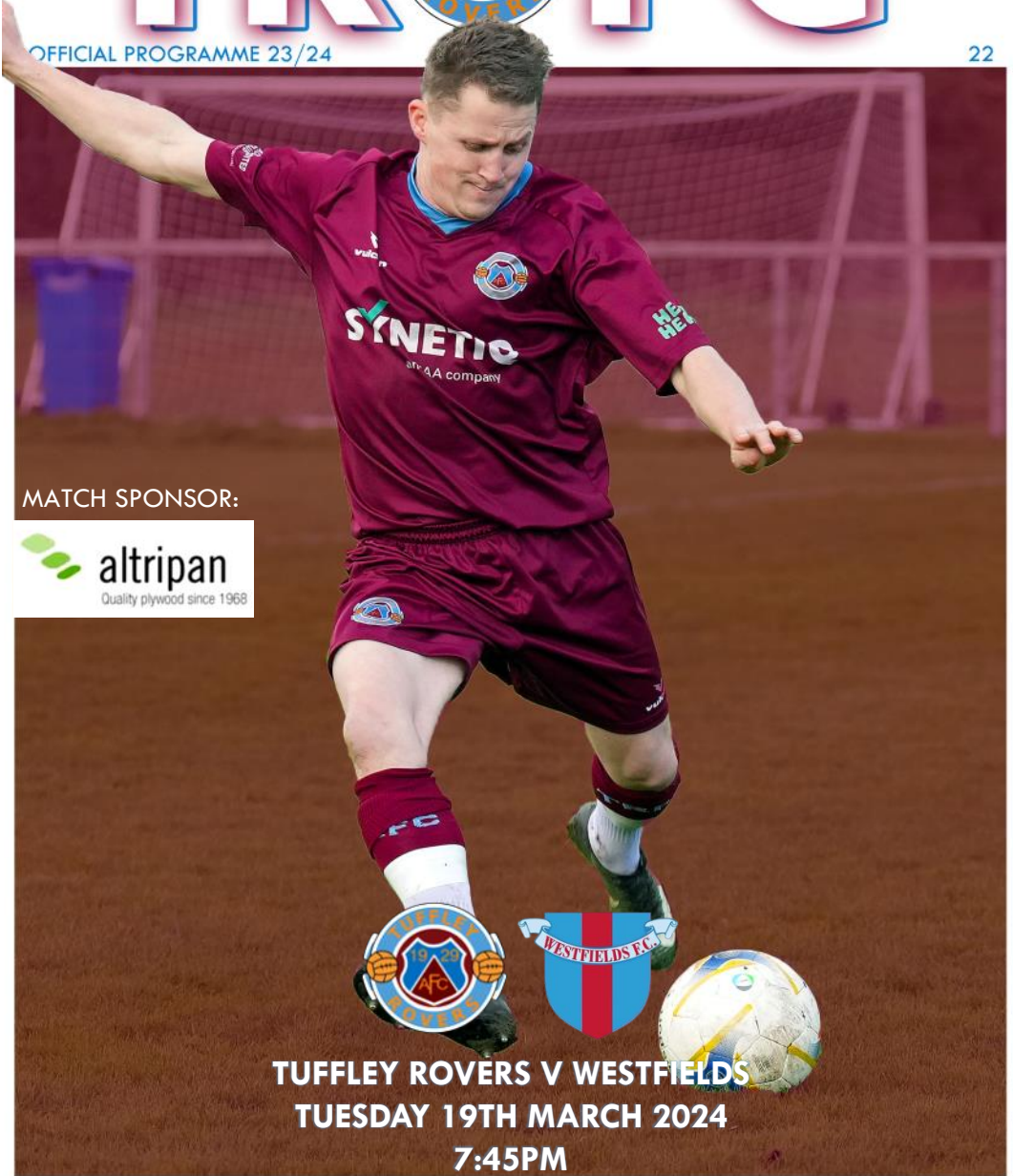

# TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Since the resumption of full-playing activities, Mustoe has had one full campaign, with the club finishing in 18th place and narrowly avoiding relegation from the Hellenic League Premier Division.

# MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Good evening and welcome to all players, officials and supporters from Westfields.

Looking back at Saturday's defeat we just weren't at it first half and I take responsibility for that, as we have been on a good run and there was a bit of complacency set in which seemed to filter through the team.

I thought the second half performance was much better and we won the half but gave ourselves to big a mountain to climb, after a first half that wasn't what we wanted.

We have four more games coming up and I'm still hoping for a fifty plus point tally. To do this we must make sure we are a team that no one wants to come up against, and that means doing what we have been doing recently. Even on a day like Saturday whilst we were not at our best we were in the game and made it hard for a potential play-off team.

Westfields are in similar situation position to us and will want to finish the season as strongly as they can. We were well beaten by them earlier in the season and they have had a good run of late after a tricky run up to and just after Christmas.

Hopefully, we will have our shooting boots on, as we want to win, and win well, which will set us up nicely for Saturday afternoon, when Fairfield Town pay us a visit.

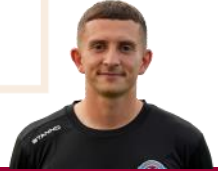

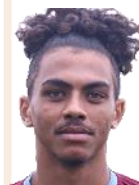

# On (or around) this day in history...



Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had a few games on 19 March, with contrasting fortunes, so we take a look back at those games on this particular day and a couple of good wins either side of the date...

