

Welcome to everyone visiting Glevum Park this evening for the visit of Hereford Lads Club. I would like to welcome all their players, supporters and officials to our home.

We are on a good run of form coming into tonight's game, which is a great thing to be able to say. The performances have deserved the points we've earned, whether it is down to moments of quality or application and effort, particularly in the defensive third of the field. We've been on a bit of a journey with Muzzy as our manager and I think where we are now is a reflection of his commitment to getting it right, at a pace that works for the club, rather than his own good or reputation. To put that in some context, this is his record as our manager (in all competitions) since his first official game on 3 January 2022:

I'd be happy if we could continue that excellent home record tonight; not least because it will further improve our hopes of climbing the league during the remainder of this season.

Statistics only tell you so much, but it feels like we are heading in the right direction. In Muzzy we trust!

TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th . Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good evening and welcome to all players, officials and supporters from Hereford Lads Club to Glevum Park.

We go into tonight's match high on confidence after picking up eight points from four tough games, at the end of a very tough programme in January.

We have had some battling displays and glimpse of quality but Saturday's game we had a mix of it all and were worthy winners. It was a good performance and we were able to give a Hellenic League debut to Harry Victor in goal, who did everything he needed to do, very well, but it said something about the quality of the team performance that he didn't have that much to do. He was protected by a very strong defence in front of him, with the quality filtering right through the team and that, along with quality from the bench when we needed to freshen things up, carried us to victory.

We must make sure we go into tonight's march with the right attitude, as home performances and results need to be better; although it's difficult to compare our home and away form, as we have nearly completed our away games and still have seven to play at home. Hopefully we can get the right result and performance tonight to kick start a winning home run.

The squad is strong and we have been able to rotate a few carrying niggles and the same will happen tonight.







On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've never actually had a game on 6 February, but there have been other fixtures around the date that we have selected to reflect on our fortunes on or around this particular day...

9 February 2008

A frenetic start, with two goals in the opening eight minutes of the game between Tuffley Rovers and Highridge United, set the tone for a game as the two sides played out a hugely competitive Gloucestershire County League game.



The visitors opened the scoring as Mitch Kavanagh headed home a free-kick from close range but two minutes later Mark Wallington created, and then converted, a chance for himself to finish off a good move.

Rovers took the lead on 32 minutes, as Adam Hacker got away from his marked to slot past the Highridge 'keeper.

Both sides then wasted good chances before the interval arrived with the hosts holding a 2-1 lead.

Craig Liddell should have scored shortly after the interval, whilst Rovers were denied on numerous occasions by Brimble, in the Highridge goal, who made a series of tremendous saves. He was rewarded on 63 minutes, as Kavanagh scored a second to level the scores.



With fifteen minutes to go, Wallington turned provider, as he crossed into the box, leaving Ollie Everitt to volley the ball home and secure a valuable 3-2 win for the Glevum Park side.

7 February 2015

Former Southampton centre-forward Shayne Bradley scored a late, late winner, on his return from injury, as Tuffley Rovers secured a vital three points at Fairford Town in the Uhlsport Hellenic League, Division One (West).

Ashley Davies had a first half goal ruled out due to offside, and claims for a penalty award, half-way through the second period, were waived away despite vociferous appeals.

Kieran Squires then twice produced wonderful defensive blocks to keep Fairford Town out, before Aaron Taylor helped Rovers survive a mini-onslaught that threatened their hopes to secure all the points.

If there were any fears that the game would end in a stalemate, Bradley laid those to rest on 89 minutes, with a goal of genuine quality. Squires launched a long throw that found Warren Mann, whose header onto Bradley, who controlled the ball on his chest,

swivelled and volleved home, into the top corner of the Fairford goal from 15 yards.

9 February 2019

Tuffley Rovers extended their unbeaten Uhlsport Hellenic League run to five games, as they returned from Ascot United with a point, albeit with a sense of what might have been, after playing the last half an hour against ten-men.

The hosts took the lead on 48 minutes, as Paul Carter's corner was headed away by

Ascot centre-half Chris Ellis and after the giant defender had collected the subsequent loose ball, he ran up-field, before exchanging passes with Dan Price, before delaying his shot sufficiently to roll the ball under Merchant, as he advanced from his goal.

