FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to Glevum Park. It is my pleasure to welcome the committee, management team, players and supporters of Kidlington for this FA Cup tie. An extended welcome also goes out to today's officials and of course our loyal fanbase who turn out come rain or shine.

We have had what feels like quite a short "off-season" for most, but thankyou to the rest of the committee and staff that have worked tirelessly over the last few months to ensure the club continues to operate outside of the football season. We hosted the annual Tuffley Rovers Youth Tournament, with clubs coming from all over Gloucestershire and further afield, to take part in the weekend. One thing that is always commented on is just how well the tournament is ran over the two days and the enjoyment that all attendees get from the weekend. We also hosted a couple of fundraising games – one with fathers and son from Rovers and they were very enjoyable days and for some the first opportunity to play with their son/father.

Much work has continued on our extension at our Tuffley Lane site which, despite delays, should be ready to host private events from October this year. This is one project the Executive Committee have worked on for the last few years, and we certainly hope that not only will it become a fantastic community asset, but also help raise funds that we can reinvest into the club, including here at Glevum Park.

During the off-season we made the decision to reduce our Saturday teams from five to four. There were many reasons for this, so that it is not as negative as might first appear. We believe by making our teams in the Stroud League stronger (by not spreading the pool of players so thinly), they will in fact then have the platform for both our 3rds and 4ths teams to push for promotion in their respective leagues.

Unfortunately, Dave Cornock who has been the manager of our Development team had to step down from his role, which was a great disappointment given what Dave brought to the team and the club as a whole, but we completely respect his decision and we have been working hard to bring a new manager in.

At the end of last season our U18s management team of Adrian Viner and Jim Hart informed us of their decision(s) to pass the reins on to a new management team and it was great that Matt Clow, who was supporting both Adrian and Jim in a coaching capacity, informed us of his intent to stay on and is joined by Ritchie Warden who most of the Tuffley support will remember during his time with the first team as Assistant Manager. With the young crop coming through this season and more game time on a Saturday across our teams, this looks like on the face of it, going to be a very good season for our U18s.

We also welcome Lee Hitchman as Ladies' team manager, taking over from Gemma Paine, who came in at a very difficult time last season and not only stabilised the team on the pitch, but also attracted new players to the club and has provided a strong platform for the upcoming season.

Our Thirds and Fourths will once again be led by Chris Giddy and Luke Whittam, and Darren Ellis and Kev Schmitz, respectively, for a second consecutive season and our hope is that both squads can push for promotion this season. They are also tasked with not only pushing for promotion, but supporting the development of our U18s into men's football.

On to our first team and we have been able to welcome some fantastic new signing this season, whilst retaining the majority of the squad that we ended last season with. We have only lost a few players due to relocation or stepping up to play in the league above. We thank them for their time at Tuffley and wish them well in their future endeavours. Neil Mustoe (Muzzy) continues to lead the management team with Liam, Tim, Alex and newly appointed Sports Therapist Mike, who replaces Sam Tandy who has moved on to the league above. I believe Mike is a fantastic addition to the first team and the wider club in helping keep our players fit, but also provide them with a comprehensive rehabilitation plan and get them on the field of play as soon as possible.

I hope everyone enjoys the game and hospitality here today and have a safe journey home.

TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and



Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Mustoe achieved an 18th place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14th place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad.



Good afternoon and welcome to Glevum Park to all players, management, officials and supporters from Kidlington FC.

After what seems a very short break we are up and running again for a new season. All post-season breaks seem to come with their own challenges and this one has been no different.

We have lost a good Manager/Coach from our Development Squad for personal reasons and this led to us losing majority of what was a very competitive squad due to a disrupted pre-season schedule for them. Players we were monitoring to bring through more this season have chosen other options over being patient and waiting for their opportunity with us, which is disappointing.

On the flip side, the U18 trials have resulted in some good recruitment and the coaches brought in have done really well and I'm looking forward to seeing them perform this season, not only in the midweek Floodlit League, but potentially on a Saturday in our Development Squad, or even the first team set-up.

