# CHAIRMAN'S COMMENT



Good evening and welcome to Glevum Park. A warm welcome to our near neighbours and opponents this evening from Brimscombe & Thrupp FC, and to all of their players, management, committee and supporters.

It is the final home game of the season for our first team and what an odd season it has been, albeit not over yet. I was very optimistic about this season but anyone who knows Tuffley Rovers, will be aware that we do not like to make life easy for ourselves. Throw in a few more challenges, such as the newly installed drainage system collapsing as the season got underway, and given how we wanted (and expected) the playing surface to be like we when started the work two years ago, you then start to get a small insight into how we will be glad to see this season draw to a close!!

I am hoping that by the end of this evening's game other results earlier in the week will have gone our way, so that we will have secured our place in this league for the 2023-24 season. If not, then we will have to wait another few days to find out our fate.

Whatever happens, I would like to thank everyone who has supported the club, both on and off the field, over this season as, without the support, the club simply would not survive. The league standing may not be pretty, but we sure do like to make things interesting here at this great club. A special thank you to all of the volunteers that give up countless hours for us on match days but also behind the scenes.

Off the field we have been successful in our bid for a Levelling Up grant through Gloucestershire County Council towards us redeveloping our social club and youth changing rooms site on Tuffley Avenue. This bid will be released in the press by Gloucestershire County Council in the coming weeks, but following an application process and interview, we have been awarded £37,500 to add to the Gloucester City grant of £200,000 we have been allocated from a pot of section 106 funding. We are now requesting that some local construction organisations to tender for the work. We have set up a Crowdfunder to support us in realising this development and there are posters with QR codes on them within the bar area, that if you wish, you can donate via the QR code and we are aiming to raise £10,000 and commence the work in early May 2023.

I hope everyone enjoys the game and hospitality here tonight and has a safe trip home.

After what has already been a tough season where we had to rebuild a squad, it is in our own hands if we want to make sure we stay in this league and we will be fighting right to end to ensure this happens.

Monday's win against Chipping Sodbury Town should be a result that will give us confidence, as will our previous home win, and when results and performances were required most we have delivered.

## Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17<sup>th</sup>. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10<sup>th</sup> placed finishes, before a 15<sup>th</sup> place finish in 2018/19.

Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17<sup>th</sup> place).

## Brimscombe & Thrupp – History

Brimscombe A.F.C. was founded in 1886 – the same year as the Gloucestershire Football Association!



The G.F.A. friendlies were played until the competitive league was formed in 1890. In 1902 the Stroud League was founded and Brimscombe were its first winners. Just after the First World War the Northern Senior League appeared. Its first season was 1922 and once again Brimscombe were the very first champions. Football was interrupted during the Second World War (1939–1945) but the game continued at 'The Meadow' where matches between the Army, Navy, Air Force and a team called 'Brimscombe Wanderers' took place.

When the Gloucestershire County League was first formed in 1968/9, Brimscombe – affectionately known as "The Lilywhites", were again founder members, along with other local sides Forest Green Rovers and Stonehouse Town. In 1973/4 The Lilywhites, amid some controversy, found themselves back in the Senior League, just failing by one vote to secure a place in the Hellenic League.

It was at this time the Club experienced a difficult period and in the late 1970's Brimscombe and Thrupp amalgamated to secure both Club's futures. The Club hit a purple patch in the 1980's and won the Senior League Division One and Two and the County Cup all in the space of three seasons, eventually being promoted back to the County League and finishing 4th in 1987. There then followed many years of varying fortunes for the club including relegation to the lower leagues. However, in 2008 there were major changes to the Club Committee and the Football Management which immediately brought a successful period for the club.

In season 2008/9 the First Eleven managed by Phil Baker were Runners-up to Longlevens and were promoted once again into the County League for the third time in its History.

In 2011 Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. won the Gloucestershire County League for the first time and gained promotion to the Hellenic League under Phil Baker. Since promotion major redevelopments of the ground have taken place including an extension to the clubhouse and the installation of floodlights.

Season 2012/13 saw Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. win the UHlsport Hellenic League Division 1 West and gain acceptance into the Premier League. More ground improvements were undertaken which included a new 100 standing/100 seating stand and further walkways around the pitch.

