

TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th . Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good evening and welcome to all players, officials and supporters from Lydney Town AFC.

Games at home are coming thick and fast, and after our last match ended in a draw against Worcester Raiders we were disappointed with the outcome. Having watched the game back again and specifically several of the highlights, with the exception of one chance we were the team going for the win in the second half. Not so long ago we would have taken the draw, but with every throw-in and set piece we were sending players forward to get a win.

Today's opponents had great victory over Fairford in their last outing and tonight neither team really has any worries in leagues, so we have a derby game and one we want to win, as will they.

We have set our squad their own challenges and goals for the remainder of the season, so that we don't end up with a series of 'dead rubbers'.

Another one I will challenge the team with, from today, is that we have seven games left and can we get a positive goal difference? On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've played four times on 8 March, including one game against tonight's visitors, so we focus on those games and another fixture around the date that we have selected to reflect on our fortunes on or around this particular day...

8 March 2008

Tuffley Rovers and Taverners both had a player dismissed in a scrappy game in the Gloucestershire County League. Rovers almost took the lead early on, but Pete Thomas saw his header cleared off the line and it looked like the game had turned in their favour in the 35th minute, when Taverners were reduced to ten men. Adam Hacker gave Rovers the lead on 55 minutes, but minutes later he was sent off and both sides then played with ten men.

Taverners took advantage of Hacker's dismissal and levelled the score in the 75th minute, when Mark Harsant was left unmarked on the far post and he drove the ball home. Rovers almost snatched a win, but Gary Cornwall's deflected shot on goal went just over the bar with four minutes remaining.

6 March 2010

Tuffley Rovers kept up their hopes of challenging for the Gloucestershire County League title, as they record a 3-0 home victory over DRG Stapleton.

Marcus Foxwell opened the scoring for the home side after 12 minutes when he fired the ball into the roof of the net from 8 yards. After 26 minutes it was 2-0, as Ashley Davies headed home a Warren Mann cross. Rovers then went 3-0 up just before the break, when a free-kick from Marcus Foxwell was brilliantly headed home by Richard James from the edge of the box. That proved to be the end of the scoring, as Rovers recorded a second consecutive league win, after three games without a win prior to that.

8 March 2011

Tuffley Rovers secured a place in the Gloucestershire Football Association Challenge Trophy Final, as they overcame visitors Lydney Town 2-0 in an entertaining cup tie at Glevum Park.

8 March 2014

Tuffley Rovers secured an important 2-1 win, away at Malmesbury Victoria, as they continued their recent return to form after a difficult run of results during the second half of their first season back in the Uhlsport Hellenic League, Division One (West), a campaign during which

they had seen manager Doug Foxwell step away from the role.

Goals from Mark Ford and Shayne Bradley, their 13th and 11th of the campaign respectively, proved enough to secure all three points, in Rovers' first home league game since the defeat against New College Swindon on 11 January.

The victory was made all the more impressive, as injury hit Rovers had to field outfield player Marcus Foxwell in goal!

8 March 2016

In their first game since the departure of Warren Evans, a little over 48 hours earlier, Tuffley Rovers produced a spirited display, full of endeavour, as they recovered from conceding two goals in the first six minutes to make sure that league leaders Thatcham Town had to work hard for the three points on offer.

The game started badly, with Perks, recalled in goal, only able to deflect a free-kick into the path of Josh Helmore, who netted from close range on 2 minutes. Four minutes later, the prolific Shane Cooper-Clark drove home a shot from 18 yards, to make it 2-0 to the visitors early in the game. Brett James was fouled on 16 minutes, to earn a penalty, which he converted and Rovers equalised on 34 minutes, as Ryan Williams produced a wicked curving shot from 20 yards to make it 2-2 and that was how it remained until half-time.

The second half started like the first and Thatcham showed their quality, as John Bennett outpaced Marcus Foxwell to latch onto a through ball and plant the ball home as Perks advanced from his goal on 54 minutes. Within a minute, it was 4-2, as Rob Gerrard took advantage of some defensive hesitancy to net from close range and leave home supporters fearful of a rout. Those fears subsided as Rovers came again came back into the game again, on 67 minutes, when Cresswell rose highest to head home Mark Wallington's free-kick. If hopes were raised and Rovers had renewed belief that they could get a valuable point, those hopes were dashed just two minutes later, as Bennett netted again to make it 5-3.

9 March 2019

League-leaders Brimscombe arrived at Glevum Park looking to continue their title challenge, but a single goal settled this match in the hosts' favour thanks to a heroic defensive performance. Luke Merchant, Macaulay Herbert and Joel White were the catalysts for the victory, which was ultimately secured thanks to Jake Rhodes' first-half goal, after he poked the ball home from close range, having been played in by Kieran Alder. That goal was ultimately the difference between the two teams, as Rovers continued their battle to move away from the relegation places, and their visitors were left to rue a defeat that could seriously damage their title ambitions.

DOING WHAT MATTERS FOR THE TRADE

Lydney Town FC • Club History

Although Lydney is one of the main towns of the Forest area the Severnsiders have always led a very nomadic existence. With the town very much a Rugby stronghold the football club has always found it difficult to exist and although the club can trace its roots back to 1911 it never has had a sound base. The club competed in the local leagues until 1952 when they were elected to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League. In 1969 the club folded due to lack of committee. In 1971 the soccer lovers of the town pulled together and the club re-formed and in 1974 the appointment of Harold Elliott as player/coach saw many players from Lydney Juniors introduced with the resulting effect of promotion to Senior League Division One in 1976. During this period the club switched from Bathurst Park onto the Recreation Ground using the changing facilities at the neighbouring Cricket Club.