We also have a had a few departures through the summer and whilst I am happy with our recruitment and a reasonable pre-season schedule, we were looking forward to the start of our league campaign this week. I am writing this after the midweek game, and we can safely say it wasn't the result or performance we were expecting. One thing we have been over the last year or so is hard to beat, even when not at our best, and this wasn't the case on Wednesday.

We have put it to bed straight away and our focus is now firmly on today's FA Cup game, where we are clear underdogs against a team from a higher division who finished last season strong and have had a reasonable pre- season.

I have yet to experience a cup run in my time here so I'm hoping we can perform to our best and give ourselves a fighting chance. Like any club, we will benefit not only on the football side but the financial aspects as well if we can win today.

The road to Wembley starts here and I hope you enjoy the game.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF OUR FA CUP

If I told you that we had a wonderful time at Glastonbury in 1995, you might assume that that summer's music festival (played out in baking heat, I might add – I was there!) was particularly good. It was, but Tuffley Rovers' trip to



Glastonbury FC in August 1995 ended with a 5-1 victory in our first ever FA Cup tie (a Preliminary Round fixture). An opportunity to host Cinderford Town followed and our campaign ended swiftly, off the back of 4-0 reverse at Glevum Park.

There were plenty of goals when we met Taunton Town in August 1996, but our campaign ended immediately, courtesy of a 5-2 defeat and twelve months later we made progress, with a good win at home to Cirencester Town (we narrowly claimed a 4-3 victory in another home tie) but when Paulton Rovers came in the First Qualifying Round a 3-1 defeat spelt that end of that year's road to Wembley.

An immediate exit to Minehead Town in 1998 was another disappointment, but in 1999 the record book shows a victory over one of the now foremost non-league clubs, as we beat Eastleigh 2-1 in the First Qualifying Round. A record breaking appearance in the Second Qualifying Round almost saw us progress further, but a 1-1 draw took us to a replay at home against Lymington & New Milton, only to see us eliminated courtesy of a 5-0 thrashing!

Revenge came against Taunton Town in 2000, as we won 4-1 in the Preliminary Round, but we once again failed to progress further, as a single goal victory went in favour of our opponents Chippenham Town in the next round.

Four consecutive defeats saw our cup hopes perish at the first hurdle in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2004 but we had another opportunity to progress in 2005/06 as our Hellenic League side hosted Elmore. A 0-0 draw took us to only our second replay ever, but we succumbed to a late goal in a 1-0 defeat in the second meeting. That was to be our last FA Cup tie for 10 years, as the club's withdrawal from the Hellenic League just a few weeks later saw us drop to a lower level of football, rendering us unable to enter the world's most famous cup competition.

Our return, ten years later in 2015, saw a wonderful win at Ardley United (4-1), followed up with a terrific 1-0 win at home to Southern League neighbours Bishops Cleeve, before we put in a brave display against Taunton Town, before losing 3-0.



Ardley gained revenge 12 months later, but our return in 2017 saw a narrow win with ten-men away at Woodley United, then a momentous day at Leighton Town, when we made an astonishing comeback from 2-0 down, with just eight minutes remaining, to win 3-2 in the dying moments of

the game. Swindon Supermarine demolished a Rovers team playing most of the game with ten-men, in the next round, to end another attempt to march on the Wembley arch.

Five seasons ago, despite leading 1-0 at half-time thanks to Warren Mann's penalty, we were comprehensively beaten 4-1 by Colney Heath, and exited the competition at the first stage. Then three years ago, against North Greenford United, we produced two fairly lacklustre performances (in our 26th and 27th FA Cup matches) and went out of the competition with a whimper.

In the 2020/21 season we succumbed to another heavy defeat at this stage, as Harefield United left Glevum Park with a 5-2 victory and their star striker, Richard Pacquette (a former QPR player), with the match-ball.



In our 29th FA Cup tie, at this stage against Windsor two years ago, we produced another stunning comeback, winning 3-2 after being two goals

behind and almost repeated the feat as we came back from two goals down again, in a home tie against Flackwell Heath that was played at Brimscombe & Thrupp, but this time it ended 2-2 and we went to a replay. The trip to Flackwell Heath was a disaster, as we lost our two centre-halves before we'd reach ten minutes of action and succumbed to a 6-0 thrashing.

