# FROM THE EDITOR:



Welcome to all our visitors to Glevum Park this afternoon, notably the players, management team, committee and supporters of Slimbridge. Welcome, also, to this afternoon's match officials.

By this time next week we will have completed our home schedule for the 2025/26 UHlsport Hellenic League season and will be looking forward to a final away trip, with Cinderford Town the destination on 18 April 2026. The season seems to have raced by.

It has been a largely positive season but Saturday's visit to Cribbs encapsulated the sense of "what might have been". We were dominant in the first half, held a one goal lead and came out for the second period with a strong wind at our backs. We simply didn't perform in that second half and owe our point to a fantastic performance from young Anton Robinson in goal.

I spoke with Muzzy after the game at Hallen, where we had faced similar conditions, and the frustration he echoed then was the same on Saturday. We simply didn't play the conditions when they were in our favour.

Whatever the weather today, we will need to be at our best to get anything against a team who look set to win the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division title this season. Even after defeat at Cirencester Town on Saturday there must be a sense that the title is Slimbridge's to lose. With three games to play they have an 8 point advantage at the top, with 75 points, and no other team can get more than 79 points as it presently stands.

When I talk about how our season has progressed it is worth noting that our performances against the sides at the bottom of the table – such as the visit to Cribbs on Saturday – are in stark contrast to our results against the teams at the top, so maybe that could bode well for today.

It matters not to me who wins the league but there are good people at most of the clubs who have the chance to pursue title ambitions. Tom Deakin and Sam Prior are good guys, who are not alone in being people I like at Slimbridge. If they win the league it will be deserved and a great achievement. Our job is to prevent that happening today because we must protect our own interests above all else.

One footnote away from today's game is the return of Warren Mann to playing. Wazza last played a first team game on 18 January 2025 and was struggling with injury at that time. He made a return to playing for our Reserves' squad last Wednesday, helping them to a great win over title-challengers Minchinhampton, before scoring his first goal on Saturday at Dursley Town Reserves. Whether he manages to return to this level or not, it has been great to see him back in Rovers colours....and winding up referees and opposition players alike! Long may it continue!!!

We'd love to see you at our final home game against Hallen this coming Saturday, just as a celebration of the season for those who don't travel away. Thank you for your continued support.

I hope everyone enjoys the game. Safe travels home.

# TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17<sup>th</sup>. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10<sup>th</sup> placed finishes, before a 15<sup>th</sup> place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17<sup>th</sup> place).

Mustoe achieved an 18<sup>th</sup> place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14<sup>th</sup> place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad. The 2024/25 season ended with further improvement, as Mustoe's squad finished in 11<sup>th</sup> place.

# FROM THE MANAGER:



Good afternoon and welcome to all the players, officials and supporters from Slimbridge.

Firstly, I'd like to congratulate our Reserves and Fourths teams, who both won their semi-finals last weekend and have secured their place in finals at the end of the season. This is a fantastic achievement and really positive for the club. At the start of any season, the aim is to go as far as possible in competitions and hopefully bring home silverware - that's what football is all about.

For the first team, we share those same ambitions. Unfortunately, our cup runs haven't materialised this season, and winning the league has never been on the agenda. However, we are only a few results away from being in the mix of the last play-off position but that has, once again, always been just out of our reach.

October proved to be a difficult month for us, when we narrowly missed out on valuable points and with four games remaining, at the time of writing, had we had another six points then it could have made for a very interesting end to the season.

That said, picking up six points from our final four games would represent a solid return based on our overall tally and could see us finish in a strong league position, which was one of our main goals at the start of the campaign – with aspiration to continue year-on-year progression.

This stage of the season is always challenging, particularly in terms of player mindset when they know that there is nothing specific to play for, but I would much rather be in our position than looking towards the bottom of the table. Planning ahead for next season also brings challenges, as players understandably keep their options open, whether they're part of the current squad or potential new additions.

With a relatively small squad, it has been difficult at times to keep everyone motivated, particularly those not getting as many minutes as they would like. Some feel the grass may be greener elsewhere, although that hasn't always proven to be the case. Even being named as a substitute can sometimes be viewed negatively, which highlights the importance of bringing in not just quality players, but the right characters and attitudes.

That's something we are continuing to work on, both internally and through recruitment—recently giving opportunities to players like Corey Warrington and Callum Maclean to step up and play at a higher level. They are two examples of people have taken the opportunity given to them with both hands.

