EDITOR'S COMMENT



I'd like to offer a warm welcome to everyone visiting Glevum Park this afternoon for the visit of Chipping Sodbury Town. I sincerely hope their players, supporters and officials enjoy their visit to our home (in every respect, bar the result!).

We are now at the 'business end' of the season and, in that context, games don't come bigger than this. Like our visitors today, we realise we are at risk of relegation from the Premier Division and I would suspect that they share our ambitions to avoid that outcome. Like us, they've had some good days and some bad during the 2022/23 season but all that pales into insignificance if either team secures the points needed to save their place at Step 5. If that is the outcome, neither of us will concern ourselves too much with what went before – the relief will be enough.

If, however, one (or possibly both) of us end up in the bottom two places, then we will probably analyse every poor performance, wasted chance and missed opportunity, as we lament or fortunes and look towards rebuilding at Step 6. That is what will make today's game such a big deal. It is the 'six pointer' that will shape the next two weeks, as the season draws to a close. Winning makes the journey to 22 April much easier; losing makes it far tougher – I know which path I'd like to follow!

Of course, whatever happens today won't be the end of the story. There are many other games to be played by the teams at or around the bottom of the table and, most importantly, we are due to travel to Chipping Sodbury on the last day of the season. I personally hope that isn't a 'winner takes all' game but it might well be.

Relegation wouldn't be the end of the world, but everyone involved in this club over the past 15 years has worked so hard to get us back to Step 5 and it would be very sad to lose our place at that level. We've got a squad capable of competing at this level but injuries, non-availability, poor form at crucial moments, and bad luck have all played their part in our direction of travel. Today will be the latest chance to change things for the better. I believe that Muzzy can guide this team to the right result but that is by no means certain and our visitors will be feeling the same, I'm sure.

I would also like to congratulate Macaulay Herbert on reaching 250 competitive appearances for the first team. It is another wonderful achievement and I sincerely hope that Macca can move towards 300 appearances with a season in the Premier Division. That is a cause worth fighting for.

In closing, one thing to reflect upon, given some rumours circulating recently. It is suggested a Hellenic League club intends to seek "voluntary relegation" from the Premier Division. I have been asked numerous times whether that might save us – irrespective of league positions – and my answer is unequivocal; it is irrelevant to 'now'. We must make sure we get the points needed to finish outside the bottom two places and then the discussion is over. If we wait upon the misfortune of others, then we really aren't doing what we set out to do at the start of this season.

CHAIRMAN'S COMMENT



Good afternoon and welcome to everyone at Glevum Park today. Firstly, I hope everyone has had a wonderful Easter weekend so far.

A warm welcome to our opponents Chipping Sodbury and all their players, management, committee and supporters.

Thank you, today, to our match sponsor Foxmoor Fire & Security. We're really delighted they've joined as at Glevum Park today and really appreciate their support as a regular match-day sponsor.

I don't think I need to let anyone know the importance of this game today, for both clubs, as both teams continue their quest for Hellenic League Premier Division survival. Whilst our opponents today play their 3rd game in 5 days, our players have had a ten day break. I hope that our time off will mean player injuries, and other niggles have cleared up – rather than the risk that a short break could mean the lads will be a little rusty.

Off the field we have been successful in our bid for a Levelling Up grant through Gloucestershire County Council towards us redeveloping our social club and youth changing rooms at the site on Tuffley Lane. This bid will be released in the press by Gloucestershire County Council in the coming weeks, but following an application process and interview, we have been awarded £37,500 to add to the Gloucester City grant of £200,000 we have been allocated from a pot of section 106 funding.

We are now engaging with local construction organisations, who will tender for the work and help us plan to make it a reailty. To help us make the project a reality and as successful as possible, we have also set up a CrowdFunder page and there are posters with QR codes on them within the bar area so that, if you wish, you can donate via the QR code. We are aiming to raise £10,000 and commence the work in early May 2023.

I hope everyone enjoys the game and hospitality here today, and has a safe trip home.

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).