In 1979-80 after twice finishing Runners-Up they finally lifted the Senior League Division One Championship. Applications to the County League were unfruitful so the club turned to the Hellenic League, where the club held its own, but after 4 seasons the huge financial burden of the League forced the club to return to the Senior League. A dispute with the Cricket Club saw the club move back onto Bathurst Park and following this Secretary Roger Sansom, who had been elected in 1975 and who is still secretary to this day, investigated the possibility of building a clubhouse on the Recreation Ground. Unfortunately on the pitch the downward spiral continued and the club found itself back in the NGL. The players thankfully stayed together and they bounced back into the Senior League the following season. Ambitious plans to have our own clubhouse were still in the pipeline and a clubhouse was opened on Lydney Recreation Trust in 1990. In 1995 the club did the double by winning Division Two and the Forest Green Supporters Trophy, a feat they repeated in 1996-97.

In 2003-04 Manager Peter Elliott, who along with Roger Sansom are the longest serving members of the club with 40 plus years service, guided the club to the Final of the League Cup and the Senior Amateur Cup but in 2004 due to work commit- ments Peter decided to step down. The club turned to Stuart Liddington to take the helm and with Peter being persuaded to assist him they forged a very successful partnership. The addition of Pete Macklin from Cinderford Town, Danny Clarke ex-Oxford United, Matthew Timmins from Whitecroft and the return of Mark Saunders from Australia gave the club a real boost. Pete, Danny and 'Matty' provided the missing link in the goalscoring department scoring over 70 goals between them, Danny leading the way with 32 goals. The Senior League title was secured with 4 games to go and they did the double by lifting the Senior Amateur Cup. The season was complete with the news of acceptance into the County League a prize denied to them some 25 years ago. The clubs County League campaign started in unconvincing fashion with only 4 points from 3 home games but a 20 game unbeaten run saw the club take over as league leaders at the start of 2006, a position they held for the remainder of the season. Scoring goals was very much the key to winning as 87 goals proved, 'Matty' Timmins finishing the leagues leading goal scorer with 28 goals. This success was beyond the clubs wildest dreams and gave the club the opportunity of a return to the Hellenic League after 22 years. A steady start saw the club 12 points behind the leaders in October but a 6 game winning streak at the end of the year saw the club take over as leaders at the start of January. The critical game came in mid-April with fellow title contenders Trowbridge Town visiting 'The Rec'. In front of a crowd of 305 goals from Danny Clarke and Mark Crabbe secured victory and a 5 point cushion . With 3 games to go the Title was won at Malmesbury when Danny Bishop came off the subs bench to score 2 late goals and give the club an unprece- dented 3rd title in as many seasons. The squad had certainly exceeded all expectations and can guite easily be classed as the best in the clubs history. Ambitious plans for the required improvements to gain promotion were put forward and accepted by the League allowing the club to play at the highest level in its history.

A steady start was overshadowed by events off the pitch when despite gaining planning permission for erection of floodlights the club became embroiled in a sea of red tape with their landlords. To continue playing in the Premier Division an agreement was reached to use Cinderford Town and Harrow Hill for home games. Despite these off the pitch issues an unbeaten league run of 11 games placed them in the top half of the table. Despite finishing in 10th position the club were unable to satisfy the April deadline imposed by the league and were forced to be relegated back into Division One (West).

With relegation came the inevitable loss of players who wished to play at a higher level of football and the club decided to pin its future hopes on the youth of the town. Mark Lee, who had joined the club from County League side Ellwood, took on the role of Player/Manager. In 2014-15 they finished runners up to Tytherington Rocks but despite finishing in a promotion position ground development had not been completed by the March 31st deadline and a further season in Division One followed. Determined that such a situation would not happen again further development work followed to ensure the necessary G grading but disappointingly after all the clubs efforts the club finished in third spot which would not necessarily ensure promotion. As luck would have it circumstances led to the club being offered a place in the Premier Division which they readily accepted but this again meant further development was needed to obtain an F Grading and this was attained in 2016 with the installation of a 2nd stand. In 2016-17 silverware came the clubs way via the Floodlit Trophy beating Flackwell Heath on penalties after the game finished 3-3. In 2019 Manager Mark Lee decided to step down after 8 years in charge and the clubs search for a new manager started. The club turned to ex-Town forward Richard Kear. Lydney born Richard had been at Cheltenham Town as a youth player but on his release he played on the Non League circuit before rejoining the club from Westfields in 2013. Family commitments saw Richard step down at the end of season 2020-21.

To replace Richard the club regained the services of previous manager Stuart Liddington but a set of indifferent results saw the club turn to Reserve Team Manager James Morse who instilled a new found confidence in the players and staved off any relegation fears. Despite languishing near the bottom of the table last season relegation was avoided with the club finishing 16th. Despite league struggles the club enjoyed 2 tremendous cup runs reaching the GFA Challenge Trophy Final losing out to 2 late goals against Roman Glass St. George. The club also reached the Bluefin Hellenic League Final but again missed out after coming up against a strong Pershore Town who had also lifted the Division One title. With the club unable to compete financially with the top teams in the league the club has turned to the Youth in the town and with several promising youngsters coming through the club is pinning its future of competing at Step 5 through its youth development policy and with Lydney stalwart James Morse still managing the Team the future looks bright.


