Before I say anything at all, I want to extend a warm welcome to our visitors from Fleet Spurs, their committee and supporters, the match officials and every single person at Glevum Park today.

That I'm preparing a third programme of the 2021/22 season but for the first time I can actually say that it is for a HOME game is something else! I cannot express clearly enough the relief that comes with this moment – our first home competitive fixture, with spectators permitted, since September 2020!

If you count our away but home games (those ties played at Windsor and then Brimscombe) and that game against Ardley United on 29 September 2020, we are unbeaten in our last four home games, over a period spanning almost thirteen months, since an FA Cup defeat against Harefield United.

That (slightly misleading) statistic aside, our home form has traditionally been fairly solid and our results in the FA Vase have generally been pretty good at home. Not that any of that means a great deal today!

It has been a long journey to get here and the pitch still has a little way to go before it will be both functional *and* aesthetically pleasing, but we had it inspected by both our match official (on Tuesday) and the consultant who has led the project on Thursday. Both were satisfied with the state of the pitch and so we are ready to go.

The real benefit of the investment made in the drainage system will be our ability to get games on during the harsher winter months. The advice we've had is that the pitch will stand up to most conditions and that will be a remarkably different situation to the one we've faced in the past. That will be worth all the trouble, in the end.

Here's hoping we can mark this first opportunity with a win.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the fixture today. I wish you a safe journey home and we'd love to see you back here on Tuesday – when our U18s host Lydney Town – and/or next Saturday, when Coxy's squad host Bradford Town. It means a great deal to have so many loyal supporters behind the club and I hope we can reward you for waiting patiently to see us play at home!

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.



After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. The next season, a much younger side finished a slightly disappointing 11th but with a year's experience gained the Rovers challenged again at the top of the table for most of the next season before finishing 3rd.

The 2010/11 season saw some variable performances in the league, with a final finishing position of 6th, followed by a third place finish in 2011/12. The 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results.

This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

HISTORY OF FLEET SPURS

Fleet Spurs Football Club started in 1948, shortly after World War II, when a group of young footballers began playing friendly matches in the Fleet and Aldershot area. Opponents included the Royal Medical Corps, Royal Engineers, Royal Artillery, Royal Army Service Corps, Parachute Regiment, and Wellington Press. Tradition holds that Fleet Spurs FC was formed as a reaction, or an alternative, to the long-established "semi-professional" Fleet Town FC. This was to provide an amateur football club for local players with a strong social environment.

The first club badge was a cockerel on a ball, and was the same as for Tottenham Hotspur FC, the one of the rising stars of English football at the time. The Fleet Spurs cockerel has altered over the years, notably a few seasons ago when the London club threatened legal action if the Fleet club didn't change their logo. Financial might triumphed, and a new logo was designed. The original club colours were black and white, similar to Tottenham's navy & white. Subsequently, they changed to red and black stripes, like AC Milan, and eventually became the present red and blue.

In 1951, Fleet Spurs FC joined the Aldershot and District League. They progressed through that and other local leagues, winning many honours along the way, notably becoming champions of the Aldershot Senior League four times. In 1991 they joined Hampshire League Division 3. By this time, they fielded three other Aldershot League teams - the Reserves and the A & B teams.

Up until 1997, the club had played at various grounds in the Fleet area. In the 1997/8 season, they finally established a home at Kennels Lane in Southwood, part of neighbouring Rushmoor. At the same time, the first team was promoted to Hampshire League Division 2 and became champions in 1998/99 and was duly promoted to Division 1. They played two seasons in that division, finishing in sixth position, but were immediately relegated to Division 2. This was clearly done not for football reasons, but because they failed to meet the new standards set by the league for Division 1 grounds.

After a reorganisation in local football, the club moved into Wessex League Division 3 in 2004/5. Following further reorganisations, including the renaming and renumbering of the divisions, it moved to Wessex League Division 1, which was, and still is, at Step 6 in the English Football League Pyramid. This necessitated significant ground improvements, including the installation of state-of-the-art floodlights. These improvements were supported by grants from the Football Foundation's Football Stadia Improvement Fund, the Hampshire Playing Fields Association, the Mike Ritchie Sports Fund and donations from club members. Over the period up to 2016/7, the club remained in Wessex League Division 1, where its fortunes fluctuated. Its most successful season was 2010/11 when after losing eight of their first 11 games, it narrowly missed promotion, finishing third in the table. (cont.)

HISTORY OF FLEET SPURS

In 2017/18, Fleet Spurs moved into the Combined Counties League, remaining at Step 6. This move was instigated by the FA with the intention of helping the club and in particular having the effect of halving the average distance they had to travel to away games. The move had the other benefits that accrue from playing against many local teams – ease of recruiting players, bigger average crowds etc. Four seasons later, the FA switched Spurs back into the Wessex League as part of a much wider reorganisation of Step 5 and Step 6 football. The move will have the major disadvantage to the club of doubling the distance they must travel to away league games. On the positive side, it will be pleasant to renew relationships with old friends and to make new friends, and the club is looking forward to having some enjoyable seasons in the Wessex League.

