Our last home game, on 27 December, gave us a disappointing afternoon but it became a day where football results are put into perspective after I learnt that Angela Craddock, wife of club legend Coke Craddock and a tremendous volunteer at the club in her own right, had sadly passed away earlier that day. There is a short memorial article about her in today's programme but we will also invite everyone to join us in a minute's applause before kick-off to celebrate her life and contribution to Tuffley Rovers.

Coke hasn't been in the best health himself, so is unlikely to join us this afternoon and our thoughts are with him and his family at this time.

In terms of the football, that result on 27 December aside we have been in good form and even if we haven't always got the results our performances might have warranted, there has been plenty to be happy about. Last week's game was great in terms of our overall performance but disappointing in terms of the result because we really should have got all three points. Whilst some would have been aggrieved at conceding the late equaliser, I was more upset by what looked like a perfectly good goal being disallowed as Gino Valenti challenged the Thornbury Town keeper. Fine margins change results and I definitely felt hard done by on Saturday evening!

Today is the first in a run of three home games – today against Cinderford Town; next Saturday against Royal Wootton Bassett Town; and the following Tuesday (20 January) against Cribbs FC. Before today's game our average crowd has been 130 and it would be great to keep those sort of numbers coming through the turnstiles for the remainder of the season. Every bit of support helps us and I know the players are always grateful for the backing from a good home crowd.

Back to today's game and I will say that it is great to see Steve 'Sooty' Cleal back in the dugout. During his time at various clubs – Smiths Barometrics, Bishops Cleeve and Malvern Town – he has always been very decent, generous and kind to me personally and we need people like that involved in the game.

I hope we ruin his day today, mind you because I want us to record a win for Angela Craddock!

I hope everyone enjoys the game. Safe travels home.

# FROM THE CHAIRMAN:



Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Glevum Park for this Hellenic League fixture against Cinderford Town. May I first take this opportunity to welcome our visitors' supporters, committee, management team and players. An extended warm welcome to the match officials who will be facilitating the game today.

Last weekend saw many fixtures fall to the Baltic conditions, though we were fortunate enough to only lose two fixtures over the weekend, which were our Reserves' fixture due to be played here at Glevum Park and also our Ladies' team, who were due to play at Kingsway on Sunday. Due to postponements, our Reserves have not played a game since 29th November, so hopefully their game today, away at Old Richians in the League Cup, will go ahead.

Unfortunately, I couldn't make it to the Thornbury game last Saturday but like many of you I saw it ended in a 3-3 draw. The feedback I received was that we should have been out of sight by half-time, which has happened a few times this season and it has also been the case that a failure to take advantage and our chances, means we have then been punished for that in the second half. Thornbury Town have always been a tricky customer for us, so on past form a draw probably would have been taken prior to kick off.

All of our other teams are in action today. As I mentioned, our Reserves are taking on Old Richians, whilst our 3rds make the trip to Randwick in a Division 2 clash. I am hoping that our third team manager, Chambo, can pick up three points and start moving towards mid-table with games in hand.

Our 4ths are also in cup action, as they host Uley at Kingsway. Darren and Kevin's side will be looking for a good crack at the cup competition, to complement their table-topping league campaign.

Tomorrow sees two further games with our Ladies in cup action against AEK Boco Development and our Veterans' team playing Hardwicke in a first encounter between the two Veterans' squads at Hartpury. Both games are 2pm kick-offs.

# TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17<sup>th</sup>. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10<sup>th</sup> placed finishes, before a 15<sup>th</sup> place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17<sup>th</sup> place).

Mustoe achieved an 18<sup>th</sup> place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14<sup>th</sup> place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad. The 2024/25 season ended with further improvement, as Mustoe's squad finished in 11<sup>th</sup> place.

# FROM THE MANAGER:



Happy New Year!

Good afternoon and welcome to all players, management, officials, and supporters from Cinderford Town FC.

Cinderford come into today's game off the back of a positive result, possibly benefiting from a new-manager bounce in their last outing. We know this will be a difficult encounter because of that and because Cinderford Town are a decent outfit, but we are also on a good run ourselves, with just one defeat in our last nine matches. We've looked a real threat going forward in recent weeks, scoring goals and generally being defensively solid.

Last week's result may not reflect that, but it was a game in which we could – and probably should – have been out of sight. A few minor errors and some strange refereeing decisions ultimately cost us, but there are still plenty of positives to take from the performance at Thornbury Town.

With some interesting fixtures coming up, we're looking to pick up valuable points. At this stage of recent seasons we've often found ourselves below mid-table, hoping for a late push. While we've picked up good results, they haven't always translated into a rise up the league. This year, however, we find ourselves firmly in mid-table and aiming for a strong finish to the season, which should continue the progression of the club over the four years since I joined.

We have a good group of players, and although their efforts haven't always been rewarded with points, maintaining belief in what we're trying to do is showing improvements both individually and collectively. In previous seasons we've relied on standout goalscorers while sitting lower in the league, so to be in a better position and in good form again is a huge positive.

With the quality we have in our forward areas, including players who would usually be among the top scorers, we're confident their recent hard work for the team will soon be rewarded.

# Angela Craddock

29 July 1947 - 27 December 2025

Late on 27 December 2025 we received some incredibly sad news as we learnt that Angela (Ang) Craddock had passed away.

Football clubs at this level are built on the effort of good people, who willingly give up their time to volunteer and make things tick.

Angela has been an incredibly important character in the development of the club, both as a volunteer and also as the long suffering wife of her husband's devotion to our team in claret and blue. She and Roy (or Coke as we all know him) have given the most incredible service to our club.