Two seasons ago we took a lead against Southern League side Slimbridge but two late, late goals saw us beaten 2-1 in an enthralling game. Last season we drew 2-2 with Aylesbury Vale Dynamos but were awarded the tie after they were found to have played an ineligible player, setting up a tie against Evesham United, where a brave display ended in a 2-0 defeat.

Today is our 35th FA Cup tie and we go in pursuit of a tenth victory (a win in 90 mins) that would offer an opportunity of a tie against a trip to face Southern League side Yate Town or Combined Counties League side Holyport.



Luke Merchant

Goalkeeper

Club captain who returned to the club in the 2022/23 season, after a Hellenic League Premier Division title winning season at Bishops Cleeve. A great shot stopper, commanding presence and accomplished keeper. Holds the club record for Hellenic League appearances as a keeper.

Robin Hoffland

Goalkeeper

Now a long-serving player, despite his age, who acts as a capable back-up to Luke Merchant in goal, whenever needed. Has played for the club's 1sts, 2nds, 3rds, 4ths and 5ths, as well as the U18s and always gives his all. Reliable, in a word.

Macaulay Herbert

Defence

Begins this season as our longest-serving member of the squad. 'Macca' came through our U18s and is solid and dependable; an excellent defender who has been getting better with every season that passed. Has made over 290 first team appearances, despite several injuries punctuating each season. On course to reach 300 appearances this season.

Josh Stevens

Defence

Development Squad player of the season in 2023/24; broke into the first team squad during pre-season, putting in some excellent performances in central defence. Tall, strong in the air, solid in the tackle and capable in possession, this could be the season when he steps up into first team football.

Dan Lander

Defence

Debut in 2022/23 after returning to the club following a spell at Quedgeley Wanderers. A good club man, who gives his all in every game. Offers height, strength and determination at centre-half. A real competitor.

Elijah Simpson

Defence

Player under Neil Mustoe at Gloucester City U18s and recently signed from Brimscombe & Thrupp and a great addition to the squad. Comfortable on the ball when in possession, shows a turn of pace, and good defensively. A key signing for this season.

Ellis Clifford

Defence

There are some gaps in the information relating to cup games prior to the start of the 2013/14 campaign. This period is currently subject to a thorough review and there may be some variation to statistics in due course.

KIDLINGTON FC HISTORY

Kidlington FC was founded in 1909 and played local village football where rivalry was so keen that players had to prove they were residents of the village for whom they played. In 1945, Kidlington moved from village football to play in the Oxford City Junior League, with a good deal of success. By 1951 the Oxfordshire Senior

League was entered, where stronger competition was provided by the likes of Witney Town, Morris Motors, Pressed Steel and Thame United.

In 1953 the Hellenic League was formed and the Oxon Senior League lost some of its stronger clubs to the new league. Kidlington won the Senior League that season and joined the new league in 1954. Early days in the Hellenic League showed quite clearly the difference in standard. Kidlington however, maintained a Premier Division place for a time, but spent most of the 60's in Division One. The 70's started with 'The Greens' winning the County Intermediate Cup. In 1976-77 a squad of good young players produced what was Kidlington's best ever run in an FA competition. The team played every round bar one away from home and reached the last 16 in the FA Vase, eventually bowing out to Gosport Borough. The nucleus of this side eventually gained promotion back to the Premier Division in 1979-80.

The 80's were pretty uneventful and saw Kidlington return to Division One of the Hellenic League. The early 90's were steady. In season 1994-95, Martin Bakers Reserve side did the League and Cup double bringing some long awaited silverware back to the club, and an upturn in the first team fortunes occurred after Karl Grossmann was appointed manager, achieving top 6 finishes in four successive seasons.

The new millennium saw a major overhaul of the committee and a new Chairman in Geoff Talboys. In 2004-05, under the guidance of ex-player Kevin Walton, the first team finished in third place and achieved promotion back into the Hellenic Premier Division. With promotion came a struggle with the considerable difference in the standard of football and the team finished in a relegation position. However a national non-league restructure saved us.