The change of leagues has led to wholesale changes in the club hierarchy, including a new chairman and managers. John Haddock, whose background in Fleet Spurs is in junior football, has taken over as chairman from Kierin Gurrie, who is retiring after more than 30 years' involvement with the club. The new joint managers, Scott Kemp and Suj Khera, are both UEFA B Licensed Coaches. They have experience in youth and adult football at all levels of the game from grass roots to professional with particular emphasis on player development. This season, they have an entirely new squad to work on. All at the club wish John, Scott and Suj every success.

In 1991, Fleet Spurs FC had formed an association with Fleet Youth FC. The youth section then added the word Spurs to its name, but for almost 30 years the senior and youth sections continued to operate separately. In 2020 – bad timing for any major change, and of course accidental – the club began to operate as a single entity. It now provides football 'from cradle to grave'. The cradle is the Under 6 academy, and the grave contains our two Veterans teams. Neither group is likely to be happy with those descriptions. The club now have 35 teams - four senior teams, including the Vets' teams and the A team, the reigning champions of the Aldershot & District Football League; 28 youth teams, including three Under 18 teams; and three girls' teams - as well as the academy.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF OUR FA VASE

A few weeks ago (in early September 2021), Tuffley Rovers travelled to play Calne Town in an Uhlsport Hellenic Premier Division fixture, returning home with a 2-1 win. Pat Tobin, who was one of the Rovers supporters at that game, was able to recall a previous trip to Calen, some twenty-nine years earlier, when we had returned with a win from the same venue, albeit with a more comprehensive 4-1 victory. That, as you might know, was our first ever victory in the FA Vase competition, as we entered at the Extra Preliminary Round stage.

The 1992/93 campaign, the initial Rovers foray into this non-league competition, saw a second victory, at home to Chippenham Town (1-0), followed by a 1st Round defeat against Western Premier League club Welton Rovers (0-2) that ended a positive first experience.

A home draw the following year wasn't enough to help Rovers progress beyond the earliest stage, as they exited the competition courtesy of a 4-1 defeat by Keynsham Town, but the 1994/95 season saw the club record its equal best ever, as wins over Cirencester Town and Wotton Rovers took us to the 2nd Round game against Westbury United, albeit one that ended with a 4-1 defeat at Glevum Park.

The next four seasons saw us eliminated at the first hurdle as defeats against Shortwood United (1-3), Old Georgians (0-4), Fairford Town (1-2) and Truro City (0-1) all came in the qualifying rounds.

A slightly improved performance in 1999/2000 saw Rovers get past Minehead Town (2-1) only to fall to a defeat against Willand Rovers (0-1) in the 2nd Qualifying Round. A similar pattern followed the next season, as a win over Ilfracombe Town (3-0) was then followed by a defeat at Lymington & New Milton (0-2), as we exited in the 1st Round.

The next two seasons saw the pattern continue – win the first game; lose the next – with a 1st Round exit against Moneyfields in 2001 followed by another defeat at that stage in 2002, against Christchurch.

Defeats in the 1st Qualifying Round followed in 2003 and 2004, against Porthleven and Brislington respectively, were to prove our final games in the competition for ten years, as our withdrawal from the Hellenic League in 2005 meant we had to forfeit our game against Hamworthy United and disappear from the competition for a decade.

When we re-entered the competition in 2014/15 an away day at Eversley & California turned out to be a truly memorable day for the club – for many reasons – but it also turned out to be something of an unusual event, becoming one of the first FA Vase games to be settled on penalties at the first opportunity, as a 3-3 draw in the 2nd Qualifying Round resulted in a 6-5 win from the dreaded shoot-out. Unfortunately, the draw wasn't kind and a trip to the much fancied Plymouth Parkway followed and ended in a 4-1 defeat in the 1st Round.

Another instant exit followed in 2015/16 as Warren Evans' team lost 5-1 at Chertsey

Town, which was, at that time, the biggest ever defeat in the competition. This was despite Anthony Herrin's goal giving Rovers a thirteenth minute lead.

A more positive performance in 2016/17, the first during Mark Pritchett's reign as manager, saw Rovers win 4-1 at home to Ardley United (a game that included a great goal from Liam Wright



(pictured), then 4-0 at home to Sherborne Town, but a home draw against a Bodmin Town wasn't enough of an advantage and our Cornish visitors returned south with a 2-0 win under their belts, although there was some consolation as progress to the 2nd Round equalled our best ever run in the FA Vase.

The next campaign saw another swift exit, courtesy of a disappointing defeat away at Crawley Green in the 1st Qualifying Round and then, in 2018/19, we had another first – this time a Vase replay – as Pritchett's squad drew 0-0 with Longlevens at Saw Mills, before suffering an agonising 1-0 defeat at the second attempt the following Tuesday.

When Rovers faced Shortwood United in 2019 they slumped to our heaviest defeat ever, as a calamitous afternoon ended with a chastening 5-0 defeat at Meadowbank, and worse was to come in 2020 when a toothless performance at Clanfield 85 FC resulted in a 2-0 reverse, again in the 1st Qualifying Round.



So, to this season's competition, which started with a solid victory at Malmesbury Victoria in the 1st Qualifying Round, and today's tie against Fleet Spurs. A win, will mean a place in the 1st Round for only eighth time in our history but we've only won five of ten 2nd Qualifying Round games, to date, so can we make it a better than 50% win ratio at this stage? I guess we'll know at/around 4:45pm today!