Angela was the first to make hot dogs to sell on match days from the canteen window. Coke did the shopping ahead of match-day and Ang did the cooking. Any money raised went into the club funds.

Angela also washed the kit on a weekly basis. Her daughter, Karen, vividly remembers her using a "twin tub machine" more than 40 plus years ago and when we caught up with her she recounted that was "hard work in those days".

Angela's generosity and spirit meant she spent time purchasing small gifts for the Tuffley Rovers' Christmas parties and wrapped them before they were given to the children on party day.

Aside from her support for the football club, Angela was also a member of the Tuffley Rovers darts team for many years.

For her family there will be a huge gap in their lives without her and our thoughts are with them at this time.

Like many who have gone before, Angela deserves our recognition and we would ask you to join us in a minute's applause before kick-off today.

Angela's funeral will take place at the Crematorium in Gloucester at 2pm on Friday, 16 January 2026. There will be a wake in the 1929 Suite at Tuffley Rovers social club following the service.

# CINDERFORD TOWN CLUB

## HISTORY



Cinderford Town was formed in 1922 and played in the Glos Northern Senior League until 1939. In that year they joined the newly formed Bristol Charity League, but this folded two weeks later at the outbreak of World War Two. They then joined the Western League Division 2, and in 1957 won the title. During the two seasons they spent in the top flight, they set a ground attendance record, when a home game with Minehead saw 4,850 people in attendance. Sadly, participation at this level put severe financial pressure on the Club, who were then forced to withdraw and return to the Glos Northern Senior League.

Three years later, the Club made the unusual decision to join the Warwickshire Combination, and won a League and Cup double in 1964, which saw them step up to the West Midlands (Regional) League. A very strong league at the time, with member clubs such as Kidderminster Harriers, Boston United, Tamworth and Hednesford. 1968-69 season was their last at this level, but they bowed out as Joint League Cup winners with Kidderminster. Both Clubs shared the Trophy for 6 months.

Cinderford returned to play in the newly formed Gloucestershire County League for the 1969-70 season and stayed for the next 5 years, finishing as runners-up on 3 occasions. They again sought a higher standard of football, and were accepted into the Midland Combination. Town played in this League for the next 10 seasons, achieving a best finish of 4<sup>th</sup> and also winning the League Cup, before being forced to return to the Glos County League following financial problems relating to the Social Club. A new Committee stabilised the Club, so much so that floodlights were purchased outright, and in the 1990-91 season, the Club gained admission to the Hellenic League, initially in Division 1, where they won the title at the first attempt. Four years later, the Club claimed an historic first by winning the Premier Division title, the League Cup and the Hellenic Floodlight Cup, and stepped up to the Southern League, with 28 years unbroken membership. The 1995-96 season saw Cinderford embark on an incredible F A Cup run, beating 2 Conference Clubs to reach the Second Round Proper, holding Gravesend & Northfleet to a 1-1 home draw before losing 3-0 in the replay in Kent. The winners were drawn with Aston Villa in the Third Round.

In the 2015-16 season, Cinderford were Champions of Southern League Div 1, South & West, but initially rejected promotion when undisclosed debts were discovered. However they accepted promotion following a series of appeals which affected the constitution of the League going into the new season. The Club were duly relegated in their first season in the Premier Division, returning to play in the Southern League First Division again.

Under the then leadership of Manager Paul Michael, the Club went from strength to strength, with a League Cup Final appearance, losing to a single goal at Premier Division side Stratford Town, and reaching a League play-off final, losing away at Yate Town, who persuaded Paul to join them for their promotion to the Premier Division.

Former Bishops Cleeve Manager Steve Cleal was appointed to replace Paul Michael but after an unsuccessful spell, he was succeeded as Manager by Alex Sykes, the former Gloucester City and Forest Green player, who was also unable to improve matters on the pitch.

After an incredible 28 consecutive seasons as members of the Southern League, the Club were relegated at the end of the 2022-2023 season, to rejoin the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Alex Sykes left the Club by mutual consent, and was replaced by former Merthyr Town player and former Manager at Welsh Club Aberbargoed, Matt Driscoll, who had the unenviable task of rebuilding the entire squad, with only one senior player remaining from the Southern League side.

Within a few months of the new season, the new squad was taking shape, and the early season of mixed results began to change, and the Club started its climb up the table. The League title was never going to be achievable with Worcester City the dominant Club all season, but a successful run in saw us clinch 5<sup>th</sup> place, and into the playoffs.

An away trip to 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Corsham Town saw us claim a great 1-0 win, and a final away game in the playoff final to Royal Wootton Bassett Town, and an emphatic 4-0 win secured our place back in the Southern League after a one season break.

Unfortunately, our return to the Southern League was short-lived with relegation back to the Hellenic Premier for 2025-26.

# ON (OR AROUND) THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include this programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had two previous games on 10 January which we've reviewed to reflect on our fortunes over the years, alongside a handful of games around the date....

## 8 January 2011

Rockleaze Rangers recorded just a second league win of the season, as they scored an 86<sup>th</sup> minute winner, through Savas Frangoullis, who finished from Kye Simpson's pass. Rovers almost opened the scoring, as early as the third minute, but Peter Thomas was twice denied by the Rockleaze keeper.

Dean Powles then gave the visitors the lead for the first time, but Dean Munday's own goal restored parity with half an hour to play. Amazingly, that was the end of the scoring and the game finished 3-3.
