EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Welcome to everyone visiting Glevum Park this afternoon for the visit of Slimbridge. I would like to welcome all their players, supporters and officials to our home.

What a frustrating season this has been so far. We barely seem to have played a home Saturday fixture in the Hellenic League, and the weather is now poor when we seem to have a string of games! Our drainage system is good but pitches need rest when battered by the elements and we have the challenge of hosting three teams on our surface. I wouldn't want to reduce our number of teams but it does make for a real challenge at this time of the year.

Talking of challenges, I'd like to take this opportunity to share my opinion on the FA's disciplinary system. I've been involved in two significant cases recently and to say the system is weighted ridiculously in favour of anyone other than the players and volunteers at clubs would be an understatement.

We lost the appeal against the red card shown to Kieran Alder at Hereford Lads Club, where he apparently defied physics to headbutt an opposition player (who didn't even seem to notice) whilst his weight was going backwards, despite the submission of video evidence in support of his case. The trouble is that you have to prove the decision of the referee was an "obvious error" and because Kieran was obscured from view the decision was to dismiss our appeal. We now have a player suspended for three games and the only person who seemed to think a red card was warranted was the referee.

I don't criticise the referee, because he has to make an instant decision, based upon one view of the incident, but the panel that considered this case had the chance to look at it again and again but their analysis of Kieran's case suggests written evidence has no value, because if the video isn't conclusive, it doesn't matter.

Kieran joins Pritch, Yesh and Ashley Davies in a group of players absent due to suspension today. That is a really strong group of players and to be without them, when we play quality sides like Slimbridge, is of concern. That having been said, Muzzy has added to the squad – particularly in attacking areas – and so I hope we can give our visitors a good game today. We need to be disciplined in our approach today if that is to be a reality.

After today attention will turn to a really important game against Thornbury Town next Saturday, when we play what might be considered a traditional six-pointer!

Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to read this and support our humble football programme. I hope everyone enjoys the game. Safe travels home.

We need to put a run of winning results together as the bottom third of the table is extremely tight, and with the squad that Muzzy has put together we should be aiming to be a mid-table team. Recruitment has been positive; we just need to now see that come to fruition and kick on as a team.

TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good afternoon and welcome to Glevum Park, including all players, officials and supporters from Slimbridge.

We are looking forward to todays game, having added a few additional players to the squad to freshen it up and give a little bit of competition in areas we have not had most of the season.

After a disappointing result against Roman Glass - although we put in a good performance for about an hour - we did not manage the game while on top and leading,

We then bounced back with a win in the cup against Hereford Lads Club and kept a clean sheet. Since then we have had two good training sessions working on a few things that have cropped up in games which we need to improve.

We know today's opponents will be difficult, having already played them this season and it was one of the games I think as a whole we didn't do ourselves justice on the day, albeit I must accept that we were beaten fairly on the day by a good team and performance.

Today we need be much better and sharper all round, and fitness has improved since that day. I hope we give ourselves a chance with the right attitude and desire, because I know the ability is there, but it has only been in sporadic flashes when we need it to be more consistent in a tough league like the Hellenic Premier Division.

Being a local derby I am hoping for a reasonably decent attendance, with those here hopefully rewarded with an entertaining game with us coming out on the right side of the result.


This was a dream draw for the hosts with a local Southern League club coming up to Gloucester for the afternoon, but there were certainly words of warning to be heeded by Neil Mustoe's squad, because apart from winning at Windsor in the Extra Preliminary Round in 2021, Rovers had lost their three previous matches at this stage of the competition to Harefield United (2020), North Greenford United (2019) and Colney Heath (2018).

In addition to that, the last Southern League team to visit Glevum Park in an F.A. Cuptie, Swindon Supermarine in 2017, had inflicted a heavy defeat on their hosts but the visitors' status on that occasion had ensured a 200+ attendance at Glevum Park and Rovers would certainly be hoping to emulate or better that five years on.

Slimbridge arrived in Gloucester with four former Rovers players in their matchday squad with three of them making the starting eleven. One of them, Jacob Geddes, would have a significant impact as the match reached its closing stages. As ordinary time moved into added-time, Rovers were on the brink of a sensational victory over their Southern League neighbours, but even after Geddes' headed equaliser, Slimbridge roused themselves for one final push and were rewarded when substitute Marley Thomas cut in from the left and fired an unstoppable shot past Elliot Jones for an amazing finale to an absorbing afternoon's entertainment.