Before looking too far ahead, we still have important games to play and points to secure. Let's enjoy the remainder of the season, playing with freedom, but also with the right intensity and application to achieve our goals.

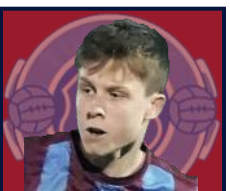

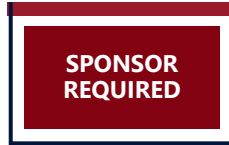

# Heart of the Game

Free blood pressure checks and healthy lifestyle support for Gloucestershire Football teams



## Heart of the Game is a community-first health initiative using the power of football to help local people take control of their heart health.

Freedom Leisure, in partnership with Blackbridge Charitable Community Benefit Society (CCBS), Gloucestershire FA and Gloucester City AFC, successfully launched Heart of the Game at Gloucester City's home win against Weymouth FC on Saturday 7 February, which was the official start for the community-focused heart health initiative that intends to work with football clubs to improve heart health.

The campaign, which uses the power of football to bring preventative healthcare into everyday community settings, made its debut during Gloucester City's home fixture, where supporters were invited to take part in free blood pressure checks in a relaxed, non-clinical environment.

Tuffley Rovers are one of four local clubs already signed up to the programme, alongside City, Abbeymead Rovers and Rising Stars, with the project ambition to build a network in football across the county.

The short-term objective is to deliver more than 1,000 community blood pressure checks at football matches, leisure centres, community venues and local roadshows. The initiative aligns with the One Gloucestershire Integrated Care System Hypertension Strategy and the NHS *Know Your Numbers* campaign, focusing on early identification, prevention and long-term behaviour change. By embedding health checks into everyday community life, Heart of the Game removes barriers, reduces stigma, and makes prevention simple and social.

## **Luke Merchant**

### **Goalkeeper**

Club captain who returned to the club in the 2022/23 season, after a Hellenic League Premier Division title winning season at Bishops Cleeve. A great shot stopper, commanding presence and accomplished keeper. Holds the club record for Hellenic League appearances as a keeper.

## **Alex Hammond**

### **Goalkeeper**

Join the club in late-October following a serious injury to Luke Merchant and has been a fantastic replacement. Had previously been with Mangotsfield United and is studying at Hartpury. Is a good all-round keeper, with safe hands, good shot stopping and can play with his feet.

## **Robin Hoffland**

### **Goalkeeper**

A long-serving player, despite his age, who acts as a capable back-up to Luke Merchant in goal, whenever needed. Has played for the club's 1sts, 2nds, 3rds, 4ths and 5ths, as well as the U18s and always gives his all. Reliable, in a word.

## **Callum McLean**

### **Defence**

New signing, who has impressed at right-back in pre-season and could prove to be a great addition to the squad. Tough tackling and comfortable on the ball. Came through the U18s at local rivals Longlevens.

## **Elijah Simpson**

### **Defence**

# SLIMBRIDGE CLUB HISTORY



The Gloucestershire village of Slimbridge is world renowned for its Bird Sanctuary, but much hard work has gone into making Slimbridge better known in football circles. The Club's history can be traced back to the 1899/1900 season, when the team were playing in local football at various venues in and around the village.

It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road (now renamed as Thornhill Park) became the club's home, and it subsequently became the legal property of the club after former player, and ex-Chairman of the club, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed the land to the Club in his Will, with the Club becoming legal owners in 1960. It was to prove an incredibly valuable treasure in future years.

By 1988, the club had fallen on hard times, but fortunately, a handful of committee members led by Gordon King and Gordon Tudor kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed. Paul Chappell was to remain a vital part of the club until his retirement from his duties in 2020. As playing standards improved, 2000 saw the completion of the building of a long-awaited Social Club in an area of the ground that in its old life had housed a cowshed. John Mack, a successful local entrepreneur, joined the club as Chairman, and he remains a committed supporter of the club to this day as Club President.

In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager, and the club began a period of upward momentum. The team achieved a Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, and were accepted into Hellenic Division One West and that was won by an 11 Point margin in 2002/03. A creditable fourth place finish was achieved in the Hellenic Premier League in 2003/04. In a marvellous season the club also claimed the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy. Season 2004/05 again saw a fourth-Place finish in the Hellenic Premier. The club also made their first appearance in the FA Vase, which resulted in a run to the third round proper before a 2-1 extra time defeat at Western League side Backwell United. In February 2005, Gray stood down after nearly four seasons at the helm of the club.

