TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and



Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Mustoe achieved an 18th place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14th place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad.

Good evening and welcome to Glevum Park to all players, management, officials and supporters from Hartpury University FC.

After Saturday's great win and performance we are in confident mood. Our two home league games have been really good; results and performances that were really positive and we are hoping for the same again tonight.

Ty Roberts scoring the winner on Saturday against Pegasus was great to see and he is one who has come through our player pathway, along with Ellis Clifford and Harley, meaning three of the eleven at the end of the game were from our U18s or Reserve/ Development squads which was the aim after stabilising the squad over the last two years, which now gives us an opportunity to bring more young players through.

I said in pre-season that I expected Hartpury to be right up there, competing for the league this season, and although they have had a few mixed results the last two look like they have clicked into some sort of rhythm. I firmly believe they will be in the top two at the end of the season, they have great facilities and are able to work and recover daily, which can only be beneficial.

If we are on it and perform, though, we have proven in this calendar year that we can match any opposition and cause all teams problems - and tonight is hopefully no different!

PREVIOUSLY AGAINST TODAY'S OPPONENTS

We look back at games against today's opposition from years past, with some details around the key moments....

22 October 2022, FA Vase, Hartpury University 1-0 Tuffley Rovers

Hellenic League Division One side Hartpury University pulled off a victory at the expense of their Premier Division visitors, Tuffley Rovers, courtesy of a 1-0 win at Hartpury University.

Manager, Neil Mustoe, welcomed Ashley Davies back into the starting line-up, with Warren Mann only fit enough for a place on the bench, and the Rovers boss would have been hopeful that his team could progress to a record equalling run in the FA Vase. Unfortunately for him, his side produced a poor first half display and ultimately paid for conceding a goal in the 19th minute.

Morgan Mahoney and Josh Radford both went close for the hosts, as they fired some early warning shots on Elliot Jones' goal, and there was a sense of inevitability building before Mahoney produced a low shot that deceived Jones and nestled into the back of the Rovers net.

A change of personnel and formation in the second period led to a much improved display but Rovers struggled to create chances against a resilient Hartpury defence. Chances came and went for Ryan Dobbins and Mason Lewis, before a last gasp opportunity for veteran striker Shayne Bradley saw the Rovers man head wide of the hosts goal, leaving Rovers out and Hartpury celebrating a 1-0 win.

15 November 2022, GFA Challenge Trophy, Tuffley Rovers 3-2 Hartpury University

Two much changed line-ups took to the field in a second cup tie between Tuffley Rovers and Hartpury University, just 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ weeks after the University team had triumphed in the FA Vase and on this occasion it was another game where the

host team came out on top.

This time the competition was the GFA Challenge Trophy and if the FA Vase tie had been a game of few chances, this fixture was positively raining goals in comparison.

Goals from Ryan Dobbins and a brace from Shayne Bradley proved enough for Rovers to run out 3-2 winners in a close run encounter with the students of Hartpury.



On (or around) this day in history...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had just one game on 20 August (and a couple on the dates either side) that we have selected to reflect on our fortunes on this this particular date...

18 August 2007

Promoted Tuffley Rovers recorded a good win over visitors Henbury at Glevum Park in the opening game of the season. Rovers took the lead in the 13th minute through Pat Boyd, who fired home from 12 yards. Henbury drew level right on half time when Jermaine Wright ran through to score.

Mark Wallington's 78th minute winner from a corner sealed Rovers their first 3 points in their second spell in the County League. Henbury thought they had secured a point just before the final whistle when they got the ball into the back of the net but it was disallowed for a foul on a Rovers defender.

16 August 2008

Yate Town Reserves thought they had done enough to salvage a point from the Gloucestershire County League fixture with Tuffley Rovers, after equalising with just five minutes remaining.

Pat Boyd gave Rovers the lead, but Yate's Jack Smyth levelled with a super 30 yard drive. The visiting team then took the lead through Ollie Everitt, only for Smyth to level the scores again.

As it was, two late goals, first from Marcus Foxwell and then from Warren Mann ensured Rovers left Yate with a maximum three points from their opening game of the 2008/09 season.