Things were much quieter at 3pm as the teams trotted out on a warm afternoon in front of a crowd that was, in fact, just short of the two hundred mark.

The Swans' tricky right-winger and former Rover Joe Shutt had an early chance to run at former team-mate Warren Mann but, interestingly, chose not to. When a similar opportunity presented itself a couple of minutes later, Joe raced past Mann but was deliberately fouled by the Tuffley captain. So Round One to Mister Shutt and an intriguing tussle which lasted for most of the afternoon.



No more real chances came until half an hour had been played when, after a neat passing move involving three or four players, Will Hawes shot narrowly past the post with his left foot. Following a Slimbridge corner on the right, Shutt's cross was headed wide by Myron Turner before a Tuffley free-kick taken by Birkett was reached by Noah Smerdon, but he could only head the ball out of play. So, the first half ended without a goal being scored.

Early in the second period Ben McLean shot wide for the Swans after Demilade Yussuf had lost possession in midfield. When Rovers won a corner on the left, the ball drifted beyond the far post but Lewis was unable to get a touch on the ball.

As the match reached a point at which substitutions would be made on a very warm afternoon, Rovers' choice of the man to come on after a mid-session water-break was the height, power and experience of 42-year-old Shayne Bradley. What an impact he would make as the match moved into its final quarter! A delightful Bradley flick on halfway sent Ryan Dobbins racing down the right-hand



channel and when he squared the ball across the Slimbridge penalty-area another substitute, Ryley Mace, controlled the ball before placing it past Adams, who was unable to recover from the position he had taken up a few seconds earlier.

Dobbins, who had worked like a Trojan all afternoon, came off and the Swans made changes as well as they tried to retrieve something from the game. Before Rovers went ahead there had earlier been an enormous scramble on their own goal-line when Jones saved a shot then lost the ball but recovered to make a second save before watching a third Slimbridge effort get hacked away from danger, but the pressure was mounting.



Mann was cautioned for chopping down Hawes and Slimbridge won corners on both sides. From what seemed likely to be the final play in normal time, a left-wing corner was met by Geddes at the far post and his firm downward header rippled the net after passing a motionless goalkeeper.

At that point both teams would probably have settled for a replay, but the momentum of equalising so late pushed Slimbridge on. When the ball reached Thomas near the left touchline, there seemed no immediate danger, but the substitute cut inside, danced into the penalty-area and hit a sublime shot up and over Jones into the far corner. It was a goal fit to win any game ... and it won this one.



Every player in both teams gave their all during a frenetic second half. Rovers could have managed the match better after going ahead but their opponents just wouldn't give up. It is a cruel way to lose and an uplifting way to win. It wasn't just Slimbridge's team that won. The game of football was a winner too. Rovers will play worse and win; Slimbridge will play as well and might not. That is what sport is like. In defeat you have to lift yourself to avoid what happened here happening again any time soon.

Rovers have just three days before Malvern Town come to Glevum Park, the Hillsiders having also drawn their opening league match of the season in the midweek before the FA Cup-ties. Both urgently want that first three points of the season but Rovers have the motivation to quickly get Saturday's heartbreak out of their systems quickly.

On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've only played once on 9 December, but have had plenty of games on the dates either side. We've selected a few to reflect our fortunes on or around this particular date...

6 December 2014

Tuffley Rovers secured an impressive victory over Hook Norton – and revenge for a 3-1 defeat earlier in the season – although they did it the hard way in this Hellenic League, Division One (West) fixture, as they fell behind early on, to Sam Grant's opener.

Moments before the interval, Rovers levelled as Mark Ford netted from close range after Shayne Bradley's effort had been blocked on the line.

An error from Norton's Kurt Fox saw Ford get his second shortly after the restart and they took control of the game on 67 minutes, as Marcus Foxwell scored from the edge of the box, then Brett James made it 4-1. In the closing moments Jordan Dowdeswell made it 5-1 and Warren Evans' side were left to reflect on a good afternoon and a valuable three points.

9 December 2017

Tuffley Rovers returned from their trip to Burnham having recorded a second consecutive Uhlsport Hellenic League win, in a four day period, helping them move up to ninth in the table in the process.

Rovers were by far the better side but it took until 40 minutes for them to seize the lead, from the most unlikely of sources. Courtney Hamilton, without a goal since March 2015 and with only two goals in the past $4\frac{1}{2}$ years, met Sam Hill's low cross to the front post with a neat touch that went beyond Gibson and into the bottom corner of the Burnham net.

