Today, I will offer a warm welcome to our opponents Corsham Town and their players, coaching staff, committee and supporters.

I am writing this before our fixture against Brimscombe and Thrupp, which I feel is, barring a Christmas miracle, likely to be postponed due to the weather over the weekend. However, if it does go ahead, then it was a fantastic victory or a very unlucky loss!! :)

Prior to the Brimscombe game we have managed an excellent three points at our local rivals Longlevens, which is long overdue and we won the game convincingly after going a goal behind. Sadly, I couldn't be at the game to see how much it meant.

We played Wantage on the Saturday before and found ourselves two goals behind in only eight minutes. A Jake White goal in the 90th minute meant we left with all three points and a much needed lift in the league. A point the week before against Thornbury in a game that was a ugly to watch, as you could ever imagine has meant we have built some momentum and Muzzy is having to leave players out week in, week out now which is excellent in terms of competition for places.

We know today will be as tough as any challenge we will face against the title chasers and a team that is always very strong. Even a point today will seem like a victory, so fingers crossed for an exciting game of football here.

TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good afternoon and a Happy New Year to you all, as we welcome everyone to the first game of 2024 at Glevum Park and we host Corsham Town.

A warm welcome to all their players, officials and supporters who make the journey here today, in what I hope will be an entertaining game and a good start to the New Year.

Boxing Day was unofficially my two-year anniversary as manager and what a way to celebrate it with a well deserved win against our local rivals, Longlevens!!

I write this before our fixture at Brimscombe & Thrupp and I am hoping we will have added to our seven points from our last three games, which has been more pleasing as we have had to come from behind in all three games to get a result.

Corsham Town are always strong and it is always a tough encounter. Without Worcester City in the league this year they would probably have been favourites to win it and I'm sure they will want to put pressure on City and push them all the way. We, however, will want to continue our run and momentum and kick start the New Year in the right way. The squad is strong at the moment and it is difficult to leave players out but competition is good as it brings out the best in you.

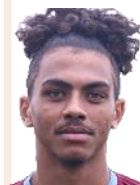

On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've never played on this particular date, but have had plenty of games on the dates either side. We've selected a few to reflect our fortunes on or around this particular date...

5 January 2008

Tuffley Rovers moved back into second spot in the Gloucestershire County League with a 2-1 success at Thornbury Town.

Thornbury took the lead on 10 minutes, from a Pete Fowler header, but Mark Wallington levelled on 20 minutes. The winner came from the penalty spot in the 70th minute after Paul Taylor who had just come on as a sub committed a foul in the area and Ben Surman netted from the spot to give Rovers the points.

7 January 2012

Tuffley Rovers closed the gap on league leaders, Henbury, as they recorded an excellent 4-2 victory at Glevum Park. Johnny Meadows opened the scoring, before Henbury equalised. Rovers then scored three more – through Dean Gorman, Shayne Bradley and Jivan Bryan-Munroe - before a late Henbury goal reduced the arrears.

5 January 2013

Tuffley Rovers continued to lead the Gloucestershire County League table after a 2-0 victory over Henbury.

Shayne Bradley, who had been suffering from an injury for some time, played through the pain barrier and was rewarded when he opened the scoring for Rovers in the 39th minute from close range.

It was Bradley involved again with the second goal, setting up debutant Nathen King to net in the 61st minute, giving Rovers the perfect start to the New Year.

7 January 2017

Tuffley Rovers continued their good Hellenic League Premier Division form as they swept aside Brackley Town Saints 5-0 at Glevum Park. Two goals from Warren Mann and a Jamie Goodwin effort made it 3-0 at the interval. Mann completed his hat-trick in the second half, with Goodwin also

getting another to complete the rout.

5 January 2019

Tuffley Rovers earned a valuable point, for the second successive Saturday, as they shared six goals with visitors Holmer Green, in a most enthralling encounter at Glevum Park.

Shayne Bradley scored within 54 seconds of the game starting, but Curtis Stone equalised for the visitors. Bradley's second – a penalty – was quickly followed by a second leveller from Eliot Britton, as the teams traded goals. Dean Powles then gave the visitors the lead for the first time, but Dean Munday's own goal restored parity with half an hour to play. Amazingly, that was the end of the scoring and the game finished 3-3.

