Reaching the semi-final and being one game from playing at Wembley is a tremendous achievement and a credit to all involved. I would also like to welcome today's match officials, who will be taking charge of this afternoon's fixture.

Today we are delighted to welcome many of our club partners and sponsors. It is always a pleasure to give something back to the local businesses and individuals whose financial support helps make grassroots football possible. We are grateful to those who have supported the club for many years, as well as those joining us for the first time. Your presence shows that there are still businesses willing to support local community sports clubs. I hope you all enjoy the day and thank you for your continued support.

I would also like to place on record a huge thank you to the wider committee, volunteers, and staff who work tirelessly before, during, and after matches to ensure our visitors have a positive experience. While the season may be drawing to a close, the work never stops, and preparations for next season will soon be well underway.

Overall, it has been a good season for the club. While the first team is likely to finish around mid-table, clear progress has been made, and the aim is to push closer to the play-off positions next season. As this season has shown, anything is possible—the current league champions finished 16th in the 2024–25 campaign.

Elsewhere, our Reserves remain on track for promotion to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League, which was the target set for the new management team. They also have a league cup final in early May against Old Richians, who are also their main rivals for league honours.

Our Fourths have already been crowned Division 4 champions of the Stroud League and will contest a league cup final against Cam Everside Wanderers in a couple of weeks' time, as they look to complete a league and cup double. We hope to see strong support for both finals and will share further details through our social media channels in the coming weeks.

Thank you to everyone for your support throughout the season. I look forward to welcoming you back to Glevum Park for our first pre-season fixture at the start of July—it promises to be a cracker, so watch this space!

# TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17<sup>th</sup>. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10<sup>th</sup> placed finishes, before a 15<sup>th</sup> place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17<sup>th</sup> place).

Mustoe achieved an 18<sup>th</sup> place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14<sup>th</sup> place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad. The 2024/25 season ended with further improvement, as Mustoe's squad finished in 11<sup>th</sup> place.

Congratulations to Slimbridge FC on winning the league. We now need to take stock of where we are and what we could have achieved, but overall I think it has been a good season.

I need to thank the players for their commitment and my backroom team of Liam, Butts, Tim, Moodz, Kayliegh and Beth for all their help and support. With a few more cup games this season I might have hit the 200 games in charge mark, which I believe I will fall just short this year. Hopefully we can all come back next year and push the club on again.

This is the penultimate game of the season and our last at home, so I'm hoping to go out with a win.

# Heart of the Game

Free blood pressure checks and healthy lifestyle support for Gloucestershire Football teams



## Heart of the Game is a community-first health initiative using the power of football to help local people take control of their heart health.

Freedom Leisure, in partnership with Blackbridge Charitable Community Benefit Society (CCBS), Gloucestershire FA and Gloucester City AFC, successfully launched Heart of the Game at Gloucester City's home win against Weymouth FC on Saturday 7 February, which was the official start for the community-focused heart health initiative that intends to work with football clubs to improve heart health.

The campaign, which uses the power of football to bring preventative healthcare into everyday community settings, made its debut during Gloucester City's home fixture, where supporters were invited to take part in free blood pressure checks in a relaxed, non-clinical environment.

Tuffley Rovers are one of four local clubs already signed up to the programme, alongside City, Abbeymead Rovers and Rising Stars, with the project ambition to build a network in football across the county.

The short-term objective is to deliver more than 1,000 community blood pressure checks at football matches, leisure centres, community venues and local roadshows. The initiative aligns with the One Gloucestershire Integrated Care System Hypertension Strategy and the NHS *Know Your Numbers* campaign, focusing on early identification, prevention and long-term behaviour change. By embedding health checks into everyday community life, Heart of the Game removes barriers, reduces stigma, and makes prevention simple and social.

# HALLEN CLUB HISTORY

The club was formed by members of a new community living at Lawrence Weston on the outskirts of Bristol, which had been developed shortly after World War Two.

The club was named Lawrence Weston Athletic and played in the Bristol & District League, and it has moved forward steadily since moving to the village of Hallen in 1979, to conform with League Ground grading. Much of the credit for the progress of this club can be accredited to the late Frank Fairman and his family. His son Francis, and grandson Lee continue the link with the club. In fact Lee played a major part in our fight for survival during the summer of 2015, when the club was in danger of losing its home. So it was no surprise when long serving Chairman Barrie Phillips nominated Lee to take over the chair from himself, at the next AGM.

The club became known as Lawrence Weston Hallen when it moved to Moorhouse Lane, joining the Gloucestershire County League in 1982, and under that title were runners up 1987-88, and Champions 1988- 89, after which the club dropped Lawrence Weston from its title to become known as simply Hallen.

The club completed the double in 1992-93, when winning the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy and the League title. Promotion was achieved, joining the Hellenic League Division One, and after further improvements to the facilities (particularly the erection of floodlights and a 200-seater stand), a runner-up position in 1996-97 led to another step up, to the Hellenic League Premier Division.

The club had always considered the Western League as its goal, as this League was more familiar with Bristolians than the Hellenic League. Their wish to transfer over was granted at the second time of asking but it was insisted that the club join the First Division for season 2000-01. The club finished fourth in its first season in the Western League and reached the last sixteen of the F.A.Vase losing to Brigg Town 6-5 in extra time. Further progress was made when new manager Gary Damone led the team to the Division One title in Season 2003-4, and fourth place in the Premier Division at the first attempt.