The club started season 2005/06 under newly appointed Manager Doug Foxwell. A first entry into the FA Cup saw a visit from Wessex League side Wimborne Town. A 1-0 defeat did not dampen the sense of occasion on the first day of the season. A second successful run in the FA Vase came to an end in the Third Round Proper, with a 3-1 defeat at South Midland Premier, Welwyn Garden City.

After a record-breaking 64 game season, the team achieved a Fifth-Place finish in the Hellenic Premier, and the club also won the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy, both for the second time in three seasons.

Season 2006/07 proved to be the most successful in the Club's history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the bonus of record-breaking FA Cup and Vase runs for the senior side. In the FA Cup, a Five Match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. Along the way there were memorable wins against two other Southern Premier sides, 2-1 at Yate Town and 3-1 at home to Chippenham Town. It was six matches in the FA Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

In the Hellenic Premier Division, bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, led to half a seasons fixture being played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club Bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh. There was a rousing performance in the GFA Trophy Final against Almondsbury Town. A 3-1 victory not only retained the Trophy, but recorded a third success in four seasons in that competition.

As a result of winning the league after an inspiring final day victory, and the upgrade to the ground facilities at Wisloe Road, the club were promoted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, however, there was a twist to come in the tale.

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the promotion, and effectively, the first team took over the position in the pyramid occupied by the reserve team, which was disbanded.

The First Team reverted to the Gloucester Northern Senior League. This meant a severe upheaval in the club both on and off the field with the manager Doug Foxwell and several senior players moving on the pastures new. However, a loyal band of players stayed on including James Cole, who over as player manager with assistance from long term club captain Leon Sterling to begin the next stage of the club's journey. Four promotions followed as the club regained their previous status. James Cole handed over to Leon Sterling, who moved into the Manager's role, with Leon joined as Assistant Manager by long time Slimbridge stalwart Freddy Ward. The two guided the side to three top six finishes in their first three seasons back in the Hellenic Premier.

After the completion of the 2012-13 season, the Swans applied for a transfer to the Toolstation Western Premier League to reduce prohibitive travelling costs, a move which was approved by the FA in the Summer of 2013. After two seasons in the Toolstation Western Premier League, a third-place finish at the end of the 2014/15 season gave the Swans a second opportunity to return to the Southern Football League. This time the club accepted the offer and took their place in the South and West Division, finishing a credible 18th in their first season, the highest level the club had ever achieved at that time in their history. Prior to the commencement of that campaign, John Mack had stepped back from Chairman duties and his position was taken up by Barry Gay.

At the start of the 2016-17 season, and prior to our pre-season friendly fixture with neighbours Forest Green Rovers, the football ground in Wisloe Road was formally renamed to Thornhill Park in recognition of the marvellous gift we received from Evil Thornhill 46 years earlier. Evi's son, Tony and his late wife Margaret were on hand to cut the ceremonial ribbon, and Tony made a short heartfelt speech about how much the renaming meant to him and the entire Thornhill family, and how honoured they were that the football club had recognised their father in this way.

A difficult two seasons of struggle at a higher level saw the eventual departure of Leon Sterling as Manager, with Freddy Ward stepping up to the plate, assisted by local footballing legend Lee Driver-Dickerson. With Freddy then stepping aside to concentrate of his last few years of playing having steadied the Swans' ship, 'Drive' took over the reins as Manager of the first team.

The Club's previous ground attendance record was smashed on 4th February 2017, when 898 fans saw the side suffer a 3-0 defeat to Hereford FC, who were working their way back up the league pyramid following their reformation after the collapse of Hereford United

The last 2 years have seen an incredible expansion of the football club– the establishment of a thriving Youth setup at Under 18 level, and the resurrection of the Reserve side has seen Slimbridge AFC make great strides as a club.

Prior to the Covid suspension of football in March 2020, the Under 18s and the Reserves were top of their respective leagues, while the first team were sitting in 12th place in the Southern League Division One South, the highest placing in the history of the football club. Although the FA has made the season's results null and void, they have been officially added to club statistics and all appearances and goals will stand in our records as a permanent tribute to all who represented the club in a fantastic season in the strangest of all campaigns.

The 2021-22 Season saw the departure of Driver-Dickerson and the 2022-23 season was a very difficult one for the side resulting in the departure of Speers in February 2023 with the side having achieved only four victories at that point. Adam Coyle and Tom Deakin moved into the Management role, but the season resulted in relegation and a return to the Hellenic League for the 2023-24 Season.