## 22 March 2008

A Ben Surman penalty, in the 60<sup>th</sup> minute, proved enough to help Tuffley Rovers move into third place in the Gloucestershire County League table, and close the gap on leaders' Hardwicke, who lost for only the second time in the 2007/08 season. Hardwicke had plenty of chances in the first half, hitting the crossbar on two occasions, but Rovers were the side up for the game and sealed the three points courtesy of Surman's second-half penalty kick.

## 19 March 2011

Tuffley Rovers gained their second win in a week, with a 3-0 home success over Ellwood in the Gloucestershire County League.

The opening goal came right on half-time with a strike from Mark Ford. It remained 1-0 until the 79th minute when Liam Harding netted a second for Rovers and two minutes later Richard James netted from the penalty spot for a comfortable victory.

## 19 March 2013

Tuffley Rovers' hopes of winning the Gloucestershire County League title were dented, after they crashed to a 3-2 defeat at home against Bishops Cleeve Reserves.

In a game played under the floodlights at Glevum Park, Rovers came into the game on top of the league table, and although Dorian Colling struck his fifth goal in three appearances, alongside Marcus Foxwell's fourth goal of the season, Rovers lost to relegation threatened Cleeve Reserves by the odd goal in five.

## 21 March 2015

Courtney Hamilton scored what proved to be the ultimately decisive goal, on his first league start since 7 February, as Tuffley Rovers survived a second-half scare against Hellenic League Division One (West) bottom side Letcombe, to record a sixth successive league win and all but secure a top three finish, closing the gap on league leaders Longlevens and second placed Lydney Town in the process.

Young keeper Nick Sheppard was given a first team debut, with Aaron Taylor injured, and Rovers took an early lead through Warren Mann as they started well. When Brett James made it 2-0 and then Hamilton added a third before the interval, it looked to be a good afternoon for Warren Evans' side. Dan Hoskin pulled a goal back straight after the interval, and then Tom Stone scored on 71 minutes, to set-up a nervy finish. Rovers held out and kept their promotion hopes very much alive.

### **19 March 2016**

Tuffley Rovers surrendered their opportunity to take all three points against high-flying Flackwell Heath, as a late, late penalty saw the sides share the spoils in an enthralling game at Glevum Park.



Rovers' Achilles heel was evident again, as some slack defending saw Dan Burnell open the scoring for the visitors, on 24 minutes, as he diverted home a well-placed cross from full-back Joel Jacobs.

Then, before half-time, Joel Blount produced a stunning shot, which struck the angle of the crossbar and post, with Aaron Taylor well beaten, but Rovers managed to get through to the interval without further issue and trailing 1-0.

That lead remained with the visitors for some time but, with 11 minutes remaining, the busy Warren Mann evaded a couple of challenges on the edge of the box and although he lost possession, the ball ran loose to Jordan Fletcher, who drove the ball home from close range. If Rovers might have been happy to secure a vital league point, the game took a decisive twist within a minute, as substitute Ryan Williams produced an excellent pass that presented Fletcher with sufficient time and space to bag a brace and hand Rovers the lead. However, referee John Okole seemed to find nine minutes of added time and when Wallington fouled, receiving a red card for denying a goalscoring opportunity, Burnell stepped up to despatch the resultant penalty beyond Taylor, making it 2-2 seconds before Okole ended the game.

### **19 March 2022**

Tuffley Rovers succumbed to a 3-0 defeat, their 25th league defeat of the 2021/22 season, as their final UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture of the campaign ended in a 3-0 reverse away at Fairford Town. The hosts took the lead on 11 minutes, as Dan Bailey headed home Ian Herring's set-piece, before former Rovers forward Ross Langworthy made it 2-0 on 25 minutes.

Early in the second period, Langworthy made it 3-0, as he converted from the penalty spot after Brad Bevan had been fouled by Jack Copland, and Fairford Town ended the day with all three points and a relatively comfortable afternoon.

# WESTFIELDS CLUB HISTORY



Westfields Football Club commenced the new 2023/24 again in the UHL Hellenic League, having played last season and finished seventh, despite great ambitions to finish in a promotion place.

The early previous seasons in the Hellenic League were mainly claimed null and void due to the corona virus situation but in Westfields first season of Hellenic League, they were 13 points clear when it was curtailed due to coronavirus when promotion to the Southern League looked on the cards. Last season was a slight disappointment did not only finish in seventh in the league table but also in the FA Cup and FA Vase performances were disappointing but in the Herefordshire County Cup, Westfields regained the trophy with a fine 3-1 win over Hereford Pegasus at Edgar Street.

During the last 57 years, Westfields have enjoyed a meteoric rise throughout the West Midland League to the Midland Football League and along the way have finished runners-up twice in the Midland Football League and narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern League South and West having finished runners-up to Gresley Rovers and Stratford Town in previous seasons.

Westfields celebrated their 50th anniversary season in 2016/2017 with an amazing giant killing run in the FA Cup, which saw them go through to the first round proper before losing to Curzon and Ashton, following a Match of the Day game at Allpay Park in the first round proper. This also featured Westfields appearance on Football Focus and prior to that Chief Executive Andy Morris had appeared live on the FA Cup draw as a studio panel guest in Manchester.