A rare Isaac Lawrence goal proved enough to help Tuffley Rovers advance in the GFA Challenge Trophy, as they defeated Hardwicke 1-0 at Green Lane. It appeared as though the interval would arrive without Rovers' pressure providing a telling moment, but they finally broke down Hardwicke's resistance moments before half-time, when Ben Pricor's cross was palmed down by Tom Kaye, under pressure from Jake Rhodes, and Lawrence smashed the ball home from close range.

Rovers should have extended their lead, as they were camped in their hosts' half during the second period but were restricted to a handful of wayward shots that left Kaye a spectator.

Seventy-four days, eleven Hellenic League games or after 990 minutes of football, Tuffley Rovers finally recorded a Premier Division victory on Saturday, Neil Mustoe's first as team manager, albeit with the scoreline ultimately not as emphatic as it might have been, or probably should have been, as his team almost wasted a three goal lead, before running out 3-2 winners over Shrivenham.



Bristol Rovers' work experience player, Harvey Greenslade scored twice on his debut, including a goal in the first 60 seconds, and might have had a hat-trick but his second-half spot-kick was saved. Dominik Kent made it 3-0, with 19 minutes to go, and Rovers looked to be cruising to victory, but late goals from Tim Cook and Ash Taylor made for a tense finish, before the final whistle ended Rovers' wait for victory.

CORSHAM TOWN FC

FOUNDED: 1884

CLUB HISTORY

The earliest record found of Corsham Football Club is 1878 with the club becoming affiliated to the Football Association in 1893. Over the years, the team has often been referred to as the Quarrymen due to the high level of quarrying in and around Corsham.

In March 1894, the first Wiltshire Football League was formed with the original member clubs being Bradford, Calne, Chippenham, Corsham, Southbroom (Devizes), Melksham, Trowbridge Town, and Warminster. At the end of the 1894/95 season Corsham would be the inaugural champions, winning the league on goal average over Southbroom, helped by an emphatic 17 - 1 win over Calne in their final game. Promotion was achieved to the Western League at the end of the 1997/98 season after winning the county league by goal difference from Devizes Town Reserves.

Ground improvements continued under the chairmanship of Colin Hudd, floodlights were installed in 2001, a 112 spectator stand erected and hard standing laid around the pitch perimeter. 2006/07 season saw Corsham Town winning the Western League Premier Division, which was hotly contested by many teams, including Bridgwater Town and Frome Town. The club also added a third successive Wiltshire Senior Cup victory, again over local rivals Melksham Town.

Due to the Covid pandemic the 2019/20 season was declared null and void by the Football Association on 26th March 2020. The 2020/21 season saw Keiran Baggs becoming the new manager with Gary Higdon as his assistant. Unfortunately, after 10 league games the 2020/21 was curtailed by the FA due to the Covid pandemic. Despite the last two seasons being affected by Covid, the FA went ahead with planned restructuring of the Non-League Pyramid. The results from 2019/20 & 2021/21 were combined and this meant that Corsham Town were promoted.

The 2021/22 season Finished in a very creditable 5th position in the Hellenic League Premier Division and reaching the final of the Wiltshire Premier Shield Cup played at the County Ground against Swindon Supermarine. Last season the club reached the semi-final of the FA Vase, with visitors Ascot Utd winning 4 - 5 on penalties after the full-time score was 2 - 2 in front of a club record breaking 1,736 spectators. A very respectful 3rd place finish in the league was also achieved.

However, nothing there can be guaranteed, so we will focus instead on congratulating Kieran Alder who is now 7th on our goalscoring list for the period from 2007 onwards, after he moved to 31 competitive goals on Tuesday at Longlevens.



Kieran had overtaken Mark Wallington, to achieve 7th place, when he scored the winner at Hereford Lads Club and is now just one behind Marcus Foxwell, who scored 32 times between 2007 and 2018. Time is definitely on Kieran's side if he wants to make his way further up the list – here's hoping that the goals continue to flow for our playmaker!