Shortly after the interval, Warren Mann converted from the penalty spot and although Rovers had plenty of possession that was the way the score remained and Rovers left with a valuable 2-0 victory.

10 December 2019

Two footballing clichés operated in tandem at the HDAnywhere Stadium on Tuesday evening, as a game of two halves well and truly proved that football is a funny old game of cup football!

Mark Pritchett scored a hat-trick and Joe Shutt got another goal, as Rovers roared into a 4-0 lead, but the hosts fought back to secure a 4-4 draw with a 95th minute injury time goal.

Pritchett was then dismissed at the end of the game but his side didn't let him down and secured a 4-1 win on penalties, with Luke Merchant saving two of the three Malvern efforts he faced.

Club History

The Gloucestershire village of Slimbridge is world renowned for its Bird Sanctuary, but much hard work has gone into making Slimbridge better known in football circles.



The Club's history can be traced back to the 1899/1900 season, when the team were playing in local football at various venues in and around the village.

It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road (now renamed as Thornhill Park) became the club's home, and it subsequently became the legal property of the club after former player, and ex-Chairman of the club, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed the land to the Club in his Will, with the Club becoming legal owners in 1960. It was to prove an incredibly valuable treasure in future years.

By 1988, the club had fallen on hard times, but fortunately, a handful of committee members led by Gordon King and Gordon Tudor kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed. Paul Chappell was to remain a vital part of the club until his retirement from his duties in 2020.

As playing standards improved, 2000 saw the completion of the building of a long-awaited Social Club in an area of the ground that in Its old life had housed a cowshed. John Mack, a successful local entrepreneur, joined the club as Chairman, and he remains a committed supporter of the club to this day as Club President.

In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager, and the club began a period of upward momentum. The team achieved a Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, and were accepted into the Hellenic League. Hellenic Division One West was won by an Eleven Point margin in 2002/03. A creditable fourth place finish was achieved in the Hellenic Premier League in 2003/04. In a marvellous season the club also claimed the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy.

Season 2004/05 again saw a fourth-Place finish in the Hellenic Premier. The club also made their first appearance in the FA Vase, which resulted in a run to the third round proper before a 2-1 extra time defeat at Western League side Backwell United. In February 2005, Gray stood down after nearly four seasons at the helm of the club.

The club started season 2005/06 under newly appointed Manager Doug Foxwell. A first entry into the FA Cup saw a visit from Wessex League side Wimborne Town. A 1-0 defeat did not dampen the sense of occasion on the first day of the season. A second successful run in the FA Vase came to an end in the Third Round Proper, with a 3-1 defeat at South Midland Premier, Welwyn Garden City.

After a record-breaking 64 game season, the team achieved a Fifth-Place finish in the Hellenic Premier, and the club also won the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy, both for the second time in three seasons.

Season 2006/07 proved to be the most successful in the Club's history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the bonus of record-breaking FA Cup and Vase runs for the senior side. In the FA Cup, a Five Match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. Along the way there were memorable wins against two other Southern Premier sides, 2-1 at Yate Town and 3-1 at home to Chippenham Town. It was six matches in the FA Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

In the Hellenic Premier Division, bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, led to half a seasons fixture being played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club Bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh. There was a rousing performance in the GFA Trophy Final against Almondsbury Town. A 3-1 victory not only retained the Trophy, but recorded a third success in four seasons in that competition.

As a result of winning the league after an inspiring final day victory, and the upgrade to the ground facilities at Wisloe Road, the club were promoted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, however, there was a twist to come in the tale.

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the promotion, and effectively, the first team took over the position in the pyramid occupied by the reserve team, which was disbanded.

The First Team reverted to the Gloucester Northern Senior League. This meant a severe upheaval in the club both on and off the field with the manager Doug Foxwell and several senior players moving on the pastures new.

However, a loyal band of players stayed on including James Cole, who over as player manager with assistance from long term club captain Leon Sterling to begin the next stage of the club's journey.

Four promotions followed as the club regained their previous status. James Cole handed over to Leon Sterling, who moved into the Manager's role, with Leon joined as Assistant Manager by long time Slimbridge stalwart Freddy Ward. The two guided the side to three top six finishes in their first three seasons back in the Hellenic Premier.

After the completion of the 2012-13 season, the Swans applied for a transfer to the Toolstation Western Premier League to reduce prohibitive travelling costs, a move which was approved by the FA in the Summer of 2013.