Season 2013/14 saw Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. playing in the highest league in the clubs history, the ground improvements were complete with the new stand finished and other improvements made. The club experienced its first ever F.A. Vase football and were quite successful reaching the first round proper. The season was also made memorable with the First XI winning three cup finals – those being the Stroud & District Charity Cup, the Hellenic League Flying Press Floodlit Cup and the Hellenic League Supplementary Cup.

Season 2014/15 was another historic occasion with the side playing in the F.A. Cup for the first time in its history.

The club continued to go from strength to strength during season 2015/16 and saw the team end in fifth position, its highest league finish in its history. The upgrade of the club continues with works being carried out as required by Step 5 football.

2016/17 was another great season for the club when we appeared in three cup semi finals and saw the club have their best FA cup to date, eventually losing in the third qualifying round at Weymouth.

Season 2017/18 saw Brimscombe & Thrupp win the GFA Trophy for the first time in its history and finish sixth place in the League.

Season 2018/19 saw us reach our highest league position in the clubs history, however, second place was not enough to see us gain promotion.

Season 2019/20 was virtually wiped out by the Covid pandemic which affected all levels of football throughout the country this continued into season 2020/21 which also had restrictions put on us.

Season 2021/22 gave us a season with Covid restrictions which in most cases were lifted, it was in this season we once again made the GFA Cup final, however, disappointingly lost, but once again we finished the season in a creditable ninth place.

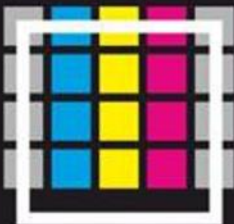

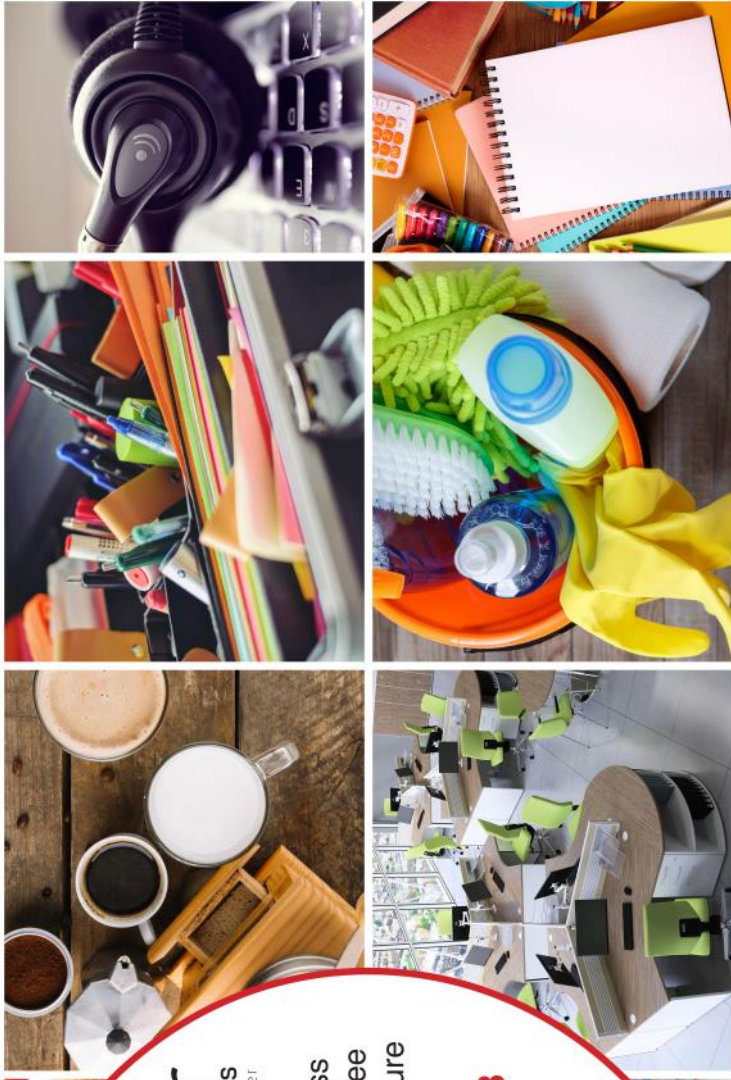

# ON (OR AROUND) THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had a few games on or around 14 April that we have selected to reflect on our fortunes on this this particular date...

## 14 April 2010

Tuffley Rovers returned from a midweek trip to Hanham Athletic with a much needed 3-0 victory, as they continued to battle their way through a backlog of fixtures in the Gloucestershire County League.

