





TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good evening and welcome to Glevum Park, including all players, officials, and supporters from Stonehouse Town FC.

After Saturday's disappointing result we need to pick ourselves up and look at the positives and put on a performance that I know we are capable of.

Results are not great at the moment, but there is a good team in there somewhere. We looked a little bit open on Saturday, but at the same time looked like getting chances and having efforts on goal, which hasn't always been the case.

We need to share the load around and get more players further up the pitch, without neglecting our defensive duties. Once we get the balance right, and a few fresh faces either coming into the club or back from injury and suspension, I'm sure we will start picking up points.

However, tonight we have a cup game that takes away the pressure of the league but has the added pressure of playing a team below us in the pyramid, who will be looking for a higher division scalp. We need to make our mark early in the game and hopefully get a positive result, so that you can enjoy your evening and the game.

Blast from the past...

In a new feature, we today look back on a previous game in the Floodlit Cup. Today we look back to Thornbury Town's visit on 10 September 2019, when Mark Pritchett's side recorded a much needed win....





BANBURY LITHO HELLENIC LEAGUE FLOODLIT CUP TUFFLEY ROVERS 6-1 THORNBURY TOWN TUESDAY, 10 SEPTEMBER 2019

A week can be a long time in football. Seven days ago Rovers were still seeking to add to their solitary competitive win of the new season (a Hellenic League Challenge Cup victory over Division Two side, Letcombe) but suffered a heavy defeat at Shortwood in the F.A. Vase. Since then Mark Pritchett's men had picked up four points from six, grabbing a narrow midweek win at Shrivenham before holding Windsor to a draw at Glevum Park when, for the second successive home league match, a 1-3 deficit was turned into a 3-3 draw with two late goals.

Visitors Thornbury Town play in Division One of the Hellenic League West, where they finished a very creditable third in 2018-19 with only Cheltenham Saracens and Easington Sports above them.

It was the hosts who cruised their way through to the next round of the Floodlit Cup after a commanding first-half performance which brought four goals without reply. Two more goals were added in the second period with only a penalty-kick bringing visitors Thornbury any reward from what turned out to be a chastening evening for them. Rovers, playing towards the open end, started positively and nearly went ahead in the opening moments when Jack Beardsell's good work on the right led to a square pass which Dominik Kent dragged narrowly wide of the Thornbury goal.

There was an early break in play when the visitors' captain Toby Bennett went down injured and when play resumed an enormous kick by Scot MacLeod was chased deep into the Tuffley half by Craig Lancastle but Macaulay Herbert snuffed out the danger. Thornbury's next attack was nearly profitable; two quick passes from Lancastle and Jim Brock left Asher Budd in space, with only Alex Avenell to beat, but he wasted the opportunity by shooting into the side-netting.

Rovers heeded this warning and were soon ahead themselves. Ross Langworthy chased a ball down the right channel and regained possession after briefly losing control of the ball. As he moved inside he saw Jack Beardsell in space and threaded the ball through to him. Beardsall took one

touch, looked up and hammered a scorching drive into the top corner well out of MacLeod's reach. The early lead was doubled only three minutes later. Rovers won a corner on the right which Paul Carter floated in with his usual dead-ball accuracy and Beardsell rose unchallenged to plant a firm header into the back of the net.

Thornbury were being pulled apart on both flanks and it wasn't a surprise that the opening two goals were quickly followed by two more. Both were crosses headed into goal by Langworthy thanks to sublime deliveries from Ben Prictor on the left and Beardsell on the right. Langworthy, in a rich run of scoring form, nearly had a first-half hat-trick when he ran from halfway and cut inside a defender but hit his shot over the bar.

A nasty clash of heads between Beardsell and Thornbury's Ollie Rawnsley led to both players being treated on the pitch and the referee called for a short water-break while that was happening. When play resumed Rovers continued to press forward with Jeremiah Idowu having a shot turned away for a corner and Kent again shooting narrowly wide.