15 August 2009

Tuffley Rovers started their 2009/10 Gloucestershire County League season with a 2-0 victory at home to Thornbury Town.

Victor Webb opened the scoring for the home side with a twenty-yard drive on 12 minutes, but Thornbury should have levelled 3 minutes later when James Derosa headed over from close range.

There was then a hold up in the 23rd minute when the Referee collided with a player accidentally and his assistant had to take over for the remainder of the match. It took Rovers until the 84th minute to seal the points when Richard James volleyed home a Chris Lee cross.

20 August 2011

Tuffley Rovers came away from Patchway with a 3-0 victory that made them the new leaders of the Gloucestershire County League.

Marcus Foxwell gave Rovers the lead three minutes before the break and six minutes into the second half took a 2-0 lead through Mark Wallington. Liam Harding netted the third after 76 minutes as Rovers continued an unblemished start to the 2011/12 season that had seen them record three straight wins.

22 August 2015

Tuffley Rovers recorded a third victory in eight days, and another three valuable Hellenic League Premier Division points, as they came from behind to defeat Abingdon United.

Jack Ross gave hosts Abingdon the lead, after just 7 minutes and that was how the score remained until the interval. Rovers had great chances for Marcus Foxwell and Jordan Dowdeswell straight after the break, but the hosts stood firm and it looked like the result was going to go against Warren Evans' Rovers.

However, after 75 minutes Ashley Davies found a way through to give Rovers an equaliser, and two minutes later Anthony Herrin headed home a cross from Dowdeswell to make it 2-1.

19 August 2017

Full-back Sam Hill produced a late, late goal that capped off an incredible win that saw Tuffley Rovers secure a place in the Emirates FA Cup First Qualifying Round, with Mark Pritchett's side recovering from two goals down to defeat Leighton Town.

Marsala and Smith gave Leighton a two-goal lead at the interval, despite Rovers having their share of chances, and when the game entered the final ten minutes it looked as thought Rovers' participation in the historic cup competition was over for another year.

However, Pritchett's men had other ideas and pulled a goal back through a penalty from Warren Mann with eight minutes remaining. Shayne Bradley then crossed as the game moved into its closing moments, with Pritchett produced a scissor kick that flew into the Leighton Town goal and surely a replay beckoned. Hill had other ideas and when Mann set the ball back to the onrushing Hill, the full-back drove the ball across Wyant and in off the post, to hand Rovers a memorable victory.





HARTPURY UNIVERSITY CLUB HISTORY

Hartpury University FC are a relatively new side, having been formed ahead of the 2020/21 season, when they entered the Uhlsport Hellenic League, Division Two only for their first season to be interrupted by the Covid-19 pandemic.

With the Hellenic League's Division Two offering no formal route into the pyramid system, the University side decided to move into a Step 7 competition and they joined the Herefordshire County League in time for the 2021/22 season and this proved to be a truly historic season, even for a club in its infancy.

The team went on a 20 match unbeaten run in the league, winning every competitive league fixture, but they also captured two other titles, as they won the Herefordshire County Cup, courtesy of a 2-1 win over Hereford United at Edgar Street, before winning the Herefordshire Senior Cup after beating a Forest Green XI 5-1.

Winning the Herefordshire County League offered an opportunity to move into Step 6 football and the club rejoined the Uhlsport Hellenic League for the 2022/23 season, taking their place in Division One. The club finished the season in second place in the league, behind Champions Pershore Town, but were unable to finish off their promotion campaign, losing in the play-off final to Milton United in penalties after a 2-2 draw. That season saw an excellent run in the Isuzu FA Vase, with a Second Round win at Cornish side Mousehole sending them through to the Third Round in their first campaign, where they thumped Bovey Tracy 7-0. A defeat against Atherstone Town ended their cup run at the next stage (the last 32).

Last season (2023/24) saw the club gain promotion to the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, as they ran away with Division One, finishing nine points clear of runners-up Malmesbury Victoria and with a goal difference of +96. They also competed in the FA Cup for the first time in the club's history and again reached the last 32 in the FA Vase.

Now they commence a first season in Step 5 football.