In 2007/08, First Team silverware arrived for the first time in over 30 years when we won the Floodlit Trophy under manager Paul Lee. There were additional honours that season with the Reserves winning Reserve Division One for a second consecutive season, the Youth team winning the Oxfordshire U18 Youth Cup, and Kidlington Veterans retaining their Veteran League crown.

In 2009-10 came a new Chairman, Lloyd Wray, and a new management team. Ex-player Gordon Geary was recruited to look after 1st team affairs and Barry Hiles to run the Reserve team.

Season 2010-11 saw the club achieve its most successful season ever, finishing seventh in the Premier Division, and a superb effort by all saw us play a very strong Oxford United team at the Kassam Stadium in the Final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup, where unfortunately we lost. We did win some silverware though, beating Purton 3-0 in the final of the Supplementary Cup.

In December of season 2011-12 Gordon and Barry resigned and two senior players Danny Leggett and Christian Perkins stepped forward to guide the club through until the end of the season with the club just maintaining its Hellenic Premier Division status.

For season 2013-14 the club installed Martin Wilkinson as First Team manager and finished

sixth in the league, making club history. They also reached the Senior Cup Final again, but lost to Ardley United.



Season 2014-15 saw the team finish in our highest ever league position of fourth. Season 2015-16 was a dream come true for everyone at KFC, with Wilkinson and his team of Paul Harwood, Julian McCalmon and Jermaine McSporran leading our 1st team to the Hellenic League Premier Division title and promotion to the Southern League. We also had our best ever run in the FA Vase where we reached the last eight and had a very healthy run in the FA Cup, losing eventually to Conference side Gloucester City.

Season 2016–17 was our first at Level 4 of the football pyramid in the Evo-Stik League Division One Central but, due to work commitments, Wilkinson resigned after a month. Jermaine McSporran took over as Caretaker Manager until the club appointed Julian McCalmon as our new Manager, with McSporran and Paul Harwood as his assistants. The new manager and the team had a good season at this higher level and eventually finished in mid-table. Our reserves with Nick East as Manager, had a great season winning the Reserve Challenge Cup and finishing as runners up in the Hellenic League Division 2 West.

Due to the geographical implications from promotion/relegation, for season 2017-18 we were transferred across to the South West Division. Our reserve team achievded senior status with promotion to Uhlsport Hellenic Division One West and were also re-branded as the "Development Team".

For season 2018-19, McCalmon resigned and Ady Fuller was appointed as First Team Manager. He had to form a completely new squad ahead of the season, and due to another FA national restructure we transferred back to Division One Central. After a poor start the manager resigned in mid-October and we re-instated Julian McCalmon with Joe Davies & Elliot Osborne-Ricketts as his assistants. We avoided relegation on the last day of the season.

McCalmon resigned again in January 2020 and was replaced by Ben Sadler, assisted by Paul Braithwaite. The pair had led Wantage Town to promotion as Hellenic League Champions in 2019.

After two seasons severely disrupted by Covid-19, 2021/22 proved challenging. A horrific injury list meant we struggled to establish a settled squad and we spent much of the season with the threat of relegation hanging over us. It is great credit to the management and players that we survived, finally finishing in 17th position.

Season 2022-23, led by joint managers Ben Sadler and Paul Braithwaite and assisted by Mark Massingham, saw us achieve our highest ever league finish, finally ending up in 10th position after pressing for a playoff place for much of the campaign.

For season 2023/24, Braithwaite decided to manage elsewhere and Sadler moved to a community role within the club. The previous year's Assistant, Mark Massingham, stepped up to manage the team, assisted by Scott Reynolds. Disappointing league results led to a change of the management team in March. Sadler, our former manager was appointed until the end of the season, assisted by Mark Flanagan, and previous Academy coach Lloyd Owers. An improvement in performances and results saw us end the season in 13th position. We were also runners up in the Oxfordshire Senior Cup, losing to Thame United in the final.

This season we are excited to have Craig McKay back at the club as Head Coach. He will be assisted by Lloyd Owers, Ben Lucas and Tony Collins.