The Thornbury players looked shell-shocked as they headed for the dressing-rooms at half-time but there was little respite for them after the second half started, at which point they brought on Luke Franklin and he would soon be joined by Dan Bright. MacLeod was having a very busy evening and reacted brilliantly to save Kent's follow-up after initially saving from Langworthy. But the next significant action came at the other end when referee Alan Robinson awarded Thornbury a penalty-kick as Prictor, played into trouble by Jack Phillips' pass across the area, felled an opposition player as he attempted to clear. Lancastle didn't hang about and buried the spot-kick straight down the middle leaving Avenell knowing that he would probably have saved if he hadn't moved slightly out of the way.

Rovers' four-goal lead was soon restored, however. Beardsell received the ball on the left following a corner on the right, spotted Mark Pritchett in space and played the ball carefully towards his central-defender. Pritchett's control was perfect and he turned and lashed the ball left-footed into the net before MacLeod had properly sensed the danger.

In the wake of Tuffley's fifth goal the hosts brought on Lewis Bainbridge for Idowu and, shortly afterwards, Jake Rhodes for Kent. But it was the final substitute who made the next telling contribution. Within seconds after coming on. for Beardsell, seventeen-year-old Niall Priday was in a perfect position to steer Bainbridge's pass into the net after a quite wonderful run by the provider from wide on the right. This was an evening when Tuffley's defence was never seriously tested. The central-defensive pairing of Pritchett and Herbert have certainly had more difficult matches but to their sides both full-backs, Isaac Lawrence and Prictor, played with composure and maturity with the latter in particular nearly always available to help create meaningful attacks down the left in the second half.

So, Rovers won their first home match of 2018-19 at the fourth attempt. A year earlier that first home victory didn't come until the eighth game so at least that awful statistic was not threatened with a repeat. With twelve goals scored in their last three matches Tuffley again proved that they have plenty of options in attack. Defensively they looked pretty solid too although not as tested as they are likely to be in most league games. Thornbury will have learned much from this evening as well. The scoreline does not flatter them because it was one-way traffic for most of the evening, but they kept their heads up and worked hard and, even in defeat, showed encouraging signs which ought to help them in the weeks ahead.



Stonehouse Town FC - Club History



Stonehouse Town Football Club, popularly known as the 'Magpies' because of their Black and White striped strip, starts at the Youth level, from 4 years old all the way through to under 16s, as well as girls' age groups at u12s, 14s & 16 and Adults. Notwithstanding the youth section, the highly popular senior part of the club runs a 1st team in the Hellenic League Division 1 West, plus three teams across the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and Stroud Leagues, whilst not forgetting the Veterans side playing monthly and featuring several Magpies' stalwarts.

Founded in 1898, the Magpies play at the stadium at Oldends Lane, Stonehouse, which was opened by legendary England International Billy Wright on 25th August 1949 in a friendly against Cheltenham Town, and features the Mike Smith Stand, dedicated to our long-serving Secretary Mike 'Spike' Smith.

During the Club's heydays in the 1950s and 1960s, the Club regularly hosted attendances of over 1,000 spectators, and the record attendance for the Ground is 5,500 for a game against Gloucester City on 29th September 1951 in the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round.

The Club's record Receipts for a single game was at the same game, when we received £272/8s/9d, worth £8,502 in today's money, although 6000 attended the 1962 Stonehouse Invitation XI v the All-Stars Showbiz XI, which featured a range of (then!) huge celebrities such as Jimmy Young and Pete Murray!

We were the first ever winners of the Gloucestershire County League in 1968/9 season, but it took almost 30 years to re-enter the League after relegation in the early 80s. Promotion in 2014/5 was achieved via the Runners Up slot in Gloucestershire Northern Senior League Division 1, under Haydn Murray's stewardship, whereupon we were looking forward to cementing our place back in the County League, or even beyond. Season 2014/5 was also when we won a cup double via the Senior Amateur County Cup (1st time since 1976) and the Premier Section of Stroud Charity Cup, as well as reaching the Reg Davis Cup Final, where we lost 3-2 to Newent Town FC.

After a number of seasons finishing in the Top 4 in the Glos. County League, Season 2018/19 saw us finish in 3rd place once again, but that was enough to secure much-coveted promotion to the Hellenic League Div. 1 West for the first time. This season, the 1st Team have a new management team in place.