The club also reached the final of the GFA Trophy and were denied a place in the first round of the F.A. Cup when losing to Nationwide Conference side Canvey Island in the fourth and final qualifying round. This success saw Southern League side Taunton Town tempt Gary Damone to try his hand at a higher level, which in turn saw Hallen have a dip in form, as players were also tempted away. It is however well known that a high percentage of players are happy to return to Hallen, and for season 2009-10 the club welcomed back Gary Damone as manager and many former players too.

The club finished in a disappointing twelfth position in 2009-10, but a crop of long term injuries did not help. The club however were to lift the Western League (Les Phillips) Cup for the first time. The club had experienced a bad start to the 2010-11 season, which saw the departure of manager Gary Damone who chose to take charge of his own town club Wellington. Club stalwart Paul Owen was given the task of steering the team to safety. With just one win prior to taking over in November, he and his assistant John Tierney changed fortunes around and we were safe from relegation with six games left. Paul Owen's first full season as manager saw the club challenging for the title, but a dip in form saw the club slip to fourth. Off the field, the club had ensured promotion would not be denied, had the club won the title by obtaining the ground grading for Southern League football.

Season 2012-13 saw no repeat of a challenge for promotion, but the season was kept alive by reaching the final of the Les Phillips League Cup for a second time. In the final Willand Rovers won 1-0 before a crowd of 400 at Cribbs Friends Life FC. As Paul Owen had already decided to step down at the end of the campaign, it was unfortunate that he could not see his side lift the cup. By mid May the club announced that Hengrove Athletic manager Jamie Hillman was to take over as manager, He had been at the helm for eight years at Hengrove, and had just guided them to the Premier Division as runners up in April. The 2013-14 season under Jamie and his assistant Grantley Dicks, was a mixture of highs and lows. The highs being success in lifting the GFA Trophy for a third time and reaching the fifth round of the FA Vase losing away to West Auckland Town. In contrast we finished the League campaign without a win in fifteen games.

Manager Jamie Hillman announced that he would be leaving, and previous manager Paul Owen agreed to return for the 2014-15 season. By November the League form was yet again cause for concern and Paul decided it would be best to bring in a new face, rather than wait to the end of the season. Steve Winter a former Walsall and Torquay player was appointed with a view, of him settling in, prior to the coming season. He was to resign in December 2015, and long serving player Tom Collett took on the role as player manager assisted by Rayan Wilson for the 2016-17 season. Following another poor run of results, Tom Collett made way for former player Ben Willshire to return as the new manager. Ben guided the club away from relegation, but when fortunes did not change in the next campaign, it was decided his assistant Rob Sage should take over the helm prior to Christmas 2017, with Ben remaining as a player. The resignation of Rob Sage forced the club to seek another manager in February.

Former manager Gary Damone returned as interim manager, whilst the club decided on a replacement from a record number of applicants. The successful candidate being former player Ray Johnstone, who had guided Odd Down to the title in 2016. Ray recruited another former Hallen player Tony Davis as his assistant for the 2018-19 season, unfortunately Tony had to step down during the course of the season.

It was a season which saw a more settled side, finishing in twelfth place the best for several years. Further progress was made during the 2019-20 season, with Ray being assisted by Dean Horseman, before it was brought to an abrupt end due to the coronavirus pandemic. Ray's departure early in the season 2020-21, saw Dean takeover as Manager in what turned out to be another pandemic disrupted season.

A poor run of results at the start of 2021-22 resulted in Dean and his new Assistant Tony Beecham departing the club. Stuart Jones and his trusty Director of Football Andy Hawkins took over, but unfortunately they could not magic a way out of the situation the team had been left in and we were relegated to step 6, which saw us back in The Western League, due to The FA's lateral movement.

Early on in season 2023-24 we saw Stuart step down from the managerial role, and replaced by Karl Baggaley, who added some new faces to the squad and ended the season just outside the play off positions. In his first full season (2024/25) Karl built a team to win the Division One title by a 13 point margin to get Hallen back to Step 5 football.



# (OR AROUND) THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include this programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had three previous games on 11 April, so we've included those in this review alongside other games around the date, to reflect on our fortunes over the years....

## 11 April 2009

Tuffley Rovers suffered a fourth consecutive defeat away at Highridge United, losing 4-0 against one of the lowest ranked teams in the league in the Gloucestershire County League. Mickey Adams and Nicky Pratten each bagged a brace to send the Bristolians to a comprehensive victory in their battle to beat the drop.

## 11 April 2015

Tuffley Rovers' Hellenic League Division One (West) promotion campaign took a further twist, following their defeat against champions elect, Longlevens, on Bank Holiday Monday, as they drew 2-2 away at mid-table Clanfield FC, a result that saw them overtaken by Lydney Town in the table, with two games remaining.



Jordan Dowdeswell gave Rovers the lead on 27 minutes, with a good finish from the edge of the box, before the hosts equalised on 34 minutes, through Adam Smith. The hosts then took the lead shortly before the interval through Matt Cheetham.

Just after the hour mark Brett James made it 2-2, with his seventeenth goal of the season, and it looked like Rovers might breath a little hope into their title challenge, but they were unable to convert a host of chances that change their way, meaning the title went to Longlevens and Rovers needed to make up a point on promotion challengers Lydney in their final two games.