CHIPPING SODBURY TOWN HISTORY

In the summer of 1959 Cliff Phelps decided it was time football association was brought back to the town. It had been six long years since the boys of the town had donned the Blue & White of Sodbury in the Western League. After several meetings at The Bell Inn (Now Brooks Bar & Kitchen) the new club was formed. Major L.M.Harris was President, Mr. E Purbrick Chairman, Mr. C Phelps Vice Chairman, Club Captain Dennis Greenaway and Youth Captain Michael Boulton. In the initial 1959/60 season they entered a senior team into The Dursley & Wotton League and a team into the Youth Section. The following season Sodbury joined the Bristol and District League and throughout the 60's remained in Division 3.

The 1970's began with relegation, when we finished bottom of Division 3 and the slump continued in 1971/72 Season when finishing bottom of Division 4. The Mid 70's saw a few changes and the ground work of the team today. Mike Fox became player Manager and 'The Sods' began a Sunday Side. In the 1976/77 Season, Sodbury finished third in Division 5 and gained promotion. The 1978/79 Season saw us go one better and finished runners-up of Division 4. To finish the decade off and celebrate twenty years of the club's rebirth, we won the Championship of Division 3 in 1979/80.

The 1980's began were the 70's left off and a fourth place finish gave Sodbury promotion to Bristol and District Division 1. 1981/82 saw the rebirth of our Reserve side and by the end of the season, the 1st's had gained promotion to the Senior Division. From Division 5, to the Senior League in six seasons. The first season in the Senior division was mid-table finish and the end of the season saw Mike Fox's testimonial and an Ashton Gate appearance against Mangotsfield united. The following season we finished third. After finishing 15th in 1985/86 we were relegated to Division 1, where we remained until finishing runners up in 1988/89.

The 1990's kicked off with a third place finish and promotion to the Bristol Premier Combination Div 1. in 1990/91. The early 90's saw a new clubhouse and changing rooms built with Players and Committee members contributing their trades. A fourth place finish and the winning of the Premier cup in 1992/93 was the clubs best season so far. The Sods remained in Division 1 until the end of the nineties, when they were promoted to the Premier Division for the 1999/00 Season.

The 2000's and after 3 seasons in the Premier, the Sods were relegated at the end of 2001/02 season. A new manager and new era began in 2002/03. Les Underdown and his Assistant Jeff Clark both ex-players with the club took over the reins. A mid table finish in their first season, saw Les leave and left Jeff in the hot seat. The following season saw another mid-table finish and the Reserves become Champions with the exciting players now in the squad. 2004/05 ended in a disappointing third place but the club now had a third team as well. The following season, the previous year was forgotten when the club won the Championship and promoted back to the Premier division. A mid table finish in the Premier division and the other 2 teams both winning promotion was a good season in 2006/07. 2007/08 became the clubs most successful season, when the first's won the Championship of the Premier and the reserves Champions of Bristol & District division 1. The first season and a change of manager in the Gloucestershire county league and the team finished bottom of the league, only winning 5 games. Even though the club finished bottom, they were not relegated. Mark Stenner was appointed manager and he started the steady march up the County league.

The 2010's has produced the club's most successful time in their history. Mark Stenner had

taken the team to a third place finish in the County league in 2010/11. After his departure early the following season, Scott Gibson took over. A disappointing bottom place finish was followed by two seasons of rebuilding and climbing the league. Karl Reese was appointed new manager at the beginning of 2014/15 season and in his first season had promoted the club from the County league to the dizzy heights of Western League football with a third place finish. Not a bad start for the new gaffer but with some new faces and playing great football, we went 1 better the following season and won the Western League Division 1 Championship. 2016/17 and the Western League Premier division was tough but a very creditable 13th position and competing in the F.A. Vase was our most successful season so far. 2017/18 was going to be a massive mountain to climb. Karl had left the club and also half the first team had departed to pastures new. Enter Neil Simons our new gaffer, a season in the Western league to take on with half a team and to make things a little more difficult, your first game is the clubs first ever game in the F.A.Cup. The season ended with a 13th place finish, an FA Cup victory and a quarter final place in the GFA Challenge trophy. Early in the 2018/19 Season Neil decided to leave the club and shortly afterwards we appointed our present manager Joe White and his assistant Steve. At the end of the season under his leadership, the club had finished 10th in the Western League and had the best run in the FA cup in the clubs history. The club were successful in their appeal against the Hellenic League, sideways move by the F.A. So 2019/20 season was in the Western League Premier. The uncertainty of which League we would be playing in, unsettled the players and so several departed the Club before a ball was kicked that Season. Three weeks before the season started the club also lost our Manager and his Assistant. Justin Bishop & Scott Gibson took control of the 1st team as Caretaker management and remained there until the League came to an abrupt halt. The F.A. announced on 26th March 2020 that the Step 1-7 game and all grassroots football leagues and competition under its umbrella had ended, as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic. All results for the season would be expunged.

