

What a difference 48 hours can make! Last Saturday 90 minutes of football felt like a pointless, depressing, low reward hobby. By the end of the game on Monday, it felt completely different, a polar opposite and like the best thing since slice bread! Longlevens deservedly beat us in the FA Vase on Saturday but we returned that, with some, on Monday, where we were the better side and claimed three league points.

Today's game will undoubtedly be tough. I should have remembered last week but the thrill of two El Glosico games in 48 hours was just too much for me!

It has been a positive start to the season overall, not just for the first team but across all our teams, with our Reserves and Thirds also underway in their respective leagues. # TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and



Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17<sup>th</sup>. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10<sup>th</sup> placed finishes, before a 15<sup>th</sup> place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17<sup>th</sup> place).

Mustoe achieved an 18<sup>th</sup> place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14<sup>th</sup> place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad. The 2024/25 season ended with further improvement, as Mustoe's squad finished in 11<sup>th</sup> place.

Good afternoon and welcome to Glevum Park. Welcome to all players, management, officials and supporters from Thornbury Town.

After a mixed Bank Holiday weekend in terms of results, we finished on a high with a well-deserved victory over local rival Longlevens. Disappointingly, we couldn't take full advantage of our first half domination and we need to be better and a bit more creative in the final third as we lacked an end product when in some very good situations.

However, that said it doesn't take away from the solid start in the league programme with four wins in five games, which is a real positive and we begin today sitting sixth in the Premier Division table.

Today's opponents are one of the most difficult fixtures I find during each season as Thornbury Town have a style of play built around determination and togetherness, which makes them one of the most difficult teams to play in the league. We have worked on and spoken about a few things in training that we feel will help us today but you can plan and prepare only so much and not for every scenario.

Hopefully the squad have the same drive and ambition as I and my management team possess, and will realise the opportunity we have to potentially improve on last season's goals and points tallies, then see where it takes us. This will not just happen; it will need to be a week in week out, game by game effort, with the right focus and mentality. It is my job to keep the focus and keep the team fresh with changes pre and mid game, so that the squad remain competitive in each and every game.

On a side note, it was great to see our Reserves get up and running with a great win at Glevum Park in the week, which was pleasing not only because of the result but I witnessed a performance that showcased the potential in the group.

#### Luke Merchant Goalkeeper

Club captain who returned to the club in the 2022/23 season, after a Hellenic League Premier Division title winning season at Bishops Cleeve. A great shot stopper, commanding presence and accomplished keeper. Holds the club record for Hellenic League appearances as a keeper.

#### Robin Hoffland Goalkeeper

A long-serving player, despite his age, who acts as a capable back-up to Luke Merchant in goal, whenever needed. Has played for the club's 1sts, 2nds, 3rds, 4ths and 5ths, as well as the U18s and always gives his all. Reliable, in a word.

#### Macaulay Herbert Defence

Our second longest-serving member of the squad. 'Macca' came through our U18s and is solid and dependable; an excellent defender who has been getting better with every season that passed. Has made over 300 first team appearances, despite several injuries punctuating each season.

#### Callum McLean Defence

#### Daniel Lander Defence

Rarely a regular starter but a player who gives his all when selected and never lets his manager down. Now has over 50 first team appearances to his name and is a solid, dependable member of the squad.

#### Mark Pritchett Defence

Tasted Hellenic League title success at Bishops Cleeve. Previously at Rovers as Player / Manager before stepping away from the role in 21/22. Offers a no nonsense, old-fashioned approach in each game and is a threat in the opposition box.

#### Ellis Clifford Defence

NB: The figures are correct for all league competitions from season 2007/08, when Tuffley Rovers returned to the County League (Step 7) and include all competitive games since the start of the 2013/14 season. There are some gaps in the information relating to cup games prior to the start of the 2013/14 campaign. This period is currently subject to a thorough review and there may be some variation to statistics in due course.

### THORNBURY TOWN CLUB HISTORY

It is understood that football has been played in Thornbury from around 1898 and formerly known as Thornbury Sports became Thornbury Town FC in the early 1970's.