After playing just three times between mid-December and the end of February, this was Rovers' ninth game in 40 days, but it was the first of ten in the next 31 days, and as they looked to get through 18 games in relatively quick succession, the ease of the win against Hanham was probably what was needed.

Goals from Richard James, Mark Pritchett and Patrick Boyd, without reply, were enough to secure three points and kept alive hopes of a promotion opportunity.

## 12 April 2011

Tuffley Rovers returned from an enthralling midweek game at Kings Stanley, in the Gloucestershire County League, with a hard-fought 3-2 win that saw them move within a point of their hosts on the evening, although the porous nature of both defences was probably ample evidence as to why two good teams will not be challenging for honours come the end of the season.

A game played at a frenetic pace saw the hosts score through Matthew Davis and Sam Prior, but Rovers took the points thanks to a brace from Scott Jones and a goal from Richard James.

## 16 April 2013

Hosts Tuffley Rovers secured a solid 2-0 win over visitors Hanham Athletic at Glevum Park, with goals from Leone Cornwall and Mark Wallington enough to secure all three points, against a visiting side who played much of the game with ten-men after Daniel Fletcher's dismissal.

The win kept alive Rovers' title ambitions, as they went level on points at the top – and level of goal difference, but inferior on goals scored – with Bristol Academy.

## 15 & 16 April 2016

If there was ever the toughest way in which a team was required to secure two wins needed to avoid relegation, Tuffley Rovers were probably given that envious task and some, as they faced Oxford City Nomads, away, and then league champions Kidlington Town, again away, with less than 17 hours between the conclusion of one game and the kick-off for the second.

On Friday evening (7:45pm KO), Rovers battled hard to stay in the game against mid-table Nomads and at half-time it was 0-0, and all to play for. However, despite Warren Mann's second-half goal, the hosts took the win – a confirmed Rovers would finish in a relegation place – courtesy of goals from Billy Gillett and substitute Louis Joyce.

Rovers then made the trip to Kidlington for a 3pm kick-off. Before the game the champions were awarded the winners' trophy and after dropping only 15 points all season would have been expected to stroll to a win over their visitors. However, Shayne Bradley's side had other ideas!

Mann gave Rovers the lead after just 7 minutes, but it looked like a step back into reality on 21 minutes, when Lewis Coyle set-up Kristian Thomas to make it 1-1. Quite the opposite, as first Ryan Williams produced a great finish to make it 2-1 on 34 minutes, then 4 minutes later Jordan Fletcher had the freedom of Kidlington, as he found himself totally unmarked making it 3-1.

Half-time came and went, as did the chances for Kidlington, who were consistently denied by a combination of solid defending and quality goalkeeping from Aaron Taylor, but they eventually reduced the arrears on 72 minutes, as Ancalet Odhiambo poked home from close range.

When Ryan Brooks equalised on 81 minutes it looked like Rovers' luck was up, but they managed to hold out in the closing moments and left Yarnton Road with a very impressive 3-3 draw that will do nothing for their league position but did ensure the season ended on a high.

## 14 April 2018

Bracknell Town underlined their credentials as title challengers and promotion favourites against Tuffley Rovers, but only after they saw off a determined display from Mark Pritchett's team.

Ryan Davis was drawn into a rash challenge on Terence Bohane, as they competed for the ball just inside the Rovers area, and Seb Bowerman was presented with the opportunity to open the scoring from the penalty spot; one he did not waste. Bracknell showed their clinical side, after 18 minutes, when Bowerman's corner was headed back across goal and into the top corner by centre-half Joe Gator, who produced an excellent header from a difficult angle.

Just two minutes later, Rovers were back in the game, as top scorer Brett James found space on the edge of the box, before driving home a shot that Bracknell's keeper Chris Grace appeared to misjudge, as the ball bounced in off the post and across the line, to make it 2-1.

After the see-saw nature of the first period, it was something of a surprise that neither side scored in the second and Gator's goal ultimately proved to be decisive in a game that Bracknell deservedly won, but not without having to show the quality of champions.

## Previously against today's opposition at Glevum Park

The last time we hosted today's visitors in a Premier Division fixture at Glevum Park in early January 2023, it was officially Neil Mustoe's first game in charge and although it ended in a defeat, we scored for the first time in 648 minutes...