The 2020's begin with Jeff Roberts and his team, Drew, Sean & Nick steering the 1st Team. The season was to be curtailed due to Covid-19. The 2021/22 season is now looking more promising with the new FA restructuring of the leagues; the football club can now begin their journey together with Jeff and his team in the Hellenic League -Premier Division. This is exciting times for the club and who knows where it will end!

Foe the rest of the club - The Reserves have a new manager in Justin Carpenter having taken over from Les Theobald who is now concentrating on General Secretary duties. Justin is a ex Sodbury member of the club who had a successful period at Brimsham Green and who is entrusted now to take the team to the Gloucester County League. The A team is still under the guidance of Ricky Gray who has seen the team move up the league ladder to the Bristol and District Senior Division; highest ever achieved by the A team.

The Women are in their second season in the South West Regional League (Tier 3). Hopefully this season manager Jake Scanlon and his team like everyone will have an undisrupted season. Jake has high hopes for promotion from this group.

The two Under18 teams , one midweek and one Sunday are under the stewardship of Mark Lloyd and Steve Woodruff (midlweek) and Brian Cook (Sunday). Both teams are in the process of finalising their squads ready for the start . The football club hopes that some of these boys will eventually be playing for the Senior Mens teams.

The Committee have worked tirelessly over the enforced break to update and move forward the club. We are all volunteers and always welcome more people to join this fantastic club.

Shorn of a number of key players, Mustoe's squad had become increasingly youthful in the closing weeks of the season and he was forced into more changes for the visit of one of the league's most capable teams.

First half goals from Jake Brown and Ed Plackett had probably taken the tie beyond Rovers, but George Box's excellent finish confirmed the inevitable half-way through the second period and Rovers' season ended with the Premier Divison place safe, which had been the priority when Mustoe had arrived at the club in January.

Step 5 play-offs to be introduced from 2023-24

The Football Association have recently revealed traditional four-team play-offs will be introduced for all Step 5 leagues from next season to replace the current Inter-Step playoffs.

The move, subject to FA Council approval, will guarantee two clubs are promoted into Step 4 each season from the 16 Step 5 divisions – one as champion and a second through the play-offs. At the end of the 2023-24 season, two clubs will be relegated from each of the eight Step 4 divisions in order to increase league sizes to 22 clubs. There will be one relegation spot from each Step 5 division.

From 2024-25, four teams will be relegated from every Step 4 division, while Step 5 will revert to two relegation places. The Inter-Step play-offs were introduced last season with clubs finishing third and fourth bottom of Step 4 at risk of relegation through one-off winner-takes-all matches against Step 5 runners-up.

An FA statement read: "Subject to FA Council approval, the Inter-Step Play-Offs currently in place at Steps 4 and 5 of the National League System (NLS) are to be replaced after the 2022/23 season.

"The change will see the introduction of a traditional four-team Play-Off in each of the sixteen Step 5 divisions – thus guaranteeing a second promotion place from Step 5 to Step 4, subject to Clubs meeting the eligibility criteria which includes an independent ground grading assessment.

"At the end of the 2023/24 season, this will mean that an additional 16 Clubs will be guaranteed promotion from Step 5 to Step 4 (32 Clubs in total), with the number of Clubs automatically relegated from each of the eight Step 4 divisions to remain as two in order to increase the divisional size at Step 4 to 22 Clubs per division. The resulting 16 vacancies at Step 5 will be filled by only relegating one Club per Step 5 division, as opposed to two.

"From the 2024/25 season, it is intended that the number of Clubs automatically relegated from each of the eight Step 4 divisions to Step 5 will increase from two to four, two Clubs from each of the sixteen Step 5 divisions will continue to be promoted to Step 4 (one automatic and one via the Play-Off) and the number of clubs automatically relegated from each Step 5 division will revert to two.

"These changes reflect a long-term aim of The FA to create consistency at each Step level of the NLS pyramid."

Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a Premier Division fixture at Glevum Park a brace from Brennan Denness-Barrett and a Lewis Bainbridge goal were enough to help us complete a league double over Chipping Sodbury Town, although it proved to be the penultimate win under Rich Cox's leadership, with Rovers only recording one more win before his departure in December 2022...

UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 3-1 CHIPPING SODBURY TOWN TUESDAY, 19 OCTOBER 2021



For the second Tuesday evening in a row Rovers would play host to a club two points and two places below them in the Hellenic Premier table. It would also, as with Calne Town seven days earlier, be an opponent Tuffley had already beaten in their away league fixture, 3-2 at The Ridings on the 4th of September. A third coincidence was that the Sods, like Calne, had also lost a Saturday home match before travelling to Gloucester in the following midweek. But statistics alone don't determine results. Both clubs needed points quickly to move away from the division's bottom three.

Considering how handicapped they were by having to play their first eleven League and Cup matches of the season away from their Glevum Park home, Rovers have three wins and three draws from the seven matches since their short-term exile ended with the latest of those victories coming with a disciplined and composed performance as they brushed aside Chipping Sodbury Town in the most foul weather conditions imaginable.

Rovers kept faith with the defence which had taken a point from Bishops Cleeve three days earlier and another shut-out would have been achieved had it not been for Connor Waldon's late consolation goal for the visitors.

The Sods optimistically appealed for a penalty inside the opening minute but it was the hosts who threatened more early on. Joe Shutt had an early attempt blocked but when the same player raced on to a sublime through-pass from Joel White which took out the left full-back completely he could only watch in despair as his crisp shot crashed against a post before rebounding to safety.

At the other end Abdul Tankora, who was lively and innovative all evening, had the visitors' first serious attempt on goal but he dragged his shot wide. A shot from Waldon soon followed, which Jack Copland saved low down, the first of many excellent saves by the young goalkeeper in the first half alone. Kye Simpson was the next visiting player to threaten but his good work down the left was wasted when his cross went past several players before being cleared.

Rovers' build-up play had been patient and it wasn't a surprise when they opened the scoring. Aaron Basford made progress on the left but his shot richocheted into the path of Brennan Denness-Barrett who placed his shot carefully to goalkeeper Luke Roberts' right and into the net.

Shortly after Joe Aldridge's free-kick had cleared the crossbar as Rovers sought to increase their lead, Chipping Sodbury were awarded a free-kick in a central position twenty yards from goal. Tankora's shot was saved but as the goalkeeper recovered to claim the ball Waldon fell to the ground claiming a penalty-kick and was so incensed that his claim was turned down that he was cautioned by referee Paul Herbert for his over-exuberant protest.

Sodbury threatened more once the half-hour mark had passed. From Keane Ashwood's free-kick on the right, Matty Jenkins powered in a header from close range but Copland reacted instinctively and majestically to parry the ball up into the air, after which it was cleared for a corner. Jack then raced off his line a couple of minutes later to smother the ball as Simpson was poised to flick it past him. That save protected Rovers' lead until the interval.



Copland made another fine save from Simpson early in the second half, a crucial stop as it turned out because instead of being 1-1 it was almost immediately 2-0 to Rovers as Lewis Bainbridge cut in from the left and saw his deflected shot fly past Roberts.

A third home goal soon followed. Jamal Lawrence received

a throw-in on the left, accelerated past the defender who was confronting him and played the

ball carefully across the six-yard box. Denness-Barrett took one touch to control the ball and his second smashed it past Roberts into the net.

Copland's evening of agility and concentration continued as he parried Simpson's fierce shot; Waldon was following up but could only put his header just the wrong side of the upright.



Both teams made substitutions as the rain lashed down harder than ever. Jacob Geddes had a tame shot which Roberts dealt with easily but as the rain finally eased in the closing minutes Chipping Sodbury pulled a goal back. Waldon found himself in space mid-way inside the Rovers half and dragged the ball a little to the right before firing in an explosive shot with his right foot which even Copland could not reach but there was no shame in that because his handling, distribution and agility had already been a key feature of the evening's action.

So Rovers moved up into 15th position in the table and left Chipping Sodbury looking nervously over their shoulders at the three clubs below them. Considering that only three of Tuffley's thirteen league fixtures so far have been home games, they can be pretty satisfied that they have collected sixteen points and know that another couple of wins are quite likely to take them into the top ten, which would have seemed a long way off after they had started the season with three successive away defeats.