1968-69 we became founder members of the Gloucestershire County League and spectator figures in excess of 500 were regularly recorded. In 1971 the club finished third in the Gloucestershire County League and was accepted into the Western League. However, due to difficulties in bringing the facilities up to the leagues required standards were unable to take the next step up. Relegation to the Bristol Premier Combination League unfortunately followed in 1976-77.

The following 20+ years saw Thornbury Town strive to regain their former status, never really threatening to take the Premier Combination title. The only success during these lean years was reaching the final of the GFA Senior Amateur Cup in 1985-86 and 1989-90 unfortunately on both occasions loser's medals were received.

During the late 1990's, the Club maintained its strong focus on developing local talent and this eventually bore fruit in 1999 when the final of the Stroud Charity Cup was reached, losing narrowly to Dursley Town. 2001-02 season saw the management team of Dave Wiffill and Steve Burbage take the reins, which brought instant success winning the Bristol Premier Combination title by 13 points and a return to the Gloucestershire County League. This followed a run of thirteen consecutive league wins a club record, which still stands to this day. The league and cup double eluded the club when they were defeated by Sea Mills in the League Cup Final.

In preparation for the return to County League football the summer of 2002 saw a lot of hard work undertaken on the Mundy facilities with the building of dug-outs, improved drainage and revamping of the dressing rooms. All this work appeared to have been worth while with the club establishing itself back in the Gloucestershire County league with a creditable 7th league position for the next three seasons. Silverware did come our way in 2003-04 when we defeated Taverners on penalties, after a 2-2 draw, to lift the Stroud Charity Cup. The 2003-04 season, also saw the formation of an Under-18's side in order to maintain Youth development within the club and they gained entry to the Gloucester County Youth League.

Following a number of indifferent seasons when relegation back to the Bristol Premier Combination league was only just averted in 2006–07, a new management committee and first team management were appointed. Dave Lippiatt took over as first team manager, coming to the club from Sea Mills Park bringing with him Carl Derosa as his assistant. With an initial three / four year strategy, which came to fruition during the 2009-10 season when after a steady first half to the season a tremendous winning run of ten league games saw the Surridge Gloucestershire County League title won for the first time in the clubs history. 2010 also saw the milestone achievement of the long awaited coming together of the two local football clubs "Thornbury Town FC" and "Thornbury Falcons FC" now under one club management umbrella of Thornbury Town FC without losing the heritage and identity of Thornbury Falcons. This will further enhance the long term development within the local community for junior, youth and senior football.


In the 2010-11 season the final of the Les James Cup Final was reached, which resulted in a penalty shoot-out disappointment against Henbury Town. 2013-14 saw the U18's in their highest league position in the Gloucestershire County Youth League finishing runners-up, which was a tremendous achievement for the team and managers Simon Pirie and Mark Franklin.

The 2014-15 season was a very successful season finishing 4th in the league and winning the Les James Cup for the first time in the Club's history. Andy Davies continued to produce a team of quality which resulted in a third 4th-place in a row in Season 2016-17. 2017-18 saw the club finally succeed in their quest win the Gloucestershire County League. After a lot of work behind the scenes to gain planning permission for the required ground improvements, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League for the first time in our history.

Our first season in the Hellenic League saw us finish a creditable 3rd in Div 1 West and win the Supplementary Cup. 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 seasons were ruled null and void due to the Coronavirus pandemic with the team poised to gain promotion. A restructuring of the football pyramid saw the club placed us in the Hellenic Premier Division, where they are now competing for a fourth season. With a management team of Richard Joyce and newly appointed assistant Tim Wilkins in place they look forward to the season ahead and wish all teams the best of luck in their endeavours.

## N (OR AROUND) THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had four games on 30 August which we've reviewed to reflect on our fortunes over the years, plus one other game from around this date...