### **UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION TUFFLEY ROVERS 2-6 BRIMSCOMBE & THRUPP MONDAY, 3 JANUARY 2022**

Given an awful run of form dating back to the end of October, there has been little to celebrate at Tuffley Rovers, but in his first game officially in charge of the club (albeit his second appearance in the dugout), Neil Mustoe saw his side end one barren run as they finally scored a goal in a Hellenic League fixture, 648 minutes after their last. That the goal – a rather scrambled and otherwise unmemorable effort from Will Ramsey – was the first by a Rovers player since Joe Shutt scored an early goal in a game at Roman Glass St George on 3 November is perhaps the most obvious illustration of the problems that have blighted Rovers' season.

Mustoe made two changes to the starting line-up, following the defeat at home to Longlevens, with Aaron Basford and Ramsey called up in place of the Demilade Yussuf and the suspended Warren Mann. Brimscombe arrived at Glevum Park without their manager, Sam Prior, who had suffered the tragic loss of his father less than 48 hours earlier.

After an impeccably observed minute's silence, the game kicked off at a lightening fast pace, in front of a healthy sized Bank Holiday crowd, and the visitors almost had an early lead, as Sam Folkes' cross was met by Ben Baxter, whose header fell neatly into the path of Ollie Pitt, but he was crowded out and his shot deflected wide of Jack Copland's goal. Jonty Welch fired over from the resultant set-piece.

Pitt had been denied but he successfully turned provider on 11 minutes, as his free-kick found Kyle Pitts at the back post and the Thrupp defender has given the freedom of Glevum Park as he stooped down to head the ball into the Rovers net from close range.



Given Rovers' goal drought, a single goal lead for the opposition would inevitably bring fear and so Mustoe would have been grateful to see Welch waste another chance, two minutes later, as he headed over from close range.

The recalled Aaron Basford then had Rovers' first chance of note, only to put his shot straight at Gavin Jones in the visiting goal.

However, after 18 minutes the moment that the hosts' fans had been waiting for finally arrived. After Jones' kick failed to get the required distance, Elijah Simpson miscontrolled and the ball was picked up by Jamal Lawrence, who burst through two challenges before rolling the ball across the Brimscombe goal line and Ramsey, arriving late, made enough contact with the ball to loop it towards the goal, with Baxter's desperate attempt to keep



the ball ultimately failing as his he could only succeed in heading the ball into his own net. The goal was credited to Ramsey, making it his first for the club.

It was almost 2-1 seven minutes later as Lewis Bainbridge carried the ball deep into the visitors territory, cut inside and fired a shot past Jones, only to see it cannon away off the frame of the goal, but by the time the half hour mark was reached, the score had turned in Rovers' favour.



When Lucas Price cut inside his man, he unleashed a rasping shot that once again beat Jones before hitting the woodwork, but this time Bainbridge was on-hand to win the loose ball and force the ball over the line to make it 2-1 to Mustoe's side.

Folkes then missed a terrific chance to instantly equalize, but the porous Rovers defence once again surrendered a lead, as Scott Nicholls made a hash of an attempt to head the ball back to Copland, allowing Jack Smith to steal possession and confidently dispatch the ball into the Rovers goal and bring the scores level on 36 minutes.

Within five minutes it was 3-2, as Folkes turned Smith's miscued effort home and then there was further misery for the hosts, as a failure to clear the ball effectively ended with Pitt teeing up Smith for his second of the game and making it 4-2 on 42 minutes.



When the interval arrived shortly after, Mustoe was left to reflect on half an hour of positives, ultimately undone by ten minutes of calamitous defending that was another illustration of the problems he will face in turning the season around.

Several substitutions interrupted the early stages of the second half but the game was largely put to bed, on just past the hour mark, when Folkes made a powerful run into the Rovers box, before crossing into the path of Welch, who made no mistake and tucked the ball beyond Copland to make it 5-2.

Further substitutions followed and chances became fewer and farther between but the result was finally sealed in Brimscombe & Thrupp's favour, with twelve minutes remaining, as Smith latched onto a loose ball from a corner to poke the ball over the line and complete his hat-trick in the process.



When the final whistle sounded Rovers were once again on the wrong end of a disappointing scoreline but there was plenty of optimism around Glevum Park, after a spirited display that has at least seen Rovers show some teeth in front of goal, as Mustoe looks ahead to the visit of Shrivenham on Saturday, 8 January and another chance to secure his first points as manager of Tuffley Rovers.
