

TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and



Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Mustoe achieved an 18th place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14th place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad. The 2024/25 season ended with further improvement, as Mustoe's squad finished in 11th place.

FROM THE MANAGER:



Good afternoon and welcome to Glevum Park. Welcome to all players, management, officials and supporters from Fairford Town.

Our visitors have had a busy summer, adding to the management team and with that a bit of an overhaul of the squad. I have long term history with the management team at Fairford and after today's wish the all the best for the season ahead...until we meet again!

We are a bit disappointed the Lydney Town game didn't go ahead in the week as we were hoping to carry on the momentum from our two good wins so far this season. As disappointed as we are, it has also given us time to have a break as the two games have been quite intense for different reasons.

Against Cribbs we were on the front foot and against Hartpury we had long spells without the ball but having a threat on the counterattack.

We will be confident based on our two results but we will have total respect for today's opposition and we know it will be a tough encounter based on previous games over the last few seasons.

Another win today will really go a long way into building the belief in the squad we can be competitive this season.

The games come thick and fast, as we will then host Mangotsfield United here on Tuesday evening, before travelling to Flackwell Heath in the next round of the FA Cup on Saturday. Football is well and truly back!

THAT WAS THE SEASON THAT WAS...

a look back at the 2024/25 season

It has become customary for our first programme of the new season to devote a couple of pages to reviewing the previous year at The Rovers. Today we look back at 2024/25 – Neil Mustoe's third full campaign at the helm.

August 2024

Rovers started their Uhlsport Hellenic League campaign away at newly promoted Sporting Club Inkberrow with a chastening 2-0 defeat on 31 July, before the first Saturday of the season saw them bow out of the Emirates FA Cup with a defeat (3-0) against Kidlington FC. Neil Mustoe's side then clicked into gear at home against Slimbridge, winning 3-0 as a Karnell Chambers brace and a Brad Bevan goal secured a first three points of the season.



A disappointing 2-2 draw away at Lydney Town followed, before a 2-0 defeat away at Worcester Raiders, in what would prove to be a final visit to play The Raiders at Sixways Stadium. A win against Hereford Pegasus the following week eased the pain of that defeat, but two defeats followed, against Hartpury University and Longlevens as the month ended in disappointing fashion.

September 2024

The run of defeats extended into September, as Rovers returned from Westfields on the wrong end of a 2-1 scoreline, but that was the last in a run of disappointing results with victories against Thornbury Town, Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Hereford Pegasus following.

That winning run came to an abrupt halt with a 2-1 defeat away at Bitton in the FA Vase but things got better a few days later as Mustoe's side won at home against Pershore Town. Unfortunately, the month ended with a 3-0 defeat at Fairford Town.

October 2024

October didn't offer any positive change and a defeat away at Slimbridge was followed by a very disappointing home draw against Malmesbury Victoria, who had been on a string of defeats prior to arriving at Glevum Park. Rovers had Harley Mustoe to thank for salvaging a point, as he netted his first goal for the club.

A stunning 3-3 draw at Highworth Town followed, with Brad Bevan getting the equaliser in the final attack of the game, but further disappointment came in the next game, as struggling Cirencester Town secured a 1-0 victory.

There was a positive end to the month as Karnell Chambers' 10th goal of the season helped Rovers to a first win against Corsham Town, as Mustoe's side won 1-0.

November 2024

The opening days of November offered back-to-back games against Brimscombe & Thrupp, with a 2-0 win in the league being followed by a 5-1 victory in the GFA Challenge Trophy. By now, Connor Walters was on an excellent run of form and his third goal in successive games helped secure a 1-0 win over Mangotsfield United at Glevum Park.

A narrow 2-1 defeat against high flying Roman Glass St George followed but the positive trend in November quickly returned as a 2-2 draw against Thornbury Town was followed by a 7-3 win over Lydney Town, with Chambers scoring four times and taking his goal tally to 19 for the season by the end of November.

Unfortunately, a 4-0 defeat at Royal Wootton Bassett Town on 30 November, with Tawana Changa sent-off in the first half, offered a disappointing end to a largely positive month.

December 2024

December started with a 2-0 win over Cheltenham Saracens in the GFA Challenge Trophy, with first goals for the club from both Gino Valenit and Hubert Zatorski, then a creditable 1-1 draw against a strong Fairford Town side, with Chambers' 20th of the season rescuing a point.



The Christmas week brought no cheer, however, as a defeat against Highworth Town as followed by an incredibly disappointing defeat against Longlevens on Boxing Day.

A 28 December victory away at Cirencester Town (3-0) didn't repair the damage completely but did mean Mustoe's side ended 2024 on a high thanks to goals from Mark Pritchett, Kieran Alder and Brad Bevan.

January 2025

January ended well, as Rovers came from 2-0 down to secure a point away at Champions Elect Hartpury University, courtesy of goals from Bevan and Chambers, but a weather affected programme saw only two other games played – a 1-0 defeat at Glevum Park against Worcester Raiders and a 2-1 reverse away at Hellenic League Division One side Stonehouse Town in the Floodlit Cup.

