during the 2009-10 season when after a steady first half to the season a tremendous winning run of ten league games saw the Surridge Gloucestershire County League title won for the first time in the clubs history. 2010 also saw the milestone achievement of the long awaited coming together of the two local football clubs "Thornbury Town FC" and "Thornbury Falcons FC" now under one club management umbrella of Thornbury Town FC without losing the heritage and identity of Thornbury Falcons. This will further enhance the long term development within the local community for junior, youth and senior football.

In the 2010-11 season the final of the Les James Cup Final was reached, which resulted in a penalty shoot-out disappointment against Henbury Town. 2013-14 saw the U18's in their highest league position in the Gloucestershire County Youth League finishing runners-up, which was a tremendous achievement for the team and managers Simon Pirie and Mark Franklin.

The 2014-15 season was a very successful season finishing 4th in the league and winning the Les James Cup for the first time in the Club's history. Andy Davies continued to produce a team of quality which resulted in a third 4th-place in a row in Season 2016-17. 2017-18 saw the club finally succeed in their quest win the Gloucestershire County League. After a lot of work behind the scenes to gain planning permission for the required ground improvements, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League for the first time in our history.

Our first season in the Hellenic League saw us finish a creditable 3rd in Div 1 West and win the Supplementary Cup. 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 seasons were ruled null and void due to the Coronavirus pandemic with the team poised to gain promotion. A restructuring of the football pyramid has placed us in the Hellenic Premier Division. With a new management team and Richard Joyce in place we look forward to the season ahead and wish all teams the best of luck in their endeavours.

Toby Bennett - a central midfielder with an excellent passing range and good engine

Harry Brock - talented attacking player who has been a long-term servant but started this season with Larkhall Athletic

Joe Guest - long serving defender who has achieved two promotions with the club

Aaron Nash - forward player signed on dual-registration from Dursley Town, who has previously been at Slimbridge, Brimscombe & Thrupp and Berkeley Town

Ollie Rawnsley - reliable central defender who was previously at Berkeley Town

Alex Shaw - a 19-year-old centre back previously at Swindon Supermarine and Slimbridge

Jack Smith - 17-year-old midfielder on a dual-registration from Southern League side Slimbridge

Tom Webb - a very capable defender who likes to also get forward with good delivery

Marcus Wormwell - a wide midfielder who works hard and looks to deliver quality into the box

