# TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

# MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good afternoon and we welcome to all players, officials and supporters from Roman Glass St George to Glevum Park.

It seems my tenure here seems to go on runs of various size with either good results or bad. We stopped a losing run on Saturday, after what was always going to be three tough league games, with a well-deserved point away at Mangotsfield United. I thought we were good value first half and possibly should have gone in ahead at half time, what we saw in the second half was a resilience to get a result as well as trying to win the game, but they did edge it on chances.

We have had some good performances, team and individual, over the season and that has increased in more recent weeks, but a special mention to Ellis Clifford who was drafted in late on Tuesday, due to illness in the squad when we travelled to Royal Wootten Bassett Town, not only to be involved but to start and play well earn another start on Saturday. Ellis has been a consistent performer in the U18s and Development Squad this season, and for me it was all about timing when not if I could get him involved.

On to today's game, where our opponents we will be looking to get a result and record a double over us this season, although I thought we deserved at least a point when we visited them earlier in the season. We had a good hour frustrating them, hitting them on the counterattack, and then going two goals up, but what they did show though was their quality in the way they came back and utilised their resource from the bench and got the win on the day.

We have good points tally so far and will look to win as many games as possible going in to the final third of the season but there is an air of caution - we want to pick up points where possible, should we not get the three we are after. With a few injuries and suspensions the team will need to make some changes but this gives an opportunity for someone to take their chance, just as Ellis has done in the last ten days.

I feel we are a few wins away from really looking at next season and I want to finish on a high, which hopefully will give those already here the motivation to stay and build on the progress we are making, but also encourage those looking in from afar that we may be something they want to have a look at. Today's game is the next step on that journey.

I hope you can enjoy the game.

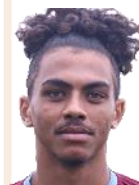

# On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've only had one game on 27 January but other fixtures around the date that we have selected to reflect on our fortunes on this particular day...

## 24 January 2009

Thornbury Town gained an excellent 3–2 victory over Tuffley Rovers in the Gloucestershire County League, to ease any fears of relegation.

Rovers took the lead, after just two minutes, when Marcus Foxwell opened the scoring, a lead the visitors held until the interval.

The second period was a different affair and Thornbury levelled on 50 minutes, when Chris Parry, hit home a sublime effort from 40 yards and they took the lead on the hour when James Derosa stabbed the ball into the net after a scramble in the box.

Rovers were back on level terms in the 70th minute when Ben Surman netted from the penalty spot but a second goal from Parry, this time a stunning free-kick ensured that Rovers, who finished with ten-men after the dismissal of Stu Griffith, left without any points.

## 28 January 2012

Shayne Bradley netted twice – with an own goal added to Tuffley Rovers' score – as he and his team mates returned from Cribbs Friends Life with a 3-0 victory that kept them at the top of the table and move four points away from their



hosts who sit in third place. Warren Mann's low

cross forced the early own goal from Cribbs' Nathan Lumber. That lead remained until the interval and Rovers were indebted to Mark Harris for a great save early in the second half, and just three minutes later Bradley scored his first to make it 2-0. Two further minutes passed before Mann gave his forward partner a golden chance to make it 3-0 and that was how it remained.

## 31 January 2015

Tuffley Rovers made it eight games unbeaten in the UHlsport Hellenic League, Division One (West), as a late Ashley Davies equaliser secured a 2-2 draw with Cirencester Town Development at Glevum Park. With keeper Aaron Taylor withdrawn from the line-up late, outfield player Marcus Foxwell ended up in goal and manager Warren Evans then lost centre-half Glenn Gittins in the pre-match warm-up to leave him without two key players.

Warren Mann gave Rovers the lead in the first half, before Jacob Davidge scored twice in the second period. Town looked on course for all three points until Shayne Bradley sent Davies clear and he showed composure to round the keeper and make it 2-2.

Tuffley Rovers advanced to the third round of the Hellenic League Challenge Cup, as they battled the elements, as much as the opposition, to overcome Milton United 3-1 at The Heights on Saturday afternoon. Mark Ford opened the scoring early on and then added his, and Rovers, second after 35 minutes. Liam Wright

then scored a goal from distance – his first for the club – five minutes before the interval and Rovers looked to be coasting. Despite being reduced to ten men for much of the second period, Milton United did score the only other goal of the game, after 65 minutes, but Rovers held out to record a deserved victory.