Twelve minutes later, the game turned back in Rovers favour, as Elliott Carey collected a second caution, leaving his side to play out the remainder of the game with ten men.

With twenty minutes remaining, the scores were levelled, as James produced a fantastic pass with the outside of his right foot to steer the ball across the Ascot defensive line and into the path of Kent, who arrived at the back post to guide the ball home, back across goal and into the corner of the net. That proved to be the end of the scoring and the game ended 1-1.

4 February 2020



Luke Merchant

Goalkeeper

Returned to the club last season, after a Hellenic League Premier Division title winning season at Bishops Cleeve, and was in sensational form. A great shot stopper, commanding presence and accomplished keeper. Should surpass Bruce Perks' record number of appearances for a keeper (at Step 7 and above) this season.

Joel White

Defence

The return of 'Digger' is a massive boost and the former Rovers captain is back playing after a season managing Gloucestershire Northern Senior League, Brockworth Albion. Can play in midfield but has developed into a fantastic centre-half, who is one of the team's leaders and most dependable players.

Macaulay Herbert

Defence

Now the second longest-serving member of the first team, 'Macca' came through our U18s and is solid and dependable; an excellent defender who has been getting better with every season that passed. Has now made over 250 first team appearances, despite several injuries punctuating each season. If he can stay fit could be the second highest appearance maker in the modern era.

Alex Barrett

Defence

Joined during pre-season 2023/24 and has settled in well, offering an option at left-back. Good defensively, very competitive and carries a threat going into the opposition half. Previously with Shortwood United; now looking to step up into Helleic League, Premier Division football. Impressed during pre-season and hopes are high for the season ahead.

Mark Pritchett

Defence

Another player who tasted Hellenic League title winning success at Bishops Cleeve during his time away. Previously at Rovers as Player/Manager before stepping away from the role during preseason in 2021/22. Now back at the club his father had great success at, offering a no nonsense, uncompromising, good old-fashioned performance in every game, whilst also offering a threat in the opposition box.

Tyrese Griffin

Defence

Recently signed from Hartpury University. Leftsided player who is comfortable on the ball and works hard for the team. Can play further forward.

Dan Lander

Defence

Debut in 2022/23 after returning to the club following a spell at Quedgeley Wanderers. A good club man, who gives his all in every game. Offers height, strength and determination at centre-half, Knows his role in the side and rarely lets the team down. A real competitor, who gives his all.

Sam Hill

Defence

A full-back who returned to the club this season, after living in Dubai in recent years. Has now made over 130 appearances for the club and offers intelligence and leadership amongst other attributes. Not a frequent goalscorer but offers a good option from set-pieces and is comfortable on the ball, as well as hardworking, meaning he can't offer an option higher up the pitch.

Warren Mann

Our longest serving player and has now made over 500 appearances for the Rovers first team at Step 7 and above, which is a record for the club. 'Wazza' may now lack pace in comparison to the winger who started with the club, but is hugely committed and massively experienced. Brings energy, passion and excellent technique; he's constantly involved in every game. Practical joker off the field; usually the opposition support's least favourite player!

HEREFORD LADS CLUB

HISTORY

Hereford Lads Club was established in 1925 as a sports club for the under-privileged, initially focused on boxing and gymnastics.

Cricket and football teams were added at a later date. An adult team was later formed and became members of the Herefordshire League.

The club won the Division One title in 2002–03, earning promotion to the Premier Division, then in 2010–11 the club were Premier Division runners-up, and were promoted to Division Two of the West Midlands (Regional) League.

They were Division Two runners-up in their first season in the league, and after finishing third in 2012–13, the club were promoted to Division One.

Hereford Lads Club were Division One runners-up in 2015–16, but were denied promotion as they were unable to meet the ground grading criteria.

The following season the club reached the final of the Herefordshire County Challenge Cup, in which they lost 3–0 to Hereford FC.

The club were also Division One champions and were promoted to the Premier Division. They were finalists in the Herefordshire County Challenge Cup again in 2017–18, losing 6–0 to Hereford FC.

At the end of the 2018–19 season the club were transferred to Division One West of the Hellenic League. In 2021 they were promoted to the Premier Division based on their results in the abandoned 2019–20 and 2020–21 seasons.