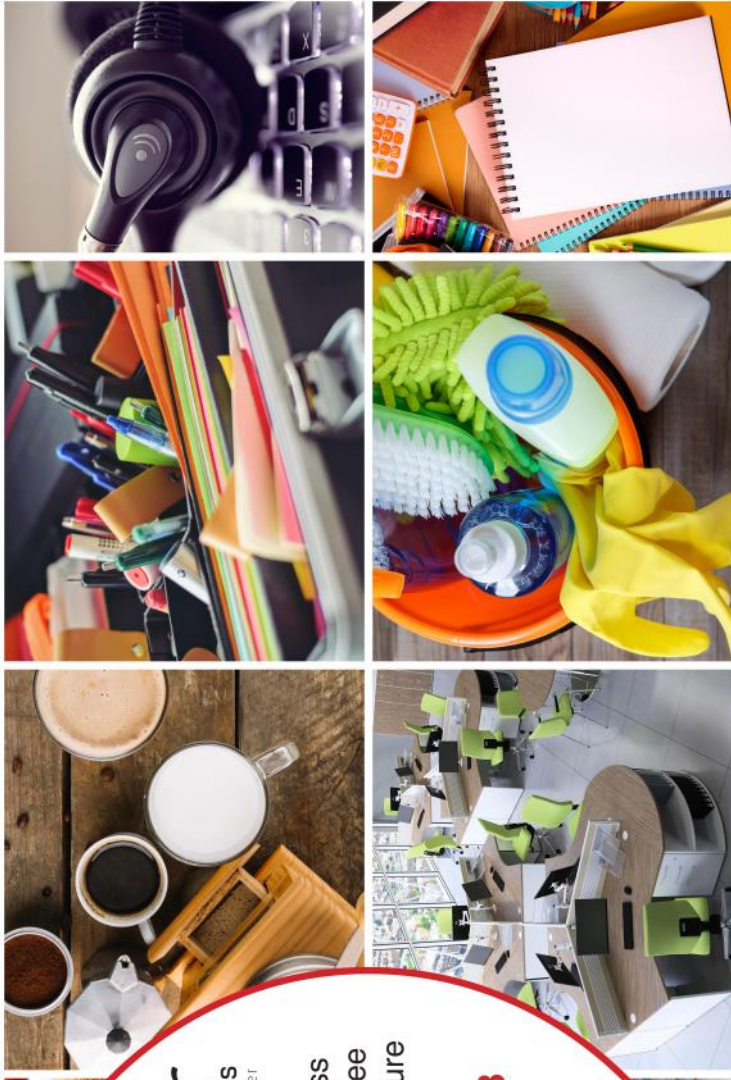

Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a Premier Division fixture at Glevum Park in November 2021, the visitors completed a 2021/22 league double over The Rovers...

UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 1-3 THORNBURY TOWN SATURDAY, 6 NOVEMBER 2021



For the fourth successive home league match Rovers would face an opponent moved into the Hellenic League's Premier Division as a result of a big restructuring of non-League football in the summer.

The two clubs did meet on the opening day of the season in August when Jamal Lawrence's late goal was only a consolation for Tuffley in a narrow 2-1 defeat. Thornbury, like some of the other newcomers to this division, have found it tough going at times, especially in away fixtures, but if there is a form pointer they did get an excellent draw a week before coming to Gloucester at the Hereford Lads Club, an opponent Rovers also played away quite recently with a very different outcome. Rovers' main concern would be playing well enough to not suffer a third league defeat in the last seven days.

With both teams losing in midweek it was inevitable that one would be happier whatever the result was in this match; and it was the visitors who left the field with smiling faces after a 3-1 victory on a cold and windy afternoon which was as every bit as comfortable as the score-line suggests.

Rovers named Dominik Kent as captain in the absence of Jacob Geddes. Although Dom might well become a regular skipper in the future, it became clear during the afternoon that Tuffley missed Jacob's leadership as well as his defensive and organisational qualities.

It was Rovers who made the more confident start with Sam Mendes and Liam Wright having shots saved in the opening minutes as well as Brennan Denness-Bassett blazing an early effort over the crossbar. Thornbury did not have a significant effort on goal until the 10th minute when Luke Franklin's effort comfortably cleared the crossbar at the dressing-rooms end of the ground.

Rovers were forced to make an early change when Liam Wright went down in a heap after 15 minutes near his own penalty-area and was unable to continue after treatment so was immediately substituted by Jack Beardsell.

Town won several corners in the first half and from one of them Toby Bennett's flag-kick from the right sailed past the far post where Tom Bradley was waiting to plant a firm header, possibly slightly deflected, past Jack Copland in the home goal. Only two minutes later Bradley connected with another right-wing corner but could only head the ball up in the air, after which it was cleared.

Rovers' cause was not helped when Aaron Basford raced towards the right corner chasing a loose ball and one of his boots connected with a Thornbury defender. After several players confronted each other referee Roger Smith took Basford to one side and pulled a red card out of his pocket before showing it to the Tuffley forward, who walked disconsolately towards the changing-rooms as play resumed. The Thornbury defender who had been so angry received a yellow card. It did look like an unnecessarily reckless challenge so the official probably took the right action but it left Rovers not only chasing the game but chasing it a man down with more than half the match still to play.

Pressure from Thornbury increased as they sensed the opportunity to make their numerical advantage count as half-time approached. Sure enough a second goal did come before the half-time whistle blew; Craig Lancaster worked hard to cross the ball from the right but it was slightly over-hit; Brandon Benjamin retrieved the ball and when his shot was pushed out by Copland Jacob Farthing was there to prod the loose ball into an unguarded net.

With less than ten minutes of the second period played Thornbury were out of sight when Farthing burst into Tuffley's penalty-area to drive the ball firmly past Copland. Rovers brought on Harry Morgan for Sam Mendes and, a bit later, Lucas Price for Lewis Bainbridge but the white shirts of the visitors continued to look dangerous and they had a fourth goal disallowed for a marginal offside.

For the second Saturday in a row a Tuffley player went down injured with all three substitutions having already been made. A week ago it had been Archie Woodall; today it was Laurie McNally who had to play on.