#### 30 August 2008

Tuffley Rovers early season winning run in the Gloucestershire County League came to an end as they were defeated 2-0 at home to Bishops Cleeve Reserves and the hosts only had themselves to blame as they missed a succession of chances in the first half. Most notably, Kyle Kennedy missed a penalty shooting wide of the target.

Rovers were made to pay and Cleeve opened the scoring in the 52<sup>nd</sup> minute when James Vercesi read a long ball upfield and nipped in to slot the ball home. The second came from a poor goal kick, with the ball being sent out to the left and the cross being hammered home by Jody Taylor.

#### 30 August 2010

Tuffley Rovers entertained Thornbury Town in the Gloucestershire County League game at Glevum Park in a game that saw two missed penalties and two sending-offs, before concluding with a 2-1 scoreline in favour of the home side.



Town opened the scoring in the 1<sup>st</sup> minute, as a cross from the right saw Rovers' keeper Chris Perks scrambling for the ball colliding with his own

defender dropping it right at the feet of Tom Webb who struck the ball into the back of the net. The hosts drew level in the 7<sup>th</sup> minutes as Dan Wallington finished an incisive pass from Warren Mann to make it 1-1.



A 35th minute penalty for Wallington, after Mark Ford was brought down, should have given Rovers the lead but Thornbury's Alex Lippiatt pulled off a terrific full length save to keep the ball out.

After an end-to-end start to the second half, but no further goals, Rovers took the lead in the 74th minute when a free-kick on the edge of the box was pushed away by Lippiatt but Richard James was on hand to knock the ball home from six yards.

Three minutes later Tuffley's Ben Harris, who had come on as a sub for the home side got himself sent off for a foul off the ball. Then, in the 85<sup>th</sup> minute Warren Mann broke down the left got into the box and was then brought down by Rikki Lippiatt, who was the last defender and was sent-off. Richard James was nominated to take the penalty kick, but once again Alex Lippiatt dived the right way to bring off his second spot kick save of the afternoon, although Rovers held out to record a 2-1 win.

Tuffley Rovers recorded a third win in four league games at the start of their Hellenic League, Division One (West) season, as they defeated visitors New College Swindon 3-1 at Glevum

Park.

In a tightly contested game Rovers ultimately ran out winners courtesy of a brace from Shayne Bradley and a third from Mark Ford, to make it 10 points from a possible 12.

#### 29 August 2015



Tuffley Rovers produced a superb performance to seal a place in the 1st Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup, overcoming Southern League club Bishops Cleeve thanks to Ashley Davies' 31st minute goal.

Both sides traded early blows and Elliot Kennedy produced a shot, which Aaron Taylor, in the Rovers goal, saved comfortably on 10 minutes. Rovers who had a share of the possession, were by no means looking a division apart from their Kayte

Lane opponents and they took the lead on 31 minutes, as Davies showed composure as he pounced on a loose ball in the Bishops Cleeve 6 yard box and evaded a challenge, before forcing the ball beyond Sam Gilder in the Cleeve goal.

The second half was a demonstration of attrition, with both sides continuing to share possession, without cresting clear chances, although Herrin produced an effort which struck the Cleeve post on 59 minutes, with Gilder beaten.

Rovers continued to deny Cleeve clear chances and Warren Evans' side held out to secure a memorable victory for the Glevum Park side.

Tuffley Rovers' fairly wretched start to the 2012/22 Hellenic League Premier Division season was put temporarily on-hold as they came away from Sawmills End with a 2-2 draw against local rivals Longlevens, with Rich Cox's depleted side more than matching their hosts on the day.

The hosts had taken a lead through Brad Martin but Rovers' efforts in a competitive first half were not in vain and Dion Ellis-Clark scored an excellent equaliser, with a shot from the edge of the box, almost on the interval.

Dave Merrick gave Longlevens the lead after 55 minutes but Aaron Basford produced another good finish, just seven minutes later, to level the scores at 2-2.

Rovers then survived a series of injuries, culminating in centre-midfielder Liam Smith being deployed as a centre-back for the last 20 minutes, but they held out to secure a vital point and their first of the season, after the fourth game.