February 2025

February was another mixed month, starting with a creditable win at home against Westfields, before a hugely disappointing exit from the Marsh Sports Challenge Cup against Shortwood United. A hard fought draw at home against Sporting Club Inkberrow was a positive turn and was followed by a midweek draw (2-2) away at Mangotsfield United, with Jamie Creed scoring his first goal for the club.

Bottom club Malmesbury Victoria then took a deserved three points as they won 3-1 against Mustoe's charges, before an excellent win away at Pershore Town secured another three points as Mustoe's side found themselves in mid-table and in unfamiliar territory!

The month ended disappointingly as a woeful performance saw Hallen win a GFA Challenge Trophy quarter-final 3-0.

March 2025



The month of March saw just two games played, including a 3-0 win against Brimscombe & Thrupp, but that result was sandwiched between defeat against Roman Glass St George and a final day defeat against Corsham Town on 1 April, as the visitors scored three times in very quick succession, denying Rovers 10th place in the table, meaning Mustoe's finished in a creditable 11th place in the league.

Macaulay Herbert Defence

FAIRFORD TOWN CLUB HISTORY

A COMPANY OF THE PROPERTY OF T

Fairford Town Football Club was formed in 1891 and for many years played in the Cirencester & District League against local teams with

varying degrees of success. After the second world war the club joined the Swindon & District League, winning the Premier Division in both 1964/65 and 1968/69, also winning the Advertiser Cup in the same years, and in 1962/63 won the Gloucestershire Junior Cup.

Success in the Swindon & District League was followed by election to the Hellenic League in 1970, only missing promotion from the first division on goal average at the first attempt, the club were also beaten finalists in that year's division one Challenge Cup. The following year, 1971/72 saw Fairford win the Hellenic first division and division one Challenge Shield, whilst the reserve side won the Gloucestershire County Minor Cup, the Advertiser Cup and finished runners-up in the Swindon & District Division One.

The successful run continued and Town were the beaten finalists of 1972/73 in the Premier Division Cup, only to be relegated back to Division One in 1973/74.

Fairford Town were again promoted in 1975/76 and steady progress led to the Premier Division Runners-up in 1978/79 and 1979/80, also winning the Premier Division Cup in 1978/79. The Club were winners of the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy in 1979/80,1998/99 and 2024/25 and Runners-up in 1982/83 and 1994/95.

The most recent league success has been Premier Division Runners-up in season 1994/95 following a similar position in Season 1990/91. The Club has also achieved numerous wins in the Arthur Shipway Cup and Fairford Hospital Cup.

The 2016/17 season saw the club secure a return to the Uhlsport Hellenic Premier Division after a five-year absence, winning the Division One West title with 75 points.

In recent years the club has grown on and off the pitch. The first team are now established and challenging in the Uhlsport Hellenic Premier Division with a Reserves side also competing in Hellenic Division 2 South. 2020 also saw the creation of Fairford Town Academy with teams running from under 12s through to under 18s. We aim to place the football club within the heart of the local community and are keen to continue to grow and achieve our goal of promotion to the Southern Football League for the first time in the club's history.

In recent years the club has grown on and off the pitch. The first team are now established and challenging in the Uhlsport Hellenic Premier Division with a Reserves side also competing in Hellenic Division 2 South. 2020 also saw the creation of Fairford Town Academy with teams running from under 14s through to under 16s. We aim to place the football club within the heart of the local community and are keen to continue to grow and achieve our goal of promotion to the Southern Football League for the first time in the club's history.

The 2024/25 season saw the club win the Gloucestershire FA Senior Amateur Cup and also saw the Under 18s win the prestigious Southwest Counties Youth League.

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

10 August 2013

Following promotion at the end of the 2012/13 season, Tuffley Rovers' first foray back into Hellenic League football ended with an entertaining 3-3 draw at home against North Leigh United. Goals from Marcus Foxwell (pen), Dion Lee and Steve Bick proved enough to secure a first Hellenic League point since 2005 for Doug Foxwell's side.

12 August 2014

Tuffley Rovers started their 2014/15 season with a comprehensive victory over Fairford Town, as goals from Brett James (2), Shayne Bradley and Marcus Foxwell guided Warren Evans' team to a convincing 4-0 win at Glevum Park.

James' two goals came on his competitive debut for Rovers after he had signed during the summer following Evans' appointment as manager.

Tuffley Rovers recorded a first FA Cup win in almost four years, as Aaron Basford's first goal for the club proved the difference in a five goal thriller at Windsor's Stag Meadow.

Charlie Jaggers' goal had given Windsor a lead that they held until the interval, before Josh Swales' fortuitous goals levelled the scores on 56 minutes. Parity did not last long before Eric Sowolona restored Windors' lead but Dom Kent again equalised in the 63rd minute. Less than four minutes later substitute Joe Shutt set-up Aaron Basford to give Rovers the lead, one they held until the final whistle sounded, setting up a tie with Flackwell Heath in the next round of the competition.