Now in their third season in the Hellenic League, Tom Deakin has assumed the role of Team Manager following Adam Coyle's decision to step back from the position during the 2024-25 Season, with Mike Palmer confirmed as his new co-manager and Ben Powell as their assistant and Sam Prior as coach.



# (OR AROUND) THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include this programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had three previous games on 6 April, so we've included those in this review alongside other games around the date, to reflect on our fortunes over the years....

## **5 April 2008**

Tuffley Rovers recovered from being two goals down to return from DRG Stapleton with a hard fought point from this Gloucestershire County League fixture.

The hosts went 2-0 with a double from Matt Price, after he opened the scoring in the 17<sup>th</sup> minute, converting a good cross from Sam Glanville, then headed home a second on 33 minutes.

Rovers had the wind assisting them in the second half and pulled a goal back through Michael Oakes on 51 minutes, before a period of concerted pressure ultimately led to an equaliser, albeit a stunning 35 yard drive from Jon Corbett on 75 minutes.

Although the home side had several good chances to have won the game but Rovers held out to earn a valuable point.

## **6 April 2013**

In a competitive Gloucestershire County League fixture at Tuffley Rovers, the hosts failed to break down a stubborn Taverners defence in the first 45 minutes and it was 0-0 at half-time.

Rovers started the second half in a similar vein and were eventually rewarded in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute after Taverners gave away a penalty for handball and Marcus Foxwell drove the spot kick home.

Doug Foxwell's side then piled on the pressure, forcing numerous corners and generally controlling the game and this paid off in the 79<sup>th</sup> minute as Nathen King's ball to Warren Mann sent the striker goalwards and he unleashed a shot that went across the keeper and into the far side of the net.

## **5 April 2014**

Tuffley Rovers continued their good run of form as they defeated Oxfordshire side Carterton 4-1 at Glevum Park, courtesy of a brace from Jordan Fletcher and further goals from Shayne Bradley and Elliot King.

The win meant Rovers had taken 13 points from a possible 15, stretching their unbeaten run in the UHlsport Hellenic League, Division One (West) to five games.

## 6 April 2015

Longlevens all but sealed the UHlsport Hellenic League, Division One (West) title, as they snatched a late, late win against Tuffley Rovers, in front of a large crowd on Bank Holiday Monday. Both sides came into the game on a terrific run of form, with Rovers unbeaten in the league since October and Levens having avoided a reverse since the two sides had met on 27 December, and the weather was perfect, so it was no surprise that the tie, dubbed 'El Glosico' in advance, attracted 379 spectators to Glevum Park for what was likely to be a title defining fixture.

Craig Martin gave the visitors the lead on 48 minutes, heading past Aaron Taylor from close range on 48 minutes, but Mark Ford equalised within four minutes, as he met Brett James' corner with determination, beating fellow centre-forward Jordan Fletcher to the ball and forcing it over the line under pressure from Levens' keeper Ollie Hall, who tried desperately to prevent the goal.

That was the end of the scoring until the closing moments of the game. As the game moved into injury time, Rovers gave the ball away deep in their own half and another swift move by Longlevens saw the ball find its way to substitute Ryan Hughes, who produced a beautifully controlled shot into the bottom corner of Taylor's goal to secure the three points.

## 7 April 2018

Tuffley Rovers withstood a period of sustained pressure in the second half of the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture on Saturday, to record a vital win in their quest to secure their highest league position since the 2001/02 season, as they returned from Windsor with a 3-1 victory.

Kieran Alder opened the scoring, 14 minutes into the contest, as he pulled down the ball ten yards out, before showing composure to work enough space to turn and fire the ball home, low past Hugo Sobte and into the corner of the net.

On 37 minutes keeper Dave Evans showed great intelligence, quickly sending a free-kick upfield to Shayne Bradley, who turned the ball on to Warren Mann in a wide position and his cross was volleyed home by Alder, to make it 2-0, a lead comfortably held until the interval.

Rovers survived a period of pressure and looked to be comfortable until the 74<sup>th</sup> minute, as Andy Ingram rose high to meet a set-piece and head the ball beyond Evans from six yards out. In a dramatic final minute, Evans then produced a sensational save from Kieran Knight, which then led to Alder driving Rovers up the field before his shot was saved but fell into Bradley's path, who did not waste the chance to make it 3-1.