As time ran out there was suddenly a flurry of attacking activity from the hosts. Denness-Barrett was fouled as he made his way into the Thornbury box from the right. Town's Ollie Rawnsley needed treatment for a facial injury before the free-kick could be taken. The kick was half-cleared to Woodall, who improvised brilliantly with a cheeky back-heel which was going wide until the scorer of Town's opening goal, Bradley, unluckily deflected the ball into his own net.



A minute later Rovers won a free-kick in a central position on the edge of Thornbury's box but the kick only led to a corner not a serious goalscoring opportunity. For Rovers this late attacking intent was, sadly, too little too late.

So a league double over Rovers for Thornbury, who are now in 17th place only two points behind the Gloucester club. Rovers have followed a home win with two home defeats and with two more home fixtures coming up in quick succession it is vital that they kick the losing habit as quickly as possible to avoid being dragged into the uncomfortable territory below them.

ON (OR AROUND) THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we have played only one competitive fixture on 3 March, so we've highlighted that, as well as selecting a few from around the date to reflect on our fortunes during this time of the year...

1 March 2008

Tuffley Rovers returned from Ellwood without a point, despite several great opportunities to win the game. Peter Thomas went close after 6 minutes, before Ollie Everitt should have put the visitors ahead on 13 minutes but shot wide from just 6 yards. Mark Wallington was then denied by a wonderful save from Alex Goode, as Rovers pressed.



Daryl Addis, Alan Williams and Matt Foxwell all then had chances for Ellwood but were as profligate as their visitors and the game went into the interval at 0-0.



The winning goal came in the 57th minute, when Adam Stradling moved up for a free kick and headed the ball into the far corner from just inside the box leaving Rovers' keeper Mark Harris stranded. Pat Boyd then missed a great chance to level scores, with ten minutes remaining, but Goode was once again

equal to his effort.

6 March 2010

Tuffley Rovers kept up their hopes of challenging for the Gloucestershire County League title, as they record a 3-0 home victory over DRG Stapleton.

Marcus Foxwell opened the scoring for the home side after 12 minutes when he fired the ball into the roof of the net from 8 yards. After 26 minutes it was 2-0, as Ashley Davies headed home a Warren Mann cross. Rovers then went 3-0 up just before the break, when a free-kick from Marcus Foxwell was brilliantly headed home by Richard James from the edge of the box.

That proved to be the end of the scoring, as Rovers recorded a second consecutive league win, after three games without a win prior to that.

3 March 2012

Tuffley Rovers cemented their position at the top of the Gloucestershire County League table after a 4-0 win over local rivals Longlevens, as the hosts put in a dominant performance.

The home side went ahead on 30 minutes, when Shayne Bradley scored from the penalty spot, after Mark Wallington had been brought down in the box.

Six minutes later they went 2-0 up, after Warren Mann seized on a mistake by the visitors keeper to score into the roof of the net. With the interval almost upon them, Rovers scored a third as Shayne Bradley turned in the box and drove the ball home through the legs of the keeper.

Kacey Johnstone made it 4-0 after 67 minutes, when he headed home a Warren Mann cross. In the 78th minute Tuffley took the opportunity to give a home debut to 16 year old Jordan Cooper, who is a prolific goal-scorer in their youth team.

5 March 2016

In what proved to be Warren Evans' final game as Tuffley Rovers' manager, his team showed the defence vulnerability that has become a regular feature of recent performances, as they surrendered a two goal half-time advantage to succumb to another defeat in the Hellenic League Premier Division.




Rovers started brightly and took a very early lead, after just two minutes on this occasion, when Brett James and Jordan Fletcher exchanged passes, before the latter rolled the ball into the path of the on-rushing Warren Mann, who slotted the ball low into the bottom corner of the Binfield net from 10 yards.



After twelve minutes Rovers, who were visibly buoyed by the confidence that came with Mann's goal, extended their advantage, as Fletcher managed to get his head to Kieran Squires' long throw and divert the ball past Charlie Lusty in the Binfield goal.

Josh Howell scored after 50 minutes, to bring Binfield back into the game, before Liam Ferdinand levelled the scores and then scored a late, late winner to secure the comeback and keep all three points in Berkshire.