### 27 January 2023

Tuffley Rovers capitulated against title chasing Cribbs FC, in a Friday night fixture that was over almost before the game had started. The hosts took the lead less than 15 seconds into the game, conceded again in the 10<sup>th</sup> minute, and were 3-0 down by the time the interval arrived, despite having plenty of possession during a half that was competitive in every respect, other than the scoreline.

Any flicker of a recovery at the start of the second half was eliminated when Jake Hodgson completed his hat-trick on 55 minutes, making in 4-0 in the process, and although Rovers again showed moments of quality during the second period they had to be grateful to keeper Luke Merchant, who made some good stops to keep the score moderately respectable. He was finally beaten for a fifth time on 85 minutes, as Steve Murray netted and a Friday night out had probably turned to a night when Rovers had wished they'd stayed at home.

## ROMAN GLASS ST GEORGE CLUB HISTORY

The club Roman Glass St George is the result of an amalgamation between Bristol St George and Roman Glass. Bristol St George was formed in 1882 and is the oldest club in Bristol. They were founder members of the GFA in 1886 and won the GFA Senior Challenge Cup on two occasions 1894 and 1895, beating Eastville Rovers 3-1 on the first occasion.



The club also entered the FA Cup in 1891 and the inaugural FA Amateur Cup in 1894. The current ground at Bell Hill was opened with a match between a Bristol & District XI and the English champions Aston Villa in 1894. In 1897 the club turned professional and spent two seasons in the Birmingham & District League. The club reverted to amateur status in 1901 and continued that way until joining the Western League in 1928. In 1935 after struggling financially they dropped out and joined the Bristol & District League once again. They won the first division only once in 1949/50 but were always a leading team until they became founder members of the Bristol Premier Combination in 1957. St George played in this league winning it five seasons in succession from 1963/64 season to 1967/68 until they joined the Gloucestershire County League on its formation in 1968.

The Sixties was the Golden era for the club as in addition to winning these league titles they also managed to win the Gloucestershire Senior Amateur Cup five times, which included four successive seasons. Success was also found in the FA Amateur Cup when they regularly took on the top amateur clubs in the Country such as Hendon, Dagenham, Hayes and Leytonstone in front of crowds numbering thousands. St George won the County league in 1969/70 and was runners-up twice before a gradual decline in fortunes until in 1987 the club were expelled from the league due to sub-standard facilities. A return to the Premier Combination saw a brief improvement resulting in winning the Premier Division in 1992/93. With no promotion gained the club nosedived and were in danger of folding when Roman Glass stepped in.

Roman Glass originated as a street team called Wyndham Wanderers in 1960 and played in the Bristol Church of England League and then joined the Bristol & District League in 1974. The club enjoyed moderate success gradually climbing the leagues and in 1980 changed its name to Roman Glass. The club began to decline until in 1990 Roger Hudd took over as manager and steered them to win the Division 4 title the club continued to improve gaining successive promotions until the amalgamation in 1995.

Roman Glass St George in the Premier Combination immediately gained success, winning promotion to the Premier Division that season and then winning that league in 1998/99 season to earn promotion to the County League. The club won the County league in 2001/02 and then season 2006/07 which resulted in promotion to the Toolstation (Western) League, a league the club last played in, in 1935.

Following promotion to Step 5 of the pyramid Roman Glass St George FC had two seasons in the Toolstation Western League Premier Division and now, due to the restructure, compete in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Last Saturday he netted his sixth goal of the season, which took him to 33 in total and into sixth place in the club records (those since 2007). He had previously been on 32 and tied with Marcus Foxwell in joint 6th.

There are now only five people ahead of him and he will have Richard James' 40 goals in his sights if he can have a good end to this season. He'll need to go some to catch the top four scorers, with Mark Ford on 61, Brett James on 64, Warren Mann on 85 and Shayne Bradley leading the way on 117.

Breaking goalscoring records is probably the aspiration for every attacking player, so Brad Bevan's first for the club, in our last home game against Brimscombe & Thrupp, might mean he is the next player to start looking up the records table. You have to start somewhere....
